#81 HAYDEN HURST Tight End

Junior ◆ 6-5 ◆ 250 ◆ 2 VL Jacksonville, Fla. (The Bolles School)

- ◆ Tight end who ranks second on the squad with 19 receptions and with 297 receiving yards this season.
- ◆ Has tallied three touchdowns, two receiving and one rushing.
- ◆ Named to *The Athletic's* midseason first-team All-SEC squad.
- ◆ Best game this season was a sixcatch. 76-vard effort at Texas A&M.
- ◆ Had a career-long 62-yard touchdown reception against Arkansas.

- ◆ Has led the team in tackles in three games this season.
- ◆ Owns 6.0 tackles for loss, ranking in a tie for 15th in the SEC.
- ◆ Best effort was a 12-tackle performance in the win over Louisiana Tech.
- ◆ Leads the team with two interceptions. giving him 13 for his career, just one shy of the school record of 14, held by Bo Davies (1969-71).
- ◆ Led the team in tackles in each of his first three seasons as a Gamecock and could become the school's first four-time tackles leader.
- ◆ Ranks 10th in school history with 311 career tackles.
- ◆ Ranks fourth in school history with 183 career unassisted tackles.
- ◆ Named a permanent team captain for the 2015 season.
- ◆ Earned second-team All-SEC honors as a junior in 2015.
- ◆ His 111 tackles in 2015 was the second-highest total recorded by a Gamecock in the last 25 years.
- ◆ Redshirted for the 2016 campaign after suffering a neck injury that sidelined him for the entire season.

- ◆ Versatile performer who has been used primarily at safety this season, but can also play corner and nickel.
- ◆ Third on the squad with 40 tackles.
- ◆ Broke up the pass in the end zone on the final play in the win at Tennessee.



#90 TAYLOR STALLWORTH Defensive Tackle

Sr. ◆ 6-2 ◆ 305 ◆ 3 VL Mobile, Ala. (Murphy)

- ◆ Senior leader of the defensive line who is instrumental in getting the young players around him lined up correctly.
- ◆ Credited with 23 tackles including 2.5 tackles for loss.
- ◆ Has three quarterback hurries and a pass breakup.

CAROLINA VS. VANDY: This is the 27th all-time meeting between South Carolina and Vanderbilt, with the Gamecocks holding a 22-4 advantage, including a 10-2 mark when the teams have met in Columbia and a 12-2 record when the games have been played in Nashville. The teams met just once (1961) before they became SEC Eastern Division rivals beginning in 1992, and have met every year since.

IN DOMINATING FASHION: The Gamecocks have won each of the last eight games, their longest winning streak in the series, and 15 of the last 17 meetings between these two SEC Eastern Division rivals. Of the Division I FBS opponents against whom the Gamecocks have at least 10 all-time meetings, Carolina has its best winning percentage against Vanderbilt at .846. In the previous 26 outings, Vanderbilt has tallied more than 17 points just five times (24 in 2003, 28 in 2005, 24 in 2008, 25 in 2013 and a record-high 34 in 2014).

THE OUTLIERS: Vanderbilt's four wins in the series have come in back-to-back fashion on two occasions - first in 1998 and '99, then again in 2007 and '08. Those four wins have been by a combined total of 22 points (17-14, 11-10, 17-6 and 24-17).

THE LAST TIME THEY MET: The Game-cocks rallied from a 10-point halftime deficit on September 1, 2016, to post a 13-10 victory at Vanderbilt in the season opener for both squads. Deebo Samuel scored on an eight-yard run to tie the score midway through the fourth quarter, then Elliott Fry booted a career-long 55-yard field in the game's final minute to lift the Gamecocks to victory. The Gamecock defense forced seven three-and-outs and limited the Commodores to just 242 yards of offense, including 73 through the air.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET HERE: The Gamecocks made a coaching change during the game week, with interim Shawn Elliott taking over for Steve Spurrier, who stepped down from his post. The squad responded with a 19-10 victory over Vanderbilt in Columbia on October 17, 2015. Elliott Fry booted four field goals to account for most of the scoring. Brandon Wilds carried 24 times for 120 yards and Pharoh Cooper logged 160 yards on seven catches, including a 78-yard scoring strike from Perry Orth in the third quarter that gave the Gamecocks a lead they would not relinquish. The Carolina defense picked off three passes in the contest.

WHERE THERE'S A WILL: Will Muschamp is 4-1 in five games as a head coach against the Commodores. He was a 26-21 winner in 2011 in "The Swamp," posted a 31-17 win in Nashville in 2012, dropped a 34-17 decision at Gainesville in 2013, then won by a 34-10 count in Nashville in 2014 as the head coach at Florida. He ran his record in Nashville to 3-0 when he took the Gamecocks to the Music City and survived a 13-10 decision to open the 2016 campaign in his Carolina debut.

A South Carolina win over Vanderbilt would...

- ◆ Give the Gamecocks six wins on the season, making them bowl eligible.
- ◆ Keep the Gamecocks hopes for an SEC Eastern Division title alive. With a win, the Gamecocks would be 4-2 with only games at division-leading Georgia and at home versus Florida remaining.
- ◆ Extend the Gamecocks winning streak over the Commodores to a record nine-straight games. Vanderbilt has not defeated South Carolina since a 24-17 win in Nashville in 2008. The Gamecocks longest winning streak over an SEC opponent is 10 games against Kentucky (2000-09).
- ◆ Give the Gamecocks four SEC wins with two conference games remaining. Carolina won three SEC games in 2014, one in 2015 and three in 2016 after three-straight 6-2 conference marks.

YOU ARE LOOKING LIVE: It's Homecoming Week on the University of South Carolina campus in Columbia as the Gamecocks (5-2, 3-2 SEC) host the Vanderbilt Commodores (3-4, 0-4 SEC) in an SEC Eastern Division match up on Saturday, October 28. Game time is set for 4 pm ET at Williams-Brice Stadium (80,250) in Columbia. The game will be televised by SEC Network.

FOR YOUR VIEWING PLEASURE: Taylor Zarzour and Heisman Trophy winner Andre Ware will be in the booth for SEC Network with Olivia Harlan reporting from the sidelines.

THREE SHY OF 600: It's been 125 years since the University of South Carolina laced it up for a December 24, 1892 meeting in Charleston against Furman, a 44-0 setback. 2017 marks the 124th season of intercollegiate football at South Carolina. It is the 111th-consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 597-571-44, a .511 winning percentage.

SEC, SEC: The Gamecocks are in their 26th year in the Southeastern Conference. South Carolina and Arkansas joined the league prior to the 1992 campaign. The Gamecocks earned their lone SEC Eastern Division title in 2010. The Gamecocks are 88-116-1 (.432) all-time in SEC regular-season play, but are 33-28 (.541) in conference action since the start of the 2010 season.

POST-BYE WEEK SUCCESS: The Gamecocks are coming off a bye week. They have won 10 of their last 12 contests after a bye week dating back to the 2008 season.

GOOD OLE ROCKY TOP: The Gamecocks recorded a season-high seven sacks and pitched a second half shutout to rally for a 15-9 win at Tennessee in their last outing on October 14. The Carolina defense surrendered just 253 yards (only 120 after the first quarter) and did not allow a touchdown despite four redzone penetrations by the Vols, including three shots from the 2-yard line in the final seconds to preserve the victory. Parker White converted all three of his field goal attempts, including two in the final six minutes to provide the margin of victory. The win was Will Muschamp's sixth in as many tries against Tennessee, and was the Gamecocks' second true road win of the season after totaling just one true road win in the previous two seasons combined.

WONNUM RECOGNIZED AGAIN: Sophomore Dennis "D.J." Wonnum, has been selected as the SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week in each of the Gamecocks' last two games. In the win over Arkansas, he was credited with four solo tackles, including a tackle for loss, broke up two passes and had a quarterback hurry. He led a Carolina defensive line that limited the Razorbacks to just 106 yards rushing on 32 carries. At Tennessee, he logged six tackles, all solo stops, including a pair of sacks for a dozen yards. The Carolina defense held the Vols to just 253 yards of total offense, including just 120 yards after the first quarter.

SEEING RED: The Gamecock defense has really buckled down in the red zone this season. In the last game at Tennessee, Carolina surrendered just three field goals in four Vol penetrations into the red zone. For the season, the Gamecocks have allowed just 12 touchdowns on 26 red zone opportunities, or just 46 percent of the time. Overall, Carolina is tied for second in the SEC in red zone defense with Georgia, behind only Alabama.

SAWYER STRIPS TOPS THE NATION: Senior defensive lineman **Dante Sawyer** leads the nation with four forced fumbles this season. The school record for a season is six, set by Bill Currier in 1976 and matched by Emanuel Weaver in 1981.

NO SCORING ZONE: The Gamecocks are allowing just 19.3 points per game this season, fifth in the SEC. If that number holds up, it would be their best mark since the 2012 squad allowed just 18.2 points per contest, and would mark the fourth-straight year in which the Gamecocks have shown improvement, going from 30.4 ppg in 2014, to 27.5 in 2015 to 26.5 last season. South Carolina is one of just 12 Division I-A schools that has not allowed a 30-point game this season.

BETTER THAN AVERAGE: The Gamecock defense has been better than advertised this season, holding all seven opponents to fewer points than their season average, with three of the seven being held at least 10 points below their season mark. Vanderbilt enters this week's contest averaging 22.4 points per game. Here are the numbers:

SEASON-HIGH SEVEN SACKS: The Gamecocks recorded a season-high seven sacks in the win at Tennessee. It marked the most sacks for the squad since logging eight sacks in the 2012 game at Kentucky. Carolina is fifth in the SEC in sacks.

THREE-AND-OUT: The Gamecock defense has logged 11 three-and-outs in their last two wins over Arkansas and Tennessee. They had recorded just nine three-and-outs in the first five games combined.

ONCE, TWICE, THREE TIMES A TD: The Gamecocks set a school record with three defensive touchdowns in the win over Arkansas. Skai Moore returned an interception 34 yards, T.J. Brunson returned a fumble 73 yards, then Keisean Nixon returned an interception 45 yards for a score. It was the Gamecocks first game with multiple defensive scores since September 10, 2011 at Georgia, when Antonio Allen had a pick-six and Melvin Ingram scored on a fumble recovery. The three defensive scores were one shy of the NCAA Division I record of four, accomplished four times. The Gamecocks have scored five defensive or special teams touchdowns this season.

POINTS FROM ELSEWHERE: The Gamecocks have scored five non-offensive touchdowns this season, two on kickoff returns, two interception returns and one fumble return. That is one shy of the school record of six non-offensive touchdowns, accomplished four times since 1970: 1971, 2010, 2011 and 2012.

MAKESHIFT LINE: The Gamecocks have had just two of their five Opening Day offensive linemen make the start in their last two games against Arkansas and Tennessee. Junior right tackle Zack Bailey has missed the last four contests after suffering a right ankle injury against Kentucky. Senior right guard Cory Helms injured his right ankle against Louisiana Tech and has not played in the last three contests. Junior tackle Malik Young went out early in the A&M game a right ankle injury and has missed the last two contests. Redshirt freshman Sadarius Hutcherson has made his first three career starts, while senior D.J. Park and junior Blake Camper have both made their first starts of the season at right tackle. The Gamecocks have used six different offensive line combinations in their first seven games, including four different starters at right tackle. The lone constant has been senior Alan Knott at center.

In addition to the issues on the offensive line, wide receiver/ kick returner Deebo Samuel is out indefinitely with a fractured leg, while starting Buck Bryson Allen-Williams (shoulder), starting running back Rico Dowdle (fractured leg) and tight ends K.C. Crosby (fractured leg) and Kyle Markway (ribs) will miss the remainder of the regular season after undergoing surgery.

HEY TURN ME OVER: Carolina is tied for third in the SEC with 13 turnovers forced (7 fumbles and 6 interceptions). The Gamecocks are plus-7 in turnover margin, tied for second in the SEC and tied for 15th in the country.

RAISE THE FLAG: The Gamecocks are one of the least penalized teams in college football. Carolina has been flagged for just 31 penalties this season, an average of 4.4 per game, which ranks scond in the SEC and tied for 15th in the country. Carolina's penalties have totaled 228 yards or just 32.6 yards per contest, the fewest in the SEC and the fourth-fewest in the nation behind only Georgia Tech, Minnesota and Arizona State.

MY QUARTERBACK IS A BENTLEY: Sophomore quarterback Jake Bentley is the key to the Gamecock attack. The 6-3, 220-pounder is hitting on 60.8 percent of his passes this season (129for-212) for 1,585 yards with 12 touchdowns and four interceptions. He completed a career-best 16-consecutive passes earlier this season against Kentucky, four shy of the school record of 20, set by Connor Shaw. He ranks third in the SEC in passing yards per game (226.4) and fourth in total offense (228.4), while his 12 TD passes ranks fourth. Bentley, who is 9-5 in 14 career starts, has thrown for over 300 yards twice in his career. He set the school record for bowl games and Birmingham Bowl records for passes completed (32), yards passing (390) and total offense (381) while throwing three TD passes against USF in 2016.

ON TARGET: Quarterback Jake Bentley has completed 63.2 percent of his career passes (254of-402). That has him ranked second on the Gamecocks' career completion percentage list.

FAMILY AFFAIR: Quarterback Jake Bentley comes from a football family. His father, Bobby, is the Gamecocks' running backs coach and previously was a highly-successful coach at Byrnes (S.C.) High and at Presbyterian College. Jake's step-brother, Chas Dodd (Rutgers), and brother, Shuler Bentley (Old Dominion/Murray State), both have played quarterback in college. Chas is on the Carolina staff as a GA in the weight room.

BORN TO RUN: The Gamecocks are without the services of Rico Dowdle, who suffered a broken leg in the win over Tennessee. While Dowdle's absence will be felt, the running game will be in the capable hands of A.J. Turner and Ty'Son Williams. Despite not having a carry in two of the first three games, Williams (6-0, 215) leads the team with 328 yards on 60 rushes, a 5.5-yard average, with two starts. He turned in the best performance in 2017 when he carried 13 times for 95 yards, including a 35-yard burst, in the win over Louisiana Tech. Turner (5-10, 184) logged 497 vards and three scores on 116 carries last season, including a career-best 113-yard effort against Texas A&M. After rushing just 20 times for 60 yards through the first six games, he carried 14 times for 86 yards and a touchdown at Tennessee after Dowdle was sidelined. Mon Denson, a 5-10, 209-pound sophomore, becomes the third back in the rotation.

THE PRODIGAL (TY)SON: After spending the 2015 season at North Carolina, then sitting out 2016 as a transfer, redshirt sophomore running back Ty'Son Williams, from Sumter, S.C., has led the Gamecocks in rushing three times this season. He came off the bench at Mizzou to lead the team with 14 rushes for 78 yards in the win. He made his first collegiate start against Louisiana Tech and responded with 95 yards on 13 carries, a 7.3-yard average, including a 35-yard touchdown burst in the fourth quarter, the longest by a Gamecock this season. He logged 14 carries for 73 yards, including a 34-yard burst, at Texas A&M. After seven games, he is the team's leading rusher with 328 yards on 60 carries, a 5.5-yard average.

MISSING DEEBO: Deebo Samuel did it all for the Gamecocks through the season's first three games before suffering a broken bone in his leg against Kentucky. In the opener against NC State, he returned the opening kickoff 97 yards for a score, and caught five passes for 83 yards including a pair of scores, finishing the day with 185 all-purpose yards. At Missouri, he returned another kickoff 97 yards for a touchdown, scored on a 25-yard rush and caught five passes for 45 yards, accumulating 167 all-purpose yards. He was named SEC Special Teams Player of the Week

after both the NC State and Missouri contests. Samuel hauled in five passes for 122 yards, including a 68-yard scoring strike on the game's first play from scrimmage against Kentucky, before suffering the injury.

MOVIN' ON UP: Bryan Edwards played an excellent second fiddle to Deebo Samuel, but has now moved into the first chair in Samuel's absence. Edwards has caught at least four passes in six of seven games this season, totaling 33 catches for 420 yards and one score. He ranks fourth in the SEC in receptions per game (4.7) and is eighth in receiving yards per game (60.0). His best effort is a six-catch, 122-yard performance against Louisiana Tech. The 6-3, 215-pounder from Conway, S.C., has 77 career receptions for 1,010 yards.

ORTRE FINDS THE END ZONE: True freshman wide receiver OrTre Smith has three touchdowns among his dozen receptions this season. His first career reception was a 9-yard TD pass late in the game against Kentucky, then he caught a 28-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter against Louisiana Tech before hauling in a 13-yard scoring strike at A&M in the third quarter.

HE MAY BE SHI, BUT HE'S NOT AFRAID:

Shi Smith has also stepped up in the absence of

Shi Smith has also stepped up in the absence of Deebo Samuel. The true freshman had his best game as a Gamecock at Texas A&M, catching three passes for a team-high 86 yards, including a 45-yard touchdown pass for his first career score. For the season, Shi has hauled in 15 passes for 190 yards and one touchdown.

Hurst played professional baseball in the Pittsburgh Pirates' organization after being selected in the 17th round of the 2012 draft. Now a 6-5, 253-pound junior, the 24-year-old Hurst turned in the school's best single-season receiving numbers for a tight end in 2016. His 48 receptions and 616 receiving yards topped the previous marks of 38 catches, set by Doug Hamrick in 1970, and 576 yards, set by Danny Smith in 1987. He also was selected a permanent team captain in 2016, becoming the first sophomore in school history to earn that distinction. He was a 2017 first-team mid-season All-SEC selection by *The Athletic*.

GETTING IN THE SACK: The Gamecocks have recorded 17 sacks this season, with four coming in the season opening win over NC State and seven coming at Tennessee, the most in a game since 2012. TACKLING MACHINE: Sophomore T.J. Brunson is the Gamecocks' top tackler and ranks ninth in the SEC with 56 stops, or 8.0 tackles per game. Brunson made his first start as a Gamecock memorable. The 6-1, 230-pound linebacker from Columbia, S.C. posted a game- and career-high 16 tackles in the win over NC State. It was the most tackles in a game for a Gamecock since Antonio Allen logged 16 stops against ECU on Sept. 3, 2011, a game that was also played in Charlotte. He also has logged double-digits in tackles against Kentucky with a dozen. Brunson logged just 12 tackles during the 2016 season.

SKAI SOARS: Skai Moore is back after missing the entire 2016 season following surgery to address a herniated disk in his neck. The 6-2, 221-pound linebacker from Cooper City, Fla., was the Gamecocks' leading tackler in 2015 with 111 stops, tying for third in the SEC with 9.2 tackles per game. He also led the team with 6.5 tackles for loss and with four pass interceptions, tying for fourth in the SEC. Moore became

the first Gamecock to reach the century mark in tackles since 2006, while his 111 tackles were the second-highest total recorded by a Carolina player in the last 25 years. He led the team in tackles for a third-consecutive season, becoming the first player to do so since 1992-94. He currently ranks second on the squad and tied for 14th in the SEC with an average of 7.3 tackles per game.

CHARLESTON REWARDED: Redshirt sophomore Javon Charleston was rewarded with a scholarship just before the start of fall classes. Charleston, a 6-0, 189-pounder from Gurnee, Ill., is a cousin to former Gamecock great Marcus Lattimore. He came to Carolina as a wide receiver but was moved to safety in the spring.

ALL THE WHITE STUFF: The Gamecocks have been challenged to replace the school's alltime leading scorer in placekicker Elliott Fry. The duo of true freshman Parker White and redshirt freshman Alexander Woznick have combined to connect on just 8-of-17 field goal attempts. White, who also handles the kickoffs, is 10-for-10 on PATs and 7-for-14 in the field goal department, but has hit his last four in a row. His first made field goal was a 31-yard game-winner in the final seconds against Louisiana Tech. Woznick, who was the Opening Day starter, is 10-of-11 on extra point attempts and 1-of-3 on field goals.

WHO ARE THESE GUYS?: Whether Parker White or Alexander Woznick handles the placekicking job, he is working with an entirely new unit, as Ben Asbury is the new deep snapper, replacing four-year starter Drew Williams, and backup quarterback **Danny Gordon** is the holder, replacing Sean Kelly.

THIS IS CHARLTON YOUR PUNTER: Redshirt sophomore Joseph Charlton, is the Gamecocks' punter. Charlton has averaged 43.6 yards, seventh in the SEC and 32nd in the country, over his 29 punts with 10 measuring over 50 yards, including a career-long 73-yarder at Missouri, the longest punt by a Gamecock since Marty Simpson had a 79-yard punt in 1992. More importantly, the Gamecocks are averaging 41.1 net yards per punt, sixth in the SEC and 20th in the country. Charlton is threatening the school's single-season punting average record.

BREAKDOWN DEAD AHEAD: The breakdown of the Gamecocks' 109-man roster features 12 seniors, 21 juniors, 30 sophomores, 16 redshirt freshmen and 30 true freshmen.

FRESH FISH: South Carolina has played eight true freshmen this season. Those newcomers who have seen action for the first time in Division I football are Sherrod Greene, Brad Johnson, Or-Tre Smith, Shi Smith, Damani Staley, Aaron Sterling, Chad Terrell and Jamyest Williams. Four freshmen - Greene, OrTre Smith, Shi Smith and Williams - have each made a start.

FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME: Ten Gamecocks have made their first career start this season. Linebacker T.J. Brunson and defensive end D.J. Wonnum each made his first career start in the win over NC State. Brunson responded with a game-high 16 tackles, while Wonnum logged a game-high 3.0 tackles for loss. Wide receiver Shi Smith and defensive back Jamyest Williams became the first true freshmen to get a start this season when they both got the nod at Missouri. Left tackle Dennis Daley made his first start against Kentucky. True freshman wide receiver OrTre Smith, sophomore running back transfer Ty'Son Williams and JUCO defensive tackle transfer **Iavon Kinlaw**, all made their first starts against Louisiana Tech. Redshirt freshman offensive lineman Sadarius Hutcherson got the nod at left guard at Texas A&M. True freshman linebacker Sherrod Greene made his first start against Arkansas.

WINNER, WINNER: The Gamecocks face a dozen opponents that combined to win 61.6 percent of its games last season, going 98-61 overall. That ranked as the fourth-highest opponent winning percentage among FBS teams, behind UMass, LSU and East Carolina. The opponents have not disappointed this season, logging a .614 winning percentage (51-32) thus far.

IN THE CLASSROOM:

- The Gamecocks were one of six teams that competed in a bowl game following the 2016 season that owned a Graduation Success Rate of at least 90 percent.
- · The Gamecocks ranked first in the SEC and third in the country behind only Stanford and Northwestern in the latest Graduation Success Rate (GSR) released by the NCAA.
- The football team recorded its second-highest in-season GPA on record (2.847) during the fall of 2016. The team's spring 2017 GPA was 2.726.

TOTING THE SHEEPSKIN: The Gamecocks have four student-athletes who have earned their undergraduate degree. The quartet includes Ulric Jones (interdisciplinary studies), Skai Moore (interdisciplinary studies), D.J. Park (criminal justice) and Dante Sawyer (interdisciplinary studies).

WORKING OVERTIME: The Gamecocks are 2-3 all-time in games decided in overtime. They won their first overtime game at Missouri, 27-24, in two overtimes on Oct. 26, 2013 in Columbia, Mo., and won in "The Swamp" over Florida by a 23-20 count in 2014. All three overtime losses have come against Tennessee by a field goal: a 23-20 setback on Sept. 27, 2003 in Knoxville, and a 27-24 loss in Knoxville on Oct. 27, 2007 and a 45-42 loss in Columbia on Nov. 1, 2014.

THEY PAY TO SEE THEM PLAY: South Carolina is averaging 77,910 fans at Williams-Brice Stadium (80,250) through three home games, 16th in the nation.

BIG ROAD CROWDS: South Carolina plays in three of the nation's 10-largest college football stadiums this fall, traveling to Texas A&M's Kyle Field in College Station (3rd-102,733), Tennessee's Neyland Stadium in Knoxville (4th-102,455) and Georgia's Sanford Stadium in Athens (9th-92,746).

UP NEXT: The Gamecocks will play their final road game of the season when they travel to Athens to take on the SEC Eastern Division-leading Georgia Bulldogs. Georgia leads the all-time series by a 49-18-2 margin, including a 28-8 record when the games have been played in Athens, but the Gamecocks have won four of the last seven meetings between the two long-time rivals. Next week's game will be only the third time since 1980 that the Gamecocks and Bulldogs have met after September (they played on Oct. 6 in 2012 and Oct. 9, 2016), and is the second-latest date in the history of the series that extends back to 1894, exceeded only by the Nov. 18 game in 1939.



NASHVILLE, Tenn. - In head coach Will Muschamp's first game at South Carolina (1-0, 1-0 SEC), the Gamecocks posted the final 13 points to claim a 13-10 road win in Southeastern Conference play at Vanderbilt (0-1, 0-1 SEC) on Thursday night at Vanderbilt Stadium.

After a 16-yard reception by freshman Bryan Edwards from senior Perry Orth and a 17-yard run by freshman A.J. Turner set him up, senior Elliott Fry stepped up and hit a career-long 55-yard field goal to give South Carolina the lead with 35 seconds remaining in the opener.



South Carolina broke onto the scoreboard midway through the third quarter when Fry hit a 48-yard field goal to cut Vandy's lead to 10-3. Orth connected with sophomore Deebo Samuel for the big play of the drive, as the duo's pass went for 30 yards to get the Gamecocks into Vanderbilt territory.

The Gamecocks tied the contest with 7:30 to go when Samuel swept around the left end and touched the pylon for the eight-yard scoring run. Orth completed five passes to start the drive and ran for a nine-yard gain, while Turner rushed twice for 25 yards, including the 20-yard scamper to set up Samuel's score.

Vanderbilt opened the scoring with a 36-yard field goal from Tommy Openshaw after the Commodores took advantage of a muffed punt by the Gamecocks, setting up the 13-yard scoring drive. That lead grew to 10-0 32 seconds into the second quarter when Khari Blasingam punctuated the 13play, 67-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown run.

The Gamecocks looked like they would draw within one score as they drove inside Vanderbilt's 20-yard line later in the second quarter. But the Commodores' Oren Burks forced a fumble after a five-yard SC run, and Charles Wright covered it up to give Vandy back the ball.

With less than four minutes remaining in the game, Vanderbilt drove into Gamecock territory and set up a 45-yard field goal from the middle of the field, but the chance hooked left, giving South Carolina the chance to drive the field and claim the win.

On Vanderbilt's last possession, Gamecock defensive linemen Taylor Stallworth and Darius English combined for a sack of Commodore quarterback Kyle Shurmur to help close out the victory.





COLUMBIA, S.C .- In its first game under interim head coach Shawn Elliott, South Carolina delivered a 19-10 victory over Vanderbilt Saturday afternoon at Williams-Brice Stadium as the Gamecock defense delivered five turnovers. Four came in the second half to help South Carolina score 13 unanswered points to overcome a halftime deficit and an early Vanderbilt field goal. Senior running back Brandon Wilds delivered his sixth career 100-yard game with 120 yards on 24 carries. Junior wide receiver Pharoh Cooper's eighth career 100-yard receiving game came with 160 yards on seven catches, including a 78-yard touchdown grab in the second half.



South Carolina struck early when Jona-

than Walton forced a fumble recovered by T.J. Holloman on the third play of the game. Elliott Fry delivered a 47-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead.

Quarterback Perry Orth found his rhythm passing on Carolina's ensuing possession, finding D.J. Neal for a 28-yard strike and Cooper for a 24-yard delivery that put the Gamecocks into Vanderbilt territory. Fry again delivered with a 31-yard field goal for a 6-0 Gamecock lead with 6:49 left in the quarter.

Midway through the second quarter, Vanderbilt put together its most extensive drive as McCrary connected on a series of passes. With a first down on the 10-yard line, McCrary was thrown for a two-yard loss. After a five-yard rush by Vandy's Ralph Webb, the Gamecock defense forced another incomplete pass, but Holloman was charged with targeting that gave the Commodores new life at first and goal from the 3-yard line. South Carolina sent Vanderbilt back a yard over the next two plays, but McCrary found Caleb Scott alone in the end zone to make it a 7-6 Commodore lead with 2:21 to play in the half.

The second half opened with a short South Carolina drive as Vanderbilt carried momentum into the third quarter. Darrius Sims broke through for a 41-yard rush to quickly put the Commodores into Gamecock territory. Again the Gamecock defense held up when it mattered most, holding the Commodores to a 23-yard field goal and a 10-6 lead with 5:43 on the clock.

The Gamecock offense wasted little time rewarding its defense's effort as Orth found Cooper on a short slant that the junior receiver broke open for a 78-yard touchdown that put South Carolina back in front 13-10 with 6:34 left in the quarter.

Two plays into the Vanderbilt drive, Bryson Allen-Williams reeled in his first career interception to keep the Williams-Brice Stadium crowd on its feet. McCrary tried to go over the middle where Allen-Williams tipped it straight up. Keeping his focus, the sophomore linebacker tracked it down to seal the Commodores' second turnover of the game and give the Gamecocks the ball on the Vanderbilt 45.

The running game carried the Gamecocks to the 2-yard line, where the Commodores forced a field goal after Ryan White broke up a pass intended for Neal deep in the right corner of the end zone. Fry's strike from 19 yards made it a 16-10 South Carolina advantage with 2:52 to play in the third quarter.

Vanderbilt looked to rally early in the fourth quarter when Jahmel McIntosh pulled down an errant Orth pass meant for Cooper, but sophomore Chris Lammons returned the favor on the next play, out-leaping the receiver to make the interception. The Gamecocks were forced to punt, and the Commodores were sharp early in the possession. A series of penalties set up 1st-and-28 on their own 8-yard line, though, and Skai Moore finished off the drive with a perfectly read interception on McCrary's pass over the middle. Four plays later, Fry drilled his fourth field goal of the game to put the Gamecocks up 19-10 with 5:27 to play.

The Commodores were up for the fight, though, driving efficiently down the field to the Gamecocks' 17 on five plays. After an incomplete pass set up 2nd-and-10, Mc-Crary dropped back for another pass only to be tracked down by Moore who stripped the ball and picked up the fumble to put South Carolina back in the driver's seat.

- ◆ South Carolina finished in 21st place in the Learfield Directors' Cup Standings in 2016-17, its highest finish since the 2002-03 campaign and the third-highest finish in school history.
- ◆ Since the inception of the Palmetto Series, the Gamecocks have captured the title both years, defeating Clemson in 2015-16 by a 10-5 count, and taking the 2016-17 crown in an 8-7 decision. The Certified SC Grown Palmetto Series is sponsored by the South Carolina Department of Agriculture (SCDA) and is a year-long competition between the two



schools in which points are awarded for the winners of head-to-head meetings in each sport. Points were also awarded for highest team GPA and for a food drive during the fall aimed at tackling hunger in their communities.

- ◆ South Carolina is the only Division I athletics program this decade to have at least one Top-4 national finish (championships and/or polls) each in football, men's and women's basketball and baseball.
- ◆ The women's basketball program's national title in 2017 was the seventh overall in the athletic department's history. Four South Carolina programs now boast a National Championship, as the women join women's outdoor track and field (2002), baseball (2010, 2011) and equestrian (2005, 2007, 2015) on the list of Gamecock teams to win a national title.
- ◆ South Carolina's double Final Four this year in men's and women's basketball was only the 13th time in NCAA history and the third time in SEC history that this feat has been accomplished.
- ◆ Five South Carolina athletics teams have made the Elite 8 in NCAA Championships during the last 12 months: men's and women's basketball, men's and women's golf and women's soccer.
- ◆ Sindarius Thornwell (men's basketball), A'ja Wilson (women's basketball), Savannah McCaskill (women's soccer-offensive) and Kaleigh Kurtz (women's soccer-defensive) earned SEC Player of the Year honors in their sports during the 2016-17 school year.
- ◆ South Carolina student-athletes have led the SEC in community service hours in each of the last four years. In 2016-17, Gamecock student-athletes performed 9,298 hours of community service. South Carolina men's tennis was named the Intercollegiate Tennis Association Carolina Region Community Service Team of the Year and Maya Evans, a junior on the women's track & field team, was named the SEC Brad Davis Community Service Leader of the Year. During her collegiate career, Evans accumulated over 700 hours of community service.
- ◆ A total of 379 South Carolina student-athletes made the 2016-17 SEC Academic Honor Rolls, first among league schools (90-Fall, 78-Winter, 118-Spring, 93-First Year). Carolina student-athletes posted a combined 3.23 GPA for the Spring 2017 semester, marking the 21st consecutive semester of more than a 3.0 GPA for Gamecock student-athletes.
- ◆ Fourteen of the 18 South Carolina athletics teams earned a 3.0 or better GPA this past spring. Women's Swimming & Diving (3.705) earned its second highest GPA to date, which not only led all of the Gamecock programs this spring, but it also ranked second nationally. Equestrian (3.488), Women's Soccer (3.567), Men's Track & Field (3.265) and Volleyball (3.673) also earned its second-highest GPAs ever recorded.
- ◆ South Carolina Football has three endowed scholarships. Recipients for endowed scholarships are selected each year by the head coach. The 2017 scholarships and recipients are:
- Marcus Lattimore Endowed Football Scholarship **Bryson Allen-Williams**
- Tommy Suggs Endowed Quarterback Scholarship Jake Bentley
- Wraellen and Larry Winn Endowed Tight End Scholarship Hayden Hurst

- ◆ Gamecock radio analyst **Tommy Suggs** is one of the longest tenured radio voices in college football. The former standout quarterback who led the Gamecocks to the 1969 ACC Championship, is in his 45th season as part of the Carolina radio crew.
- ◆ South Carolina is building a \$50 million Football Operations Center. The state-of-the-art facility is located adjacent to the Jerri and Steve Spurrier Indoor Football Facility, and will provide the coaches and student-athletes with the ability to train and compete at the highest level. It will feature: coaches' offices, locker room, meeting rooms, weight room, training room, dining room, players' lounge and equipment room.
- ◆ In the eight sports in which it competes that the NCAA keeps attendance statistics, South Carolina finished in the Top 25 in seven sports (average attendance), most of any school in the country.

Will Muschamp is in his second season directing the Gamecocks' football fortunes. Muschamp was introduced as the University of South Carolina's 34th head football coach in a press conference held at Williams-Brice Stadium on December 7, 2015.

In his first season in Columbia, Muschamp guided the Gamecocks to a 6-7 mark and a spot in the Birmingham Bowl. The Gamecocks doubled their win total from the previous season while increasing their SEC wins from one to three. The Gamecocks started as many true freshman (7) as any school in the country, and were the only Division I school to have true freshmen lead the team in both passing (Jake Bentley) and rushing (Rico Dowdle). Seventysix of the Gamecocks' 113-man Birmingham Bowl roster (67.3 percent) were either freshmen or sophomores in Muschamp's first campaign.

Regarded as an outstanding defensive mind, Muschamp is a 22-year coaching veteran, including 14 years in the Southeastern Conference. In five seasons as a head coach, all in the SEC, Muschamp owns a 34-28 record, a .548 winning percentage. His previous head coaching experience came at the University of Florida where he posted a 28-21 record from 2011-14. He led the Gators to three bowl games in his four seasons in Gainesville and was recognized as the SEC Coach of the Year in 2012 after guiding Florida to an 11-2 record and a Top-10 finish.

As an assistant coach, the Rome, Ga., native has worked in two national championship games (2003 and 2009), winning with LSU in 2003, and coached in a pair of BCS bowl games following the 2008 and 2012 seasons.



He has coached in and won three conference championship games, twice in the SEC and once in the Big 12. He was a finalist for the 2007 Broyles Award, presented to the nation's top assistant coach.

Prior to coming to Columbia, Muschamp most recently served as the defensive coordinator at Auburn University in 2015, his third stint as an SEC defensive coordinator. He also held that title with Auburn from 2006-07 and at LSU from 2002-04. In his six seasons as an SEC defensive coordinator, Muschamp's units ranked among the nation's Top-10 in total defense and in scoring defense five times.

Muschamp's first full-time coaching experience in the SEC came at LSU. He was the Tigers' linebacker coach for one season before being elevated to defensive coordinator from 2002-04. His 2003 defense helped the Tigers to the national championship by leading the nation both in scoring defense (11.0 points per game) and total defense (252.0 yards per game), while finishing second nationally in pass efficiency defense (89.8) and third in rushing defense (67.0 yards per game).

Prior to taking the reins at Florida, Muschamp served as the defensive coordinator at the University of Texas from 2008-10. Under his guidance, the Longhorn defense ranked No. 1 in the nation with 119 sacks and ranked in the Top-10 nationally allowing 2.9 yards per rushing attempt (third), 96.7 rushing yards per game (fourth) and 297.4 yards per game (seventh), all Big 12 bests during that span. In 2009, the Longhorns played in the BCS National Championship game. Under Muschamp's tutelage at Texas, Brian Orakpo won the 2008 Rotary Lombardi, Bronko Nagurski and Ted Hendricks awards. In the 2009 and 2010 NFL Drafts, Muschamp had a combined eight players drafted, seven in the first four rounds, including first-rounders Brian Orakpo and Earl Thomas.

In four of his nine seasons as an FBS defensive coordinator, his teams have allowed less than 100 rushing yards per game and twice led the nation in rushing defense. His 2003 LSU defense led the country by allowing 67 yards per game on the ground, the best mark by an SEC team in the 2000s, while Texas gave up just 73.1 yards on the ground in 2009 to pace the nation.

A 1994 Georgia graduate, Muschamp moved immediately into coaching, working as a graduate assistant at Auburn from 1995-96, while earning his master's degree. He served as a secondary coach at West Georgia (1998) and Eastern Kentucky (1999) before moving into his first defensive coordinator position at Valdosta State for the 2000 season, where he helped the Blazers to a 10-2 record and the Gulf South championship.

Muschamp also logged a stint in the NFL, working as the Miami Dolphins Assistant Head Coach for Defense in 2005 under Nick Saban.

During his playing career at Georgia, Muschamp earned his way from walk-on to scholarship player by the spring of his redshirt freshman season and eventually was named co-captain as a senior. A safety on the gridiron, he earned a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll in 1993.

Born August 3, 1971, Muschamp and his wife, the former Carol Davis, have two sons, Jackson and Whit.





CHARLOTTE, N.C. — Behind a resurgent defensive effort in the second half and three touchdowns from junior Deebo Samuel, South Carolina (1-0) claimed a 35-28 victory over NC State (0-1) in the Belk College Kickoff at Bank of America Stadium.

The Gamecock defense came out on fire in the second half, shutting down an NC State drive after five plays with a pair of quarterback hurries and a sack by Keir Thomas. Chris Lammons made it a short field, returning the punt 26 yards to near midfield. Three plays later, quarterback Jake Bentley,



after escaping pressure, hit Deebo Samuel for a 39-yard score.

Defense set up the next Gamecock touchdown, as the Wolfpack fumbled the football on Dante Sawyer's sack. Bryson Allen-Williams recovered it at the NC State 13. Two plays later, Rico Dowdle sprinted seven yards to hand the Gamecocks a 35-21 lead.

NC State took back momentum after the Gamecocks were stuffed deep in their own territory and the Wolfpack took over at the SC 46 after the punt. The Wolfpack methodically went 46 yards in nine plays, with Ryan Finley hitting Jaylen Samuels from one yard out to close within a score. An interception by Wolfpack Johnathan Alston gave the ball back to NC State. But the Gamecock defense stood strong, keeping NC State from gaining a second first down. South Carolina punted the ball back to NC State, but the Wolfpack turned over the ball on downs after D.J. Smith tackled Samuels just short of the first-down marker with 4:34 remaining.

The Wolfpack got the ball back with three minutes to go and drove inside the Gamecock 10, but the Gamecocks batted passes away from NC State receivers, the final one by D.J. Smith, to close out the victory.

The teams battled to a draw in the second half, scoring three touchdowns each in the contest. Samuel got the Gamecocks off to a blazing start, returning the opening kickoff 97 yards for a score, his second career kickoff return for a touchdown. The Wolfpack answered with a 14-play, 75-yard drive that was capped by Finley's six-yard keeper.

South Carolina retook the lead on its next possession, as Bentley hit Dowdle out of the backfield for a 34-yard TD strike. Finley and the Wolfpack knotted the contest again, as Finley went 4-for-5 for 56 yards in a nine-play drive. Nyheim Hines capped the drive with a two-yard scoring run.

After SC went three-and-out, Sawyer forced a fumble, and Rashad Fenton recovered it to set up the next Garnet and Black points. Bentley kept the nascent drive going with a 13-yard scamper before hitting Bryan Edwards for a 26-yard strike to put the Gamecocks to first-and-goal. Bentley capped the drive with a six-yard pass caught by Samuel to put South Carolina ahead again, 21-14.

The Wolfpack missed a 29-yard field goal, giving the ball back to the Gamecocks with four minutes to go, but the NC State defense scuttled it around midfield, getting the ball back with 1:47 to play in the half. The Wolfpack marched to a tying score, with Finley hitting Jakobi Meyers with a four-yard scoring pass, tying the game at 21 at the half.

COLUMBIA, MO. — Deebo Samuel ran for two touchdowns to help South Carolina cruise to a 31-13 victory over Missouri on Saturday night in the SEC opener for both teams.

Missouri (1-1, 0-1) led 10-0 early in the second quarter when tight end Jason Reese slipped past linebacker T.J. Brunson, hauled in a Drew Lock pass and outran his pursuers. South Carolina (2-0, 1-0) trailed for only 30 seconds. Samuel returned the ensuing kickoff 97 yards for a touchdown - his second TD return in two weeks. After the Gamecocks' Jamyest Williams in-



tercepted Lock, Samuel struck again, scoring on a 25-yard jet sweep. Samuel finished with five catches for 45 yards.

Jake Bentley was 18 of 28 for 187 yards passing and threw a 39-yard touchdown pass to Hayden Hurst to stretch South Carolina's lead to 21-10 midway through the third quarter. Hurst added a 2-yard scoring run in the fourth quarter.

Lock had 245 yards passing and a touchdown, but was intercepted twice.

GAME CHANGER

Missouri took a 10-0 lead with 13:07 remaining in the second quarter, but Deebo Samuel quickly changed that, returning a 97-yard kickoff for a touchdown for the second straight game. It was Samuel's Gamecock best third career kickoff return for a touchdown. Samuel then took advantage of Jamyest Williams'first career interception, scoring on a 25-yard run on the drive's first play, giving the Gamecocks the lead for good.

KEY STAT

3 -- For the second straight game, the Gamecocks won the turnover battle, turning a trio of Tiger miscues into 14 points. Jamyest Williams' interception turned into a Deebo Samuelrushing touchdown. Then a fumble on a punt in the fourth quarter led to Hayden Hurst's second touchdown of the contest.

NOTABLES

- South Carolina is 2-0 on the young season for the first time since the 2012 campaign.
- Hayden Hurst had a touchdown reception of 39 yards and a two-yard rushing touchdown on the night. It was his second and third career touchdowns (two receiving, one rushing) after putting his first one on the board in the 2016 Birmingham Bowl against USF. Hurst ended the game with three receptions for 69 yards.
- Bryson Allen-Williams recorded his third interception in the past four games with his pick in the fourth quarter. Allen-Williams had interceptions at Clemson (Nov. 26, 2016) and against USF in the Birmingham Bowl (Dec.
- Samuel becomes the second player in South Carolina history to record a kickoff return for a touchdown in back-to-back games. King Dixon did the trick in games against Texas (Oct. 5, 1957) and Furman (Oct. 12, 1957). He has a school record three kickoff returns for touchdowns, all coming in the last five games.



COLUMBIA, S.C. — Benny Snell Jr. rushed for two touchdowns and Kentucky's defense held off South Carolina to win its fourth straight over the Gamecocks, 23-13, on Saturday night.

Snell, who's status was in doubt earlier in the week due to bruised ribs, rushed for scores of 5 and 1 yard in leading the Wildcats (1-0 Southeastern Conference) to their first 3-0 start since 2010. Two years ago, Kentucky snapped a 22-game SEC road losing streak at South Carolina.

This time, the Wildcats left no doubt about who was the better team in this one.

It did not start that way, though.



Snell and offense took over with two long, first-half scoring drives for a 14-6 lead. Snell ended a 13-play series with his 5-yard touchdown. He capped an 11-play sequence with his second touchdown.

Kentucky made the critical plays when it needed. Facing fourth-and-goal from the Wildcats 1 in the fourth quarter, Gamecock tailback Rico Dowdle was stopped cold by linebacker Jamar Watson and cornerback Derrick Baity.

Then when the Gamecocks closed it to 20-13 on OrTre Smith's 9-yard touchdown grab with 6:26 left, Kentucky quarterback Stephen Johnson scrambled on third down for a 54-yard run that led to Austin MacGinnis' third field goal with two minutes left that sealed the win.

Snell finished with 102 yards on 32 carries.

Samuel had five catches for 122 yards and his sixth touchdown of the season. But he left the game in the fourth quarter with an injury.

GAME CHANGER

South Carolina forced a pair of first-half turnovers, an interception from Skai Moore and a fumble recovery from Jamyest Williams. The Gamecocks did not turn those Kentucky miscues into points as a Jake Bentley interception and a punt ended those USC drives.

KEY STAT

68 -- Jake Bentley hit Deebo Samuel for a 68-yard touchdown on the first offensive play of the game. Samuel ended the game with five receptions for 122 yards but he suffered an injury that will have him out for extended period of time.

South Carolina 17 Louisiana Tech 16

COLUMBIA, S.C. — Nothing had gone right in Parker White's college career. He missed two field goals last week in a South Carolina loss and two more as the Gamecocks looked on their way to an embarrassing loss to Louisiana Tech.

Oh-for-four, booed on his home field and torn apart all last week on Twitter, the freshman kicker finally hit a kick true, the 31-yarder sailing through the uprights with seven seconds left as the Gamecocks (3-1) beat the Bulldogs 17-16 on Saturday.

White danced around the field wav-

ing his arms at the student section after the first game-winning field goal in his life. And after the Bulldogs (2-2) failed to return the kickoff, he ran and jumped into the student section.

The winning was an immediate balm for South Carolina. But there were still problems. Sophomore quarterback Jake Bentley had several overthrows and an ugly interception that required a tackle from him to prevent a touchdown the other way. There was a defense that put little pressure on Louisiana Tech and allowed 6-of-13 conversions on third down - with the meat of the Southeastern Conference schedule starting next week at Texas A&M.

The Gamecocks (3-1) trailed 13-0 before a wild fourth quarter that saw South Carolina take a 14-13 lead and Louisiana Tech (2-2) answer with a 10play, 84-yard drive that ended with what appeared to be the game winning 25-yard field goal by Jonathan Barnes with 55 seconds left.

Bentley was 22-of-34 for 295 yards with a touchdown and an interception. Ty'Son Williams ran 13 times for 95 yards after getting no carries for South Carolina in last week's loss to Kentucky.

For Louisiana Tech coach Skip Holtz, it was another shot at a big win that slipped away. The Bulldogs led Arkansas midway through the fourth quarter last year before losing 21-20 and lost to Kansas State 39-33 in triple overtime in 2015.

GAME CHANGER

With Louisiana Tech driving for points towards the end of the third quarter, JaMarcus King intercepted J'Mar Smith on South Carolina's three-yard line. That set up a 16-play, 97-yard drive that was capped by OrTre Smith's 28-yard touchdown pass from Bentley, cutting Louisiana Tech's lead to 13-7.

41 -- On South Carolina's final drive, Jake Bentley hit Bryan Edwards with a 41-yard pass down to the Louisiana Tech 14-yard line. That pass completion set up Parker White's game-winning 31-yard field goal with four seconds remaining, giving the Gamecocks the one-point win.



Alaka led the way on defense for the Aggies, finishing with nine tackles, including five for losses and two sacks.

The Aggies took a 7-0 lead on a 1-yard touchdown run by Trayveon Williams early in the second quarter. South Carolina tied it up when Bentley wriggled out of a would-be sack and found Shi Smith wide open on a 45-yard touchdown pass to tie it at 7-all with about 13 minutes left in the second

The Gamecocks took a 10-7 lead on a 29-yard field goal by Parker White with about nine minutes left in the first half.

They had a chance to add to their lead when they were driving inside the 10-yard line late in the second quarter, but Bentley was sacked by Landis Durham, who caused a fumble which the Aggies recovered to end the drive.

In the third quarter with South Carolina up, 17-7, the Carolina defense held Texas A&M to a three-and-out and had the ball with 7:31 left. The Gamecocks went three-and-out on their next drive while Texas A&M answered with a field goal. Texas A&M scored touchdowns on its next two possessions to take the lead it would not relinquish.



edented night by South Carolina's defense may have rescued the Gamecocks season and sent Arkansas back down a familiar, discouraging path. The Gamecocks (4-2, 2-2 South-

COLUMBIA, S.C. — An unprec-

eastern) scored three touchdowns on defense - returning two interceptions and a fumble - in a 48-22 win over Arkansas (2-3, 0-2) on Saturday.

After a 75-yard touchdown drive by the Razorbacks tied it at 10 early in the second quarter, Arkansas gained just 48 yards in their next 18 plays. Those plays included an Austin Allen inter-



ception Skai Moore returned 34 yards for a TD and an Allen fumble that T.J. Brunson returned 74 yards for a score.

By the time the Razorbacks started moving the ball again, the Gamecocks led 41-10 in the fourth quarter.

"Everything disintegrated right in front of us," said Arkansas coach Brett Bielema, who will need three wins over five SEC teams he is a combined 8-15 against with the Razorbacks

South Carolina has no record of ever scoring three defensive touchdowns in the 125 years it has played football. Gamecocks coach Will Muschamp, known for his defensive mind, couldn't remember three touchdowns from his favorite unit in his career. And Brunson - he had never been in the end zone in all his football life, either.

"That was fun. I hope to get to do it again," Brunson said.

And all that defense helped build the confidence of an offense that had seen several shaky games but come through with two more wins than the halfway point in 2016. Jake Bentley went 16 of 31 for 199 yards and three touchdowns, including a critical 18-yard pass to Bryan Edwards in the corner of the end zone with four seconds in the first half.

Bentley spread the ball around to nine receivers as South Carolina beat a team from the SEC West for the first time since 2013.

The Gamecocks gained 358 yards, scoring on five of eight possessions in the final three quarters. Bentley was sacked just once, a week after the offense line allowed seven sacks in a loss to Texas A&M.

"It takes the pressure off of us," Bentley said of the defense. "Their confidence is through the roof."

GAME CHANGER

With the game tied at 10 in the final minute of the first half, Jake Bentley hit Bryan Edwards with an 18-yard touchdown pass, giving the Gamecocks a 17-10 lead with four seconds remaining. South Carolina took a lead it would never relinquish heading into the halftime locker room.

KEY STAT

3 -- The South Carolina defense recorded three touchdowns for the first time in modern history. Skai Moore and Keisean Nixon each returned an interception for a score while T.J. Brunson had a 73-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown.



KNOXVILLE, TENN. — Parker White made all three of his field-goal attempts, including a a tiebreaking 21-yarder with 5:17 remaining, and South Carolina produced a goal-line stand Saturday in the closing seconds of a 15-9 victory over Tennessee.

After being completely shut down the entire second half, Tennessee's offense reached South Carolina's 2-yard line with nine seconds left before Jarrett Guarantano threw three straight incompletions to close the game. The game ended on a pass intended for Brandon Johnson in the right corner of the end zone.



Tennessee (3-3, 0-3 SEC) hasn't scored a touchdown in its last 10 quarters and settled for field goals after having first-and-goal on two separate drives in the first half.

White, who had been 4 of 11 on field-goal attempts before Saturday, made his tiebreaking 21-yarder in the fourth quarter plus a 36-yarder with 1:13 left. White also had a 47-yard field goal in the second quarter.

The comeback continued Muschamp's mastery of Tennessee.

Muschamp, who coached Florida from 2011-14, now owns a career record of 6-0 against Tennessee and a 4-0 mark against Jones.

The Volunteers gave Guarantano his first career start but still couldn't awaken their dormant offense. Guarantano went 11 of 18 for 133 yards and was sacked seven times. He had 17 carries for minus-2 net yards.

South Carolina (5-2, 3-2) scored on each of its last three drives.

The Gamecocks appeared ready to take the lead when A.J. Turner's 20-yard touchdown run around the right end tied the game at 9-all with 1:02 left in the third quarter. But on the ensuing extra-point attempt, holder Danny Gordon mishandled a low snap. Gordon threw an incomplete pass that prevented South Carolina from grabbing a 10-9 lead.

South Carolina pulled ahead for good on its next possession with a 16play, 72-yard drive that lasted over nine minutes.

Tennessee grabbed a 9-3 halftime lead after Brent Cimaglia made field goals from 29, 33 and 24 yards out.

GAME CHANGER

Tennessee's offense attacked the red zone four times in the game, but came away with only three first-half field goals. The South Carolina defense held the Volunteers to just 253 total yards, a season best for the Gamecocks defense. The game ended with Tennessee at the South Carolina 2-yard line but a pair of incomplete passes gave the Gamecocks their fifth win of the season.

86 — A.J. Turner entered the game with 60 yards rushing but more than doubled that in the win over the Volunteers. Turner ran 14 times for 86 yards and the touchdown that tied the game at nine in the third quarter. Turner's rushing also helped chew the clock as South Carolina had the ball for 12:22 in the fourth quarter.
