#### QUICKLY...

- ◆ The No. 13/14 South Carolina Gamecocks (1-1, 0-1 SEC) play their second-straight SEC Eastern Division contest when they host the Vanderbilt Commodores (1-1, 0-1 SEC) on Saturday, September 14. The game will be televised nationally on ESPN beginning at 7 p.m. ET with Brad Nessler, Todd Blackledge and Holly Rowe on the call.
- ◆ Both teams need a win to stay in the hunt for the SEC Eastern Division title, as they both have been saddled with an early season conference loss. South Carolina dropped a 41-30 decision in its conference opener last week at Georgia, while Vanderbilt fell to Ole Miss at home in its season opener.
- ◆ The Gamecocks got their season off to a fast start with a 27-10 win over ACC rival North Carolina on Thursday, August 29. It extended Carolina's home winning streak to 12 games, the third-longest streak in school history.
- ◆ Vanderbilt opened with a disappointing 39-35 loss to Ole Miss in its season opener, but bounced back with a convincing 38-3 win over Austin Peay. This will be the Commodores first road test of the season.
- ◆ The Gamecocks began the season ranked No. 6 in the Associated Press poll and No. 7 in the USA Today/Coaches poll. It was the highest preseason ranking in school history. After last week's loss, the Gamecocks slipped to No. 13 in the Associated Press poll and No. 14 in the USA Today/Coaches poll.
- ◆ The Gamecocks will have next week off, the first of two bye weeks this season. They return to action on Saturday, Sept. 28, when they travel to Orlando to face the UCF Knights for their lone non-conference road test of the year.

#### A South Carolina win over Vanderbilt would...

- ◆ Be its fifth-straight over the Commodores. The Gamecocks have won 18 of the previous 22 meetings with Vanderbilt, including 11 of the last 13 contests.
- ◆ Extend the Gamecocks' home winning streak to 13-straight games, tying for the second-longest home winning streak in school history. The Gamecocks own the third-longest home winning streak in Division I football behind Michigan (16) and Georgia (13).
- ◆ Improve head coach Steve Spurrier's record over Vanderbilt to 19-2. His 18 wins against Vanderbilt trails only his 19 career victories over Kentucky in wins over any opponent.

SETTING THE STAGE: The No. 13/14 South Carolina Gamecocks (1-1, 0-1 SEC) return home to face the Vanderbilt Commodores (1-1, 0-1 SEC) on Saturday, September 14. Game time is set for 7 p.m. ET with ESPN handling the telecast from Williams-Brice Stadium (80,250). Brad Nessler will be behind the mic with Todd Blackledge adding the game analysis and Holly Rowe working the sidelines. This is the second-straight SEC Eastern Division contest for Carolina. The Gamecocks dropped a 41-30 decision last week at Georgia in their 2013 SEC opener. This has become an early season "must win" for both schools if they hope to remain in the hunt for the SEC Eastern Division title, as they both enter the contest with a loss in their only conference test of the season.

A LITTLE HISTORY: 2013 marks the 120th season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina, dating back to 1892. It is the 107th-consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina is 20 games over the .500 mark with an all-time record of 566-546-44. The Gamecocks were nine games under .500 until head coach Steve Spurrier took the reins in 2005, but are 29 games over since.

**SEC HISTORY:** The 2013 season marks South Carolina's 22nd year in the Southeastern Conference. South Carolina and Arkansas joined the league prior to the 1992 campaign. The Gamecocks earned their first SEC Eastern Division title in the 2010 season. The Gamecocks are 72-96-1 all-time in SEC regular-season play, but are 17-8 since 2010 in conference action.

**VS. VANDY:** This is the 23rd all-time meeting between South Carolina and Vanderbilt, with the Gamecocks holding an 18-4 advantage, including a 10-2 record when the games have been played in Nashville and an 8-2 mark when the teams have met in Columbia. In the previous 22 outings, Vanderbilt has tallied more than 17 points just three times (24 in 2003, 28 in 2005 and 24 in 2008). Carolina won last year's meeting in Nashville by a 17-13 count in the season opener, and posted a 21-3 win two years ago when the teams last meet in Columbia. The Gamecocks have won four straight in the series and 11 of the last 13. In those last four wins. Carolina has surrendered just 33 total points. Vandy's four wins have come in back-to-back fashion on two occasions - first in 1998 and '99, then again in 2007 and '08. Those four wins have been by a combined total of 22 points. The teams met just once (1961) before they became SEC Eastern Division rivals beginning in 1992, and have met every year since. Of the Division I FBS opponents against whom the Gamecocks have at least 10 all-time meetings. Carolina has its best winning percentage against Vanderbilt at .818.

SPURRIER VS. VANDERBILT: South Carolina head coach Steve Spurrier owns an 18-2 all-time record against Vanderbilt, including a 6-2 mark as head coach at South Carolina. He was a perfect 10-0 against the Commodores while head coach at Florida from 1990-2001, and bested Vanderbilt twice in 1987 and 1988 while head coach at Duke. The only team Coach Spurrier has defeated more often than Vanderbilt in his career is Kentucky (19-1).

**SPURRIER VS. FRANKLIN:** Steve Spurrier has faced Vanderbilt's James Franklin twice, winning both of those contests. He was a 21-3 winner in Columbia in 2011, then won by a 17-13 count in Nashville last year.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: The Gamecocks opened the 2012 season with a 17-13 win at SEC Eastern Division rival Vanderbilt on Thursday, Aug. 30, 2012. The Gamecocks survived two turnovers on their first three plays from scrimmage and took a 10-0 lead early in the second quarter. The Commodores rallied back to take a 13-10 lead heading into the final stanza. But Carolina was able to put together a nine-play, 66-yard drive that culminated in a Marcus Lattimore one-yard plunge to take a 17-13 advantage early in the fourth quarter, then held on for the win. The Gamecock defense held Vandy to just 17 yards in the final period. Lattimore led the Carolina offense with 110 yards rushing and two scores, earning SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors, while quarterback **Connor Shaw** carried 14 times for 92 yards as the Gamecocks rolled up 205 yards on the ground. Senior linebacker Shaq Wilson tied for the team lead with eight tackles and also logged a key interception. Carolina recorded five sacks that night.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET IN COLUMBIA: The No. 12/10 Gamecocks used a dominant defensive effort to defeat the Commodores, 21-3, on Sept. 24, 2011 in Columbia. Vanderbilt garnered just 77 yards of offense (73 passing and four rushing), while committing three turnovers and surrendering six sacks. Meanwhile, Carolina gained 367 yards of offense. Marcus Lattimore rushed for 77 yards and a score and had 73 yards receiving, including a back-breaking 52-yard scoring reception with just 13 seconds remaining in the first half.

ABOUT LAST WEEK: The sixth-ranked Gamecocks traveled to Athens and suffered their first loss of the season, a 41-30 decision to the No. 12-ranked Georgia Bulldogs. After kicking a field goal on their first possession, the Gamecocks fell behind by a 17-3 count before rebounding to tie the score at 24 at the half. Georgia's high-powered offense proved to be too much in the second half, as the Bulldogs pulled away for the victory behind Aaron Murray's 309 passing yards and four touchdowns, and Todd Gurley's 132 yards on the ground with one TD. Connor Shaw threw for 228 vards and two touchdowns and Mike Davis logged a career-best 149 yards on the ground to keep the Gamecocks in the contest. Nick Jones had his best game as a member of the Garnet & Black, catching six passes for 97 yards and two scores. The loss snapped Carolina's six-game winning streak (the sixth-longest in the nation) and was also their first loss against Georgia since 2009.

DAVIS LEADS THE CHARGE: Marcus Lattimore will never be forgotten by the Gamecock faithful, but Mike **Davis** is certainly doing his best to soften the loss. The 5-9, 215-pound sophomore from Lithonia, Ga. logged the first 100-yard rushing game of his career with a 115-yard performance against North Carolina in his first career start. Included was a 75-yard scamper, the longest for a Gamecock since Bobby Wallace went 88 yards against Middle Tennesssee in 2006, and tying for the 12th-longest run from scrimmage in school history. He came back last week at Georgia, playing in his home state for the first time, and responded with a 149-yard effort on just 16 carries, an average of 9.3 yards per tote, with one touchdown. He also went for a 75-yard gain for the second-straight week. After two games. Davis is fourth in the SEC and 14th in the country in rushing at 132.0 yards per contest and is third among the SEC leaders in average yards per carry at 9.4.

100-YARD EFFORTS: The Gamecocks already have two 100-yard rushing games this season after notching just four a season ago when they got three from Marcus Lattimore and one from Kenny Miles. Mike Davis has back-to-back 100-yard rushing games, becoming the third player on the roster with a 100-yard rushing game in his career, joining Brandon Wilds (3) and Connor Shaw (1). Both Wilds and Shaw turned in their 100-yard efforts during the 2011 campaign.

**BACK-TO-BACK 75's:** Mike Davis has scampered for a 75-yard run in each of the first two games. A 75-yard or longer run has only been accomplished 14 times in Gamecock history, and Davis is the first to do it twice. After two weeks, there have been 16 running plays of 75 yards or longer in Division I football and Davis is the only player on the list twice.

**GAMECOCKS PARTNER WITH CURING KIDS CANCER:** Working with the nonprofit organization,
Curing Kids Cancer, the Gamecocks will wear logo
stickers on their helmets when they take the field
against Vanderbilt. The stickers are part of an effort
by college football teams to raise awareness that
September is National Childhood Cancer Awareness Month.

LIL' NICKY: Junior wide receiver Nick Jones is not the biggest guy on the roster or have the most raw talent. All he does is catch passes. The 5-7, 174-pounder from Moore, S.C. had his best game as a Gamecock, catching six passes for 97 yards and two touchdowns in the loss at Georgia, all career highs. His TD catches came from 18 and 30 yards out. His previous highs were four receptions (4 times) and 78 receiving yards. He had just one career touchdown before Saturday's effort. For the season, he is the team's top receiver with 10 catches for 118 yards and two scores.

**SHAW-SHAQ RECEPTION:** Senior quarterback **Connor Shaw** and sophomore wide receiver **Shaq Roland** hooked up for a 65-yard touchdown pass on the third play from scrimmage in the season-opening win over North Carolina. Last week at Georgia, the two hooked up three times for 48 yards. For the season, Roland, a former Mr. Football in the state of South Carolina, has five catches for a team-leading 123 yards and a score.

HE'S OUR GURLEY, MAN: Sophomore safety T.J. Gurley has been impressive in the early going as he comes back from knee surgery that ended his 2012 season prematurely. He stepped in for an injured Kadetrix Marcus in the opener and responded with a team-leading and career-high nine tackles. Making his first start of the season in his home state last week at Georgia, the Cairo, Ga. native responded with another career-high in tackles, registering 11 stops, including eight solos. He ranks in a tie for third in the SEC, averaging 10.0 tackles per game, including a league-best 15 solo stops.

FIRST TIME STARTERS: Ten Gamecocks have made their first career starts this season. Eight made their first career start in the season-opening win over North Carolina. The first-time starters included four on offense (TB Mike Davis, TE Drew Owens, WR Shaq Roland and OC Cody Waldrop) and four on defense (Spur Sharrod Golightly, LB Kaiwan Lewis, SS Kadetrix Marcus and LB Marcquis Roberts). OC Clayton Stadnik and CB Ahmad Christian both made their first career starts at Georgia.

**CAPTAINS:** The Gamecocks will have individual game captains through the early part of the season.

**MAKING HISTORY:** The Gamecocks have put together back-to-back 11-win seasons, the first back-to-back, double-digit win seasons in school history. They have logged two of their three 10-or more win seasons in

the last two years. The only previous 10-win campaign came in 1984. Entering the 2013 campaign, the Gamecocks have won 22 games over the past two seasons, 31 over the past three seasons, and 38 over the past four seasons, all school records.

**TOP-10 PROGRAM:** The Gamecocks have put together back-to-back Top 10 finishes for the first time in school history, finishing ninth in 2011 and eighth in 2012 according to the Associated Press. They finished one spot higher in the Coaches' poll both years. The Gamecocks have finished among the nation's Top 25 for three-straight seasons, another "first" in school history. Here are South Carolina's final AP Top-25 rankings:

**YEAR (FINAL AP):** 1958 (13); 1984 (11); 1987 (15); 2000 (19); 2001 (13); 2010 (22); 2011 (9); 2012 (8).

**THE RANKINGS-2012:** The Gamecocks finished eighth in the final 2012 Associated Press poll and seventh in the final USA Today/Coaches poll. It was the highest finish on record for Carolina, one spot better in both polls than in 2011.

THE RANKINGS-2013: The Gamecocks entered the 2013 season with the highest national ranking in school history. They opened the season sixth in the Associated Press poll and seventh in the USA Today/Coaches poll. The previous high to open a season came in 2012 when they opened at No. 9 in both major polls. They were ranked sixth in both polls after week one, but slipped to No. 13 in the Associated Press poll and No. 14 in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll this week following a road loss at Georgia when they were the underdog.

IN THE POLLS: The Gamecocks have been ranked in the Associated Press Top-25 for 50-consecutive polls, starting with the second week of the 2010 season. That is the longest consecutive streak in school history. According to research compiled by "The Blitz," South Carolina was ranked in the A.P. poll 148 times from 1936-2011, 14 times as a member of the ACC (1936-1970), 57 times as a Independent (1971-1991) and 77 times since joining the SEC prior to the 2012 season.

**YES THEY CALL IT A STREAK:** The Gamecocks are tied for the fifth-longest current streak of being ranked in the Associated Press's Top 25. Carolina and Stanford have been ranked for 50-consecutive weeks, trailing only Alabama, LSU, Oregon and Oklahoma.

THE AP TOP-10: The Gamecocks were ranked in the top-10 for a school-record 10-consecutive Associated Press polls, the final two of the 2011 season and the first eight of the 2012 campaign, before falling out after successive losses at LSU and Florida. The Gamecocks have been ranked in the AP Top 10 33 times in school history, 19 under head coach Steve Spurrier, including 16 times since 2011. They fell out of the top-10 this week after losing as a road underdog at Georgia.

**GOOD HOME COOKIN':** The Gamecocks have won their last 12 games at Williams-Brice Stadium. Carolina is 28-3 in its last 31 home games. The only home losses since 2009 came to top-ranked Florida in 2009, to 17th-ranked Arkansas in 2010 and to defending national champion Auburn in 2011. The Gamecocks' 12-game home winning streak is the third-longest in the nation, trailing only Michigan (16) and Georgia (13).

**TOP HOME STREAKS:** The Gamecocks have won 12-straight home games, their longest stretch since joining the SEC and the third-longest streak in school history. A win over the Commodores would tie for the second-longest home winning streak, set from 1986-88. Here are the top home winning streaks:

**PERFECT AT HOME:** The Gamecocks went 7-0 at home in 2012. It marked the first time they ran the table at home since joining the SEC. The last time they went undefeated at home was in 1987. They have been undefeated and untied at home 10 times.

**THE HEAD BALL COACH:** Steve Spurrier is in his ninth season directing the Gamecock football program. He has logged a 67-38 mark (.638) in Columbia. The Head Ball Coach is Carolina's winningest coach with 67 victories and is second in games coached with 105, behind Rex Enright (140). Coach Spurrier owns a 209-78-2 mark (.727) in 24 seasons as a collegiate head coach, with previous stops at Duke and Florida.

AT THE TOP OF THE LEADERBOARD: Head coach Steve Spurrier recorded his 65th victory at South Carolina in his 102nd career game as the Gamecocks' head coach in 2012 the regular-season finale at Clemson. He surpassed Rex Enright (64) for the most coaching wins in school history. He now owns 67 wins at South Carolina. He is also the winningest coach at Florida with 122 victories. The legendary Bear Bryant (60 at Kentucky and 232 at Alabama) is the only other coach to own the most wins at two SEC schools.

**TOPS IN HIS FIELD:** Steve Spurrier became the 71st head college football coach (all divisions) and the 22nd in Division I history to record 200 wins when he accomplished that feat against UAB in 2012. He ranks third among active Division I coaches with 209 wins. In addi-

tion, the HBC has 47 wins as a head coach at the professional level, giving him 256 career coaching wins.

**NEW TERRITORY:** The 2013 Outback Bowl marked the seventh time Coach Spurrier has taken Carolina to a bowl game. They have been bowl-eligible in each of his eight campaigns. No other coach in history has taken the Gamecocks to more than three bowl games. Coach Spurrier is 3-4 in bowl games

at Carolina, including back-to-back bowl wins over Nebraska (Capital One Bowl) and Michigan (Outback Bowl). He is the only Gamecock coach to post three bowl victories.

HAVING A SENIOR MOMENT: The Gamecocks list five seniors on their roster, including four scholarship seniors. That is the fewest number of seniors in Division I football in 2013. The quintet includes QB Connor Shaw, OG Ronald Patrick, DE Chaz Sutton, CB Jimmy Legree and walk-on WR David Wilkins. Interestingly, the Gamecocks will face four of the top 14 schools that list the fewest seniors (North Carolina, UCF, Mississippi State and Clemson).

**SHAW GETS THE START:** Senior quarterback **Connor Shaw** returns for his final campaign. Shaw, a 6-1, 209-pounder from Flowery Branch, Ga., is 18-4 as a starter, including a 11-0 mark at home. He and Jeff Grantz are the only two players in school history to pass for over 3,000 yards and rush for over 1,000 yards. In the loss at Georgia, he became the ninth player in school history to pass for over 4,000 yards in a career, hence becoming the first 4,000-1,000 player in school history. He is the school's all-time leader in completion percentage at 66.2 percent and is sixth with 35 touchdown passes.

**THROWING STRIKES:** When the Gamecocks pitch it around the park, there's been no one who has been more accurate in school history than **Connor Shaw**. The top two and three of the top five quarterbacks in completion percentage have worked under Coach Spurrier:

**WAITING IN THE WINGS:** Junior **Dylan Thompson** is ready and waiting to take some snaps as well. Thompson, a 6-3, 218-pounder from Boiling Springs, S.C., stepped in admirably last season when Shaw was beset by injuries. He led the Gamecocks to wins over East Carolina and Clemson in his two starts, throwing for over 300 yards on both occasions. He also was 7-of-10 for 117 yards and two touchdowns in the bowl win over Michigan, including the game-winning 32-yard pass to Bruce Ellington with just 11 seconds remaining in the contest. Thompson completed a 29-yard touchdown pass to Kane Whitehurst in the season opener against North Carolina, the only snap he took from scrimmage. With that, Thompson's last two passes have both gone for TDs.

**CATCH THIS:** Junior **Bruce Ellington** is the top returning receiver. He logged 40 receptions for 600 yards and seven touchdowns last season and has 824 yards on 58 career receptions but was slowed in camp by a hamstring injury and did not start against UNC. He returned to full speed against Georgia, but caught just one pass for 13 yards. Junior **Damiere Byrd** (17 catches, 404 yards), the fastest player on the team, and junior **Nick Jones** (34 catches, 458 yards) are the other two wideouts with the most experience.

**STELLAR TIGHT ENDS:** The Gamecocks are blessed with a pair of standout tight ends. Junior **Rory "Busta" Anderson** is an All-SEC candidate. He has 23 career receptions for 470 yards with eight touchdowns. He did not play in the opener against UNC due to a hamstring injury. Sophomore **Jerell Adams** averaged over 22 yards a catch on just four receptions last season. He also was limited against UNC with an ankle injury. With Anderson checking in at 6-5, 242, and Adams at 6-6, 237, both can present a matchup challenge for a defense.

**THE O-LINE:** The Gamecocks have four returning starters along the offensive line. Junior left guard A.J. Cann is the most experienced of the group with 27 career starts, the most on the squad, and is an All-SEC candidate. Senior right guard Ronald Patrick started all 13 games last season. Junior left tackle Corey Robinson started nine of the last 10 games a season ago, while right tackle Brandon Shell was a Freshman All-American while making 10 starts. The lone newcomer is redshirt freshman **Cody Waldrop**, who has big shoes to fill in replacing T.J. Johnson, who graduated as the school's all-time leader with 53 starts, having started every game from 2009-12. Waldrop was hampered by a foot sprain suffered in the win over North Carolina, and was unable to play at Georgia. He was replaced admirably by redshirt freshman Clayton Stadnik, who saw his first career action.

**AS GOOD AS IT GETS:** The 2013 Gamecocks feature one of the game's top players in junior defensive end **Jadeveon Clowney**. Clowney, who is regarded by most as the top defensive player in the country and a likely top pick in the 2014 NFL Draft, was just the second Gamecock to earn unanimous All-America honors in 2012, joining George Rogers from his Heisman Tro-

phy season in 1980. Clowney was named the Hendricks Award winner as the nation's top defensive end, and the All-America Player of the Year, presented by AT&T as selected by the fans on ESPN.com. He finished sixth in the Heisman race and was a finalist for the Nagurski Trophy, Rotary Lombardi Award and the Bednarik Award after being named the SEC Defensive Player of the Year by the league's coaches.

**THE MAGNIFICENT SEVEN:** Fresh off his trip to L.A. to receive the ESPY Award for the top play of the year, **Jadeveon Clowney** returns to cause havoc for quarterbacks around the southeast. Clowney set school records last season for sacks in a game (4.5 at Clemson), sacks in a season (13.0) and tackles for loss in a season (23.5) as a sophomore. The 6-6, 274-pounder is on everyone's preseason All-America list and a legitimate candidate for all the national awards. With a sack and 2.0 tackles for loss at Georgia, he continues to move up the all-time Carolina charts in those categories. WHO ARE YOU?: The Gamecocks graduated five seniors who manned the linebacker and spur positions a year ago and will look to a host of youngsters to fill in those slots this season. Sophomores Kaiwan Lewis and Marcquis Roberts started at the two linebacker spots in the season opener, but will be pushed to hold onto those starting assignments. Sophomore Cedrick Cooper, who dislocated his elbow in the preseason, and redshirt freshman T.J. Holloman will also get plenty of opportunities this season. A trio of true freshmen, Skai Moore, Larenz Bryant and Jonathan Walton, have been impressive as well, and could log some important minutes. Lewis (15), Moore (13) and Roberts (11) rank 2-3-4 among the Gamecocks' leaders in tackles this season.

**SECONDARY IN NATURE:** South Carolina returned three starters in the secondary in junior cornerback **Victor Hampton**, senior cornerback **Jimmy Legree** and junior safety **Brison Williams**. Hampton is considered the shutdown corner, while Legree has played both corner and safety during his career. The unit is still looking for its first interception of the season. FRY HEATS UP: True freshman Elliott Fry walked on to the Gamecock squad this summer and earned the starting placekicking chores in the opener. The Frisco, Texas product was impressive against North Carolina, hitting on both of his field goal attempts from 39 and 26 yards, and all three of his extra points for nine total points. He became the first true freshman placekicker to kick in the Gamecocks' season opener since Courtney Leavitt in 1996. He hit a 36-yard field goal in his only attempt at Georgia to improve his numbers to 3-for-3 in that department, tying for third in the SEC.

HULL OF A PUNTER: Junior Tyler Hull returns for his second season as the Gamecocks' punter. The 6-2, 206-pounder from Mount Airy, N.C. spent his first season at Guilford College before transferring to South Carolina just prior to the start of the 2012 campaign. Last season, he averaged 39.4 yards per punt. 22 of his 54 punts were fair catches, while 12 went inside the 20. This year he is averaging 36.9 yards per punt with two of his seven inside the 20 with a long of 48.

**COACHING SHUFFLE:** Carolina made one coaching change during the off-season, as defensive line coach Brad Lawing left for Florida and was replaced by former North Carolina defensive line coach **Deke Adams**.

**THEY'RE BACK:** The Gamecocks welcomed 36 returning letterwinners to begin the 2013 campaign. That group consists of 19 offensive players, 16 defensive players and one special teams player. The Gamecocks lost 24 lettermen, including 10 on offense, 11 on defense and three from special teams.

FOR STARTERS: The Gamecocks listed 12 returning starters from the 2012 squad (six on offense, five on defense and one specialist). The returning offensive starters are OG A.J. Cann, WR Bruce Ellington, OG Ronald Patrick, OT Corey Robinson, QB Connor Shaw and OT Brandon Shell. The returning defensive starters include DE Jadeveon Clowney, CB Victor Hampton, CB Jimmy Legree, DT Kelcy Quarles, SS Brison Williams. The lone returning specialist is P Tyler Hull.

GONE BUT NOT FORGOTTEN: The Gamecocks said goodbye to 26 lettermen from last year's bowl roster including 12 starters. The departing starters include TE Justice Cunningham, OC T.J. Johnson, TB Marcus Lattimore, WR D.L. Moore and WR Ace Sanders on the offensive side of the ball and LB Reginald Bowens, SPR DeVonte Holloman, DT Byron Jerideau, FS D.J. Swearinger, DE Devin Taylor and LB Shaq Wilson on the defensive side of the ball, along with PK Adam Yates.

**BROTHER ACT:** The Gamecocks have two sets of brothers on the squad. Redshirt freshmen offensive linemen **Brock and Clayton Stadnik** are twins. On the defensive line, **Gerald Dixon and Gerald Dixon Jr.** are half-brothers. They share the same father, Gerald Dixon Sr., who played at Carolina in the early 90s.

**THE LEGACY CONTINUES:** The Gamecocks roster features four players whose fathers also donned the Garnet & Black: junior defensive tackle **Kelcy Quarles** and his father, Buddy (1984-87); sophomore defensive linemen **Gerald Dixon** and **Gerald Dixon Jr.** and their father, Gerald (1990-91); and redshirt freshman **Jordan Diggs** and his father, Shed (1984-87).

IN THE CLASSROOM: The Gamecocks placed 29 players on the 2012 SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll while posting a team GPA of 2.918, highest in school history. Among those who made the SEC Honor Roll include returnees Landon Ard, K.J. Brent, Damiere Byrd, A.J. Cann, Shon Carson, Gerald Dixon Jr., Phillip Dukes, Bruce Ellington, Deon Green, Mason Harris, Tyler Hull, Kadetrix Marcus, Drew Owens, Ronald Patrick, Kelvin Rainey, Corey Robinson, Brandon Shell, Brock Stadnik, Clayton Stadnik and Dylan Thompson.

THEY PAY TO SEE THE GAMECOCKS PLAY: The Gamecocks ranked 18th in the nation in home attendance in 2012, averaging 80,001 at Williams-Brice Stadium. That included a school-record 85,199 who were on hand to watch the Gamecocks thump Georgia, 35-7. The Gamecocks opened the 2013 season with a capacity crowd of 81,572 against North Carolina. The Florida and Clemson games are already sold out, while a limited number of tickets remain for the other four home games.

**KEEPING THE FANS HAPPY:** The Gamecocks have taken care of business against their top rivals in recent seasons. Since 2010, they are an impressive 11-2 against SEC Eastern Division rivals Georgia (3-1), Florida (2-1) and Tennessee (3-0) and against in-state rival Clemson (3-0). In fact, Carolina has won the Palmetto State Championship four years in a row, the longest winning streak over the Tigers since 1951-54.

**TWO-SPORT STARS:** Head coach Steve Spurrier is not adverse to having his players participate in other sports at Carolina. Wide receiver **Bruce Ellington** has been the starting point guard for the basketball team for the past three seasons, while tailback **Shon Carson** and cornerback **Ahmad Christian** spent the spring with the Gamecock baseball team. In addition, wide receiver **Damiere Byrd** was a sprinter during the indoor track & field season.

IT'S A NUMBERS GAME: The Gamecocks returned 42 percent of their rushing yards, 96 percent of their passing yards and 54 percent of their receiving yards from a year ago, In addition, six of the squad's top 13 tacklers, return for the 2013 campaign.

**AN SEC SIX-PACK:** With a 6-2 SEC mark in 2012, the Gamecocks reached six SEC victories for the second year in a row. They had never had six SEC wins in a season prior to 2011. They finished the 2000, 2001, 2005 and 2010 seasons with 5-3 SEC marks. Carolina finished 2012 with at least a .500 SEC mark for the 10th time in 21 seasons and have put together three-straight .500-or-better SEC records for the first time in school history.

**GAMECOCKS IN THE SEC:** The Gamecocks wrapped up their 21st season of league play in the SEC in 2012. They have played 169 SEC regular-season contests since joining the league. Here's a breakdown of the Gamecocks in three-year segments in conference regular season action:

**OUT OF THEIR LEAGUE:** The Gamecocks went 5-0 in non-conference action in both 2011 and 2012, and have been undefeated in regular season non-conference play for three-consecutive years. They are 32-7 in non-conference games under head coach Steve Spurrier, including wins in 30 of their last 35 non-SEC tilts. The year-by-year breakdown: 2005 (2-2); 2006 (5-0); 2007 (3-1); 2008 (3-2); 2009 (4-1); 2010 (4-1); 2011 (5-0); 2012 (5-0); 2013 (1-0). They have a regular-season winning streak over non-conference opponents of 17 games. South Carolina's last regular-season non-conference loss came at Clemson in 2008.

**RECRUITING SUCCESS:** The Gamecocks had another successful February signing day. Carolina has put together nine-straight classes that rank among the nation's top 25, according to *Rivals*. Here are the recent recruiting class rankings according to *Rivals* and *Scout*.

**WORKING OVERTIME:** The Gamecocks have played just two overtime games in their history, both at Tennessee. They dropped a 23-20 decision in Knoxville on Sept. 27, 2003, then fell by a 27-24 score on Oct. 27, 2007, at Neyland Stadium.

NASHVILLE, TENN.—Junior running back Marcus Lattimore rushed for 110 yards and two touchdowns to lead ninth-ranked South Carolina to a 17-13 victory over Vanderbilt on Thursday night in the season opener for both teams at Vanderbilt Stadium.

With the Gamecocks trailing 13-10 early in the fourth quarter, Lattimore scored the game-winning touchdown on a 1-yard run with 11:25 remaining. The Gamecock defense then buckled down and allowed just 17 yards the rest of the way to seal the win.

South Carolina (1-0, 1-0 SEC) has now won 13 straight season openers and nine straight games against SEC Eastern Division opponents, while Gamecock head coach Steve Spurrier

improves to 22-1 all-time in season openers. The Commodores (0-1, 0-1) have dropped four straight games to South Carolina.

In his first game back after suffering a knee injury at Mississippi State last season, Lattimore averaged 4.8 yards on 23 carries and led the Gamecocks with three receptions for 21 yards.

Despite missing several series with a shoulder injury, junior quarterback Connor Shaw helped guide the Gamecocks back into the game, connecting on 7-of-11 passes for 67 yards and rushing 14 times for 92 yards.

The Gamecock defense came up big early after two turnovers by the offense. With Vanderbilt facing a third and goal at the Carolina 5, linebacker Shaq Wilson stepped in front of a Jordan Rogers pass and returned the interception 37 yards to the Commodore 49.

Wilson's interception provided a spark for the offense, as Shaw ran for a 20-yard gain on Carolina's first play after the turnover. Lattimore then took care of the rest as he busted loose for a 29-yard touchdown run, breaking a tackle on his way to the end zone. The touchdown moved Lattimore into sole possession of third place in career rushing touchdown at Carolina with 28. Adam Yates tacked on the extra point to give the Gamecocks a 7-0 lead at the 4:55 mark of the first quarter.

Yates drilled his first career field goal attempt from 20 yards out with 11:44 left in the half to push South Carolina's lead to 10-0.

Vanderbilt fought back to tie the game before halftime, as Rogers connected with Jordan Matthews for a 78-yard scoring strike to make it a 10-7 ballgame with 10:37 remaining.

After holding the Gamecocks to a three-and-out on the ensuing possession, the Commodores drove deep into Carolina territory before Carey Spear made a 25-yard field goal to knot the game at 10-10.

Shaw left the game late in the second quarter with a shoulder injury after rushing for a 2-yard gain on first down, as the teams ran out the clock and headed into the locker room tied at 10.

Vanderbilt took its first lead of the contest in the third quarter on a 44-yard field goal by Spear that gave the Commodores a 13-10 advantage with 6:02 on the clock.

But Shaw re-entered the game to help lead the Gamecocks to victory. After the offense stalled in his first series back, he guided Carolina on a nine-play, 66-yard scoring drive in his second series, with Lattimore scoring from 1 yard out to give the Gamecocks the lead for good.

Wilson and sophomore defensive tackle Kelcy Quarles led the Carolina defense with eight tackles apiece, as the Gamecocks surrendered 276 yards. Carolina also had five sacks on the night

Rogers led the way for Vanderbilt, completing 13-of-23 passes for 214 yards and one touch-down.

**COLUMBIA, S.C.**—No. 12/10 South Carolina used a dominant effort from its defense to defeat Vanderbilt, 21-3.

The Gamecocks held the Commodores to just 77 yards of offense (73 passing, four rushing), forced three turnovers and recorded six sacks.

With the win, South Carolina improves to 4-0 for the first time since 2001 and 2-0 in the Southeastern Conference. Vanderbilt drops to 3-1 on the season and 1-1 in the conference.

Senior defensive end Melvin Ingram and freshman defensive end Jadeveon Clowney recorded four tackles apiece to lead the

Gamecocks. Ingram tallied three tackles for loss, including two sacks, and recovered a fumble in the end zone for a touchdown, which was his third score of the year. Clowney finished with two sacks, both of which resulted in fumbles. Senior Spur Antonio Allen also had four tackles and his third fumble recovery of the season.

South Carolina gained 367 yards on the night, with 236 through the air and 131 on the ground. Sophomore running back Marcus Lattimore rushed for 77 yards and a score and had 73 yards receiving and a touchdown to carry the offense.

Stephen Garcia completed 16-of-30 passes for 228 yards with one touchdown and four interceptions. Ace Sanders had four receptions for 75 yards, and Alshon Jeffery added two receptions for 34 yards in the win. Jeffery passed Sterling Sharpe for second on the all-time receiving yards list at South Carolina with 2,526 yards in his career. He needs 255 yards to pass Kenny McKinley as the all-time leader.

After Vanderbilt grabbed a 3-0 first-quarter lead on a 33-yard field goal by Carey Spear, South Carolina turned to its defense for a spark in the second stanza.

On third and 7 from the Vanderbilt 39, Commodore quarterback Larry Smith dropped back to pass, but Clowney burst into the backfield and stripped the ball. Allen scooped up the fumble and returned it 20 yards before Vanderbilt's Wesley Tate punched the ball loose into the end zone, where Ingram fell on it for the Gamecock touchdown. Jay Wooten's extra point gave the Gamecocks a 7-3 lead with 11:59 left in the half.

The Gamecocks went into the locker room with a 14-3 lead after executing their two-minute offense to perfection with 46 seconds left in the half, needing just two plays to find the end zone. On second and 5 from the Gamecock 48, Garcia found Lattimore on short pass, and Lattimore broke through a tackle and weaved his way down the field for a 52-yard touchdown reception.

South Carolina continued its solid defensive play to start the second half, forcing a three-and-out on the opening possession. The Gamecock offense then helped put the game out of reach with an 11-play, 83-yard scoring drive capped by a 22-yard touchdown run by Lattimore, giving South Carolina a 21-3 advantage with 7:46 left in the third quarter.

The Gamecocks shut down the Commodore offense the remainder of the game, allowing just seven yards the rest of the way to seal the win.

Steve Spurrier, who has coached a national championship team, won seven Southeastern Conference titles, garnered nine conference Coach of the Year awards, and won 73 percent of the college games in which he has coached, is in his ninth season as head coach at the University of South Carolina. Spurrier was introduced as Carolina's 32nd head coach on Nov. 23, 2004.

Coach Spurrier has compiled a 209-78-2 (.727) won-loss record in 24 seasons as a major college head coach, including a 67-38 mark (.638) at Carolina. He became the 71st collegiate coach (all divisions) and the 22nd in Division I to record 200 career victories when he defeated UAB on Sept. 15, 2012 and logged his 250th all-time coaching win against Georgia on October 6, 2012.

Coach Spurrier surpassed Rex Enright's school record for wins when he logged number 65 at Clemson in the 2012 season finale. In doing so, he joined the great Bear Bryant as the only coaches to boast the most coaching victories at two different SEC

He led the Duke Blue Devils to the 1989 Atlantic Coast Conference championship before returning to his alma mater, the University of Florida, as head coach in 1990. During his 12 seasons with the Gators, Spurrier's teams won seven Southeastern Conference championships, one national title and finished ranked in the nation's top 10 nine times. His record at Florida was an amazing 122-27-1 (.817). Spurrier, who won the 1966 Heisman Trophy as a quarterback for the Gators, was also head coach of the NFL's Washington Redskins (2002-03). He returned to the college ranks in 2005 after a one-year absence from the

In his first season at South Carolina, Coach Spurrier led the Gamecocks to a 7-5 record and a second-place finish in the SEC Eastern Division. In doing so, he posted a five-game winning streak, the 15th-consecutive year in which he has had a fivegame winning streak, something no other coach in college history has accomplished. He was honored as the SEC Coach of the Year by the Associated Press after leading the Gamecocks to a school-record five straight SEC wins, their first win ever at Tennessee and their first win over Florida since the 1930s.

He came back with an 8-5 record in 2006, just the ninth time in school history that the Gamecocks posted eight or more wins in a season. The season was capped with a Liberty Bowl win over C-USA champion Houston.

In his third season with the Garnet & Black, Spurrier's squad raced out to a 6-1 record and moved as high as No. 6 in the BCS rankings, before finishing the campaign with a 6-6 record. With 21 wins, he set the Carolina record for coaching victories after three seasons at the helm.

With a 7-6 record in 2008. Carolina returned to a New Year's Day bowl game for the first time since the 2001 season. The Gamecocks followed that up with another 7-6 record in 2009, their sixth-consecutive non-losing season, the longest stretch in school history since 1928-34. The 2009 season included a win over No. 4 Ole Miss, only the second time in school history that Carolina had defeated a top-five team.

His 2010 Gamecock squad posted several milestones en route to a 9-5 season, the biggest of which was the school's first SEC Eastern Division title and first appearance in the SEC Championship. The Gamecocks also defeated the nation's No. 1 team, Alabama, for the first time in school history, and finished the season ranked 22nd in both major national polls. He was named SEC Coach of the Year for the seventh time, his ninth overall Coach of the Year honor.

The Gamecocks continued to make history in 2011, winning a school record 11 games and finishing in the the top-10 in the final A.P. poll for the first time. The squad also won a

school-record six SEC games and defeated each of their Eastern Division rivals in the same season for the first time. Carolina capped the regular season with a win over Clemson, its thirdstraight over its Palmetto State rival, the first time that has been accomplished since 1968-70, then defeated Nebraska in the Capital One Bowl by a convincing 30-13 margin.

The 2012 season was another success, as the Gamecocks rolled up a school-record 11 wins for the second-straight season and logged double-digits in wins for just the third time in school history, capped off by a 33-28 win over Michigan in the Outback Bowl. They defeated four teams that finished among the nation's top 25 in Georgia, Clemson, Vanderbilt and Michigan. The Gamecocks defeated in-state rival Clemson for a fourth-straight year, the first time that had been accomplished since the 1950s.

# Game 1 #6/7 South Carolina 27, North Carolina 10



August 29, 2013 Williams-Brice Stadium Columbia. S.C. 81,572



COLUMBIA,S.C— Quick offensive strikes from Connor Shaw and Mike Davis helped No. 6/7 South Carolina (1-0) dispatch of North Carolina (0-1) 27-10 in the college football season opener at Williams-Brice Stadium.

On the third play from scrimmage, the senior quarterback Shaw found sophomore wide receiver Shaq Roland over the middle for a 65-yard touchdown strike, putting the Gamecocks in the lead 7-0. The 82-yard drive marked the guickest score for South Carolina in a season in the SEC era (since 1992). Shaw ended the contest going 11-for-20 for 149 yards and the one TD pass while adding 43 yards on the ground.

Davis, the sophomore running back who won the starting job in fall camp, capped South Carolina's scoring with his third-quarter, 75-yard run

over the right side to make it 27-10. Davis ended the day with a career-high 115 yards on 12

South Carolina held a 17-0 lead before the first quarter ended, with freshman Elliott Fry's first collegiate field goal, a 39-yarder, making it 10-0. Junior quarterback Dylan Thompson, on his first play of the game, made it 17-0 with a 29-yard touchdown throw to sophomore wide receiver Kane Whitehurst.

In the second quarter, North Carolina got on the board on Bryn Renner's four-yard pass to Quinshad Davis, but Fry's second field goal, this one from 26 yards, handed South Carolina a 20-7 lead that stood at the half. The Gamecocks doubled the Tar Heels in first downs in the first half, 12-6, and tallied more yards, 260-121. Seventy of UNC's yards came on its scoring drive.

The Tar Heels opened the second half with a 17-play, 67-yard drive capped by a Thomas Moore 20-yard field goal before Davis' 75-yard dash.

The game was halted at 8:46 p.m. due to lightning in the area, delaying the game for 1:44. After the break, North Carolina threatened to score with two minutes to go, but a dive toward the end zone by Renner fell a yard short on fourth-and-goal, turning the ball back over downs to the Gamecocks with 58 seconds remaining.

Sophomore running back Brandon Wilds ran for 64 yards on 12 carries, while junior Nick Jones and Roland both matched career bests in receptions with four and two, respectively. Four of the Gamecocks' returning defenders (Sharrod Golightly, T.J. Gurley, Chaz Sutton & Ahmad Christian) matched or bettered their previous career high in tackles, and sophomore Gerald Dixon Jr. posted his first career tackle and quarterback hurry.

Gamecock head coach Steve Spurrier improved to 23-1 as a collegiate head coach in the lid-lifter, including 9-0 at South Carolina. He also owns a 5-0 record over the Tar Heels, with two of those wins coming in the Garnet and Black. South Carolina's home winning streak stands at 12 games now, one shy of tying the second-best stretch in Williams-Brice Stadium (1986-88).

# Game 2 #11/12 Georgia 41, #6/6 South Carolina 30



Sept. 7, 2013 Sanford Stadium Athens, Ga. 92,746



ATHENS, Ga. — A back and forth affair went to the No. 11/12 Georgia Bulldogs as the No. 6/6 South Carolina Gamecocks fell 41-30 in front of sellout crowd of 92,746 fans at Sanford Stadium. It was a day for the offense as the Gamecocks and Bulldogs combined for 990 total yards. South Carolina rushed for 226 with 228 in the air while Georgia rushed for 227 and passed for 309 in the contest.

South Carolina took the opening drive 57 yards to set up for a 36-yard field goal by Elliot Fry to take an early 3-0 lead. The Gamecocks mixed the pass with the run including a pair of third-down conversions that featured a 14-yard pass completion by Connor Shaw to Nick Jones and a 21-yard rush by Mike Davis.

Georgia answered the Gamecocks on its opening drive that was capped by a three-yard

touchdown pass by Aaron Murray to tight end Arthur Lynch. The Bulldogs drove deep into South Carolina territory on a 32-yard pass completion from Murray to Michael Bennett and a 19-yard rush by Gurley. With 2nd & goal on the 3, Murray play faked and found Lynch in the end zone to give the Bulldogs a 7-3 lead.

The Bulldogs showed some trickery following the touchdown as they went with an onside kick that was recovered by cornerback Blake Sailors to give Georgia another possession on their own 48-yard line. The Bulldogs made its way into Carolina territory for a second consecutive possession and went into the red zone after a 4th & 13 completion from Murray to Scott-Wesley. Inside the Gamecocks' 10-yard line, Carolina held tough and UGA settled for a Patrick Beless 22-yard field goal to extend the advantage to 10-3.

The Bulldogs went seven plays and 69 yards to increase the lead to 17-3 on a six-yard touchdown pass from Murray to Keith Marshall. After Jadeveon Clowney netted his first sack of the season, the Bulldogs made up for the 10-yard loss with a 16-yard rush by Marshall followed by a 15-yard face mask penalty on the Gamecock defense.

South Carolina responded with a 12-play, 84-yard drive to answer the Bulldogs and cut the deficit to seven points. Davis was key for the Gamecocks as he had a 23-yard rush to begin the drive and a three-yard carry on 4th & 2 at the UGA 11 to keep the drive going. The Gamecocks would punch it in the end zone on a seven-yard carry by Brandon Wilds.

The Gamecock defense forced a three-and-out for the Bulldogs on the next possession. South Carolina then caught a break as punter Collin Barber mishandled the snap allowing the Gamecocks to recover on the UGA 18-yard line. South Carolina rode the momentum of the punt mishap and responded quickly to tie it up at 17 as Shaw found Jones in the corner of the end zone on the first play for an 18-yard touchdown.

The pendulum swung to Georgia as the Bulldogs went 11 plays in 70 yards in the ensuing drive to reclaim a 24-17 lead. Gurley again was a focal point for Georgia with seven carries for 46 yards including a 2-yard touchdown run with 1:42 remaining in the half.

South Carolina answered one more time to tie the game at 24 going into halftime. With three timeouts and 1:38 remaining on the Carolina 29-yard line, Shaw manufactured an 11-pla,y 70-yard drive capped by a 30-yard touchdown pass to Nick Jones.

The Bulldogs capitalized on Carolina's first turnover of the season to go ahead 27-24 on Beless' second field goal of the game, this one from 37 yards. The Gamecocks were driving and appeared to convert a fourth down but quarterback Connor Shaw fumbled right before his knee hit the ground, allowing the Bulldogs to take over on the Georgia 25-yard line.

Georgia extended the lead to 34-24 near the end of the quarter on an eight-yard touchdown pass from Murray to Gurley. The Bulldogs went 13 plays for 82 yards with Murray finding Gurley on third down, just eluding the sack attempt by Carolina defensive tackle Kelcy Quarles.

South Carolina dug deep and responded again as Davis tallied a 75-yard run from scrimmage to end the third quarter and move the Gamecocks into scoring position at the Georgia five-yard line. Three plays later, Davis scored on a three-yard touchdown. The extra point attempt sailed left as Georgia stayed ahead 34-30 with 13:55 remaining in the game.

With Georgia 3rd & 13 on their own 15-yard line, Murray eluded another Gamecock sack attempt and found Scott-Wesley behind the Gamecock defensive backfield for a completion. Scott-Wesley took it down the sideline and into the end zone to give Georgia a 41-30 lead with 13 minutes to go in the fourth quarter.

The Bulldogs remained in possession the final 8:28 of the game with 13 plays to secure the victory including a 4th & 2 conversion with 2:42 in the game.
