

Nine 'Dores to Play in Second Bowl

When the Commodores and Bearcats square off in the 53rd Liberty Bowl, nine Vanderbilt players will earn the distinction of becoming the first football letterwinners in team history to ever make multiple post-season bowl appearances.

The nine, all active contributors on the 2011 squad, saw action in the 2008 Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl, which the Commodores captured over Boston College 16-14.

The nine players are:

- Brandon Barden, R-Sr., TE
- Tim Fugger, R-Sr., DE
- Casey Hayward, Sr., DB
- Sean Richardson, Sr., safety
- Udom Umoh, R-Sr., WR
- Kyle Fischer, R-Sr., OL
- T.J. Greenstone, R-Sr., DT
- Chris Marve, R-Sr., LB
- Larry Smith, R-Sr., QB

Several of the current Commodores played pivotal roles in the Music City Bowl win.

It marked the first career quarterback start for Smith. Marve started at inside linebacker, finishing with a team-high 10 tackles. Richardson made one of the biggest plays of the game, recovering a fumbled punt for a touchdown. Hayward played much of the game at cornerback in place of an injured **D.J. Moore**. Umoh posted the first three catches of his career.

Vanderbilt Defense Produces Points, Records

The Vanderbilt defense has produced a team-record four defensive touchdowns this season. Along the way, the Commodores also broke two other team marks for interception returns.

The fourth score came Nov. 19 when **Archibald Barnes** (R-Jr., LB) went 100 yards after intercepting a pass at Tennessee. Barnes' return ranks as the longest in team history.

Early in the year, **Trey Wilson** (Jr., CB) scored on interception returns of 21 and 52 yards against Elon and Ole Miss, respectively, and **Casey Hayward** (Sr., CB) returned a pick 50 yards for a TD against Connecticut. It marked the first time in modern history that Vanderbilt scored TDs on INT returns in three straight games.

The Vanderbilt defense also has established a new team record for total interception return yardage in a single season. The Commodores returned 17 interceptions for 395 yards, an average of 23.2 yards per return.

defeated No. 24 Boston College 16-14 in the 2008 Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl.

The Commodores are 2-1-1 all-time in postseason bowls. Victories have come in the 2008 Music City Bowl and 1955 Gator Bowl (25-13 over Auburn). Vanderbilt also tied Texas Tech in the 1974 Peach Bowl and lost in a high-scoring affair to Air Force in the 1982 Hall of Fame Bowl.

In accepting the AutoZone Liberty Bowl bid, James Franklin becomes the first new coach to ever guide the Commodores into postseason play. His six-win total also represents the most victories by a first-year Vanderbilt head coach in 36 years.

Four Standouts Earn All-SEC Recognition

Four Vanderbilt standouts – **Zac Stacy** (Jr., RB), **Chris Marve** (R-Sr., LB), **Casey Hayward** (Sr., DB) and **Tim Fugger** (R-Sr., DE)— were named to the Coaches' All-SEC Team Dec. 6.

One day earlier, Stacy, Marve and Hayward were named All-SEC by AP writers. Stacy, a junior from Centreville, Ala., was named to the second team All-SEC offense. Marve, a senior from Memphis, Hayward, a senior from Perry, Ga., and Fugger, a senior from Oak Brook, Ill., were placed on the second team defense.

The quartet played vital roles as the Commodores enjoyed one of the nation's top turnarounds.

Marve is a three-year starter who will be returning to his hometown for the AutoZone Liberty Bowl. As a senior, he topped the Commodores and ranked 13th in the SEC with 84 tackles. He also ranks ninth all-time at Vanderbilt with 390 career tackles and eighth with 28.0 career tackles for loss.

Fugger became a big defensive playmaker this season, contributing 12 tackles for loss and 6.5 sacks. He ranked eighth in the SEC in both categories.

Stacy enjoyed one of the finest offensive seasons ever by a Vandy back. The junior broke the team's single-season record with 1,136 rushing yards and scored 13 rushing TDs, the most ever by a Commodore running back.

Hayward ranks third in the SEC with five interceptions and second in the league with 14 passes defended. He enters the bowl with 13 career interceptions, just two behind Leonard Coleman's (1980-83) school record.

Sports Illustrated Features 'Dores

Even before he directed the Commodores on the field for the first time, new Head Coach **James Franklin** was working to attract national media attention for the Vanderbilt program.

Sports Illustrated, given rare behind-the-scenes access during preseason camp, published a lengthy feature on the team just as Franklin's Commodores were reeling off three straights wins to open the year.

SI staff writer Michael Rosenberg attended Southeastern Conference Media Days, then spent three days on campus during camp doing research for the in-depth look at Franklin's vision to improve the Vanderbilt program.

Franklin's First Year: Vast Statistical Improvement

Statistics reveal the same fact that Vanderbilt's 6-6 win-loss record shows: the 2011 Commodores are a vastly improved team over the 2010 squad.

In addition to a four-game improvement in the regular season record, first-year Head Coach James Franklin has the Commodores performing at a higher level than the 2010 squad in virtually every area.

In a regular season comparison of the 2010 and 2011 teams, the current edition scored more points (26.9-16.9), allowed less points (20.8-31.2), produced more first downs (17.4-15.0), gave up fewer first downs (17.8-19.9), scored more rushing TDs (24-13) and red zone TD (23-14), and allowed fewer red-zone TDs (16-29).

The 2011 offense and defense are greatly improved. The offense has produced more total yards (44.6), rushing yards (28.8) and passing yards (15.8). The 2011 defense has given up nearly 100 fewer total yards (94.6), including 70 less rush yards (70) and 24.6 less passing yards.

The team is also improved in all rushing categories. The offense is averaging more yards per rush attempt (4.1-4-0). The 1.1-yard defensive improvement in yards per attempt (3.4-4.5) is one of the team's most impressive statistics.

The overall improvement has resulted in nearly a three-minute gain in time of possession.

The 2011 defense also has eight more interceptions, helping the team to improve in turnover margin (+6).

Vanderbilt Point Production At Near-Record Levels

The Commodore offense is on pace to produce more points than any Vanderbilt offense since World War II.

The 2011 unit, under the direction of first-year coordinator **John Donovan**, has scored 323 points, just five fewer points than in 1948. Prior to Red Sanders' 1948 squad, the most explosive Commodore offense dates back to the 9-1 Dan McGugin squad of 1915 that racked up 514 points.

This is just the third Vanderbilt team since the 1920s to score more than 300 points.

The Commodores are averaging 26.9 points, ranking third in the post-World War II era: 1948 (29.8) and 2005 (27.2).

Highest Point Totals

Since midseason, Vanderbilt's offense has scored consistently, averaging 31.5 points during its last seven games. The unit also has scored at least 21 points in its last seven games, marking the first time a Commodore offense has done so since the 1948 season.

In the defensive-oriented Southeastern Conference, the offense is averaging 21.1 points, a 10.8-point improvement from one year ago.

Vanderbilt earned its first undefeated campaign in non-Southeastern Conference play in 12 years when it finished 4-0 this year against non-SEC opponents.


The Commodores ended the season with a convincing 41-7 victory at Wake Forest, its final non-conference foe. Earlier, Vanderbilt topped Elon (45-14, Sept. 3), UConn (24-21, Sept. 10) and Army (44-21, Oct. 22).

In the last decade, Vanderbilt sports a 19-15 record against non-conference opponents.

Franklin Accomplishment: First to Guide Initial Vanderbilt Squad to Postseason

James Franklin, the 27th head coach in Vanderbilt history, became the first coach to guide his initial Commodore squad to a postseason bowl game.

Franklin also became the first new Vandy coach to register six wins since Fred Pancoast earned seven victories in 1975.

Franklin also became the first new coach at Vanderbilt to claim victories in his first three games since E.H. Alley accomplished the feat in 1943. Before Alley's achievement, the last new coach to duplicate Franklin's 3-0 mark was Dan McGugin in 1904.

Franklin guided Vanderbilt to a 45-14 victory over Elon on Sept. 3, a 24-21 comefrom-behind win over Connecticut on Sept. 10, and an impressive 30-7 victory over Ole Miss on Sept. 17 to open the season.

Kyle Fischer Off. Lineman of the Week, Nov. 26 (Wake Forest)

Kyle Fischer (R-Sr., RT) was recognized as SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week for his strong play in the Commodores' 41-7 win at Wake Forest.

The offensive co-captain from Columbia, S.C., continuously opened holes in the Deacs' defensive line, helping the 'Dores produce 297 rushing yards and four rushing TDs. **Zac Stacy** (Jr., RB) had 184 rushing yards and three TDs in becoming the team's all-time single-season rusher.

Zac Stacy Off. Player of the Week, Nov. 12 (Kentucky)

Zac Stacy (Jr., RB) earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors for his stellar rushing performance in Vanderbilt's 38-8 victory over Kentucky. Stacy rushed for 135 yards and three TDs against the Wildcats.

Stacy became the first Vanderbilt running back to win the SEC's top offensive player award since Corey Harris was honored on Oct. 19, 1991 after a 169-yard rushing performance against Georgia.

Ryan Seymour Off. Lineman of the Week, Oct. 24 (Army)

Ryan Seymour (R-Jr., LG) was recognized as the SEC's Offensive Lineman of the Week for his strong play in a 44-21 win over Army. Seymour's blocks helped pave the way for a season-high 530 yards and 344 rushing yards. Of the rushing yards, **Zac Stacy** (Jr., RB) gained 198 of them. Stacy's total was the third-highest rushing total in school history by a Vanderbilt player.

Trey Wilson Def. Player of the Week, Sept. 17 (Ole Miss) Wesley Johnson Off. Lineman of the Week, Sept. 17 (Ole Miss)

Trey Wilson (Jr., CB) and **Wesley Johnson** (R-So., center) were named SEC Defensive Player and Offensive Lineman of the Week, respectively, for their efforts in Vanderbilt's 30-7 victory over Ole Miss.

Wilson picked off two Rebel passes, returning one for a 52-yard TD. He also contributed three passes defended. It also was Wilson's second INT return for a TD, matching a school record.

Johnson anchored an offensive line effort that helped produce 281 rushing yards for the Commodores. It was the team's highest rushing total against an SEC opponent since 1994.

Rob Lohr Def. Lineman of the Week, Sept. 10 (Connecticut)

Rob Lohr (R-Jr., DT) earned SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors for his effort in Vanderbilt's 24-21 victory over Connecticut. Lohr contributed four tackles for loss in the victory, tying for the most by a Vandy defender since linebacker **Jamie Winborn** contributed five tackles resulting in losses during a 43-20 against No. 6 Florida on Nov. 4, 2000.

Three Vanderbilt student-athletes, including two-time team captain **Chris Marve**, are returning to their hometown for the AutoZone Liberty Bowl. A fourth player hails from a community near the Bluff City.

Marve is joined by two other residents of the Memphis area on the Vanderbilt roster: **DeAndre Jones** (R-Jr., LB) and **Spencer Pulley** (Sr., OL). **James Lewis** (Fr., OL) comes from Arlington, Tenn., just north of Memphis.

Marve, a fifth-year linebacker and the SEC's active career tackles leader, is a graduate of White Station High School in Memphis. As a prep senior, Marve earned Tennessee 5A Mr. Football Lineman of the Year honors, the first such winner from White Station. He helped guide the Spartans to a 12-2 record and the 5A state semifinals as a senior.

Jones prepped at Memphis University School, teaming with former Commodore teammate **John Stokes** to form a superb linebacker tandem at MUS. Jones was a 2007 finalist for the Division II-AA Mr. Football Lineman of the Year Award. Pulley captured the Division II-A Mr. Football Lineman of the Year Award as a standout at Evangelical Christian. Lewis has not played as a true freshman.

Vandy Defensive Coach Worked at Memphis

Vanderbilt co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach **Brent Pry** served as a defensive assistant coach for three years at the University of Memphis.

Pry coached the Memphis defensive line from 2007-09, and helped guide the Tigers to appearances in the 2007 New Orleans Bowl and the 2008 St. Petersburg Bowl. His defensive fronts with the Tigers were regarded among the best in Conference USA.





Junior Zac Stacy Sets New Single-Season Rush Mark; Contributes 13 Rushing TDs to Successful Campaign

Zac Stacy (Jr., RB) is the new single-season rushing leader at Vanderbilt.

Stacy finished the regular season with 1,136 rushing yards, 33 more than the former mark set by **Corey Harris** in 1991.

Stacy also set a modern-day school record with 13 rushing touchdowns, one more than **Jamie O'Rourke** scored in 1974.

Stacy broke the single-season record during a 184-yard, 3-TD performance in the team's regular season finale at Wake Forest.

In early December, Stacy was rewarded for the outstanding season by getting named as a consensus All-Southeastern Conference running back.

The Wake Forest effort allowed Stacy to move up to No. 8 on the team's career rushing list. He has 1,945 rushing yards and 19 TDs on 356 career carries.

Stacy is averaging 121.7 rushing yards over his last seven games. He scored 12 rushing TDs during the seven-game stretch.

Stacy also became the first 'Dore running back in two decades to earn SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors following a 135-yard, 3-TD performance vs. Kentucky on Nov. 12.

Franklin, Donovan, Galt, Griffin and Banks served together at Maryland under Head Coach Ralph Friedgen.

Banks coached the Terp secondary in 2006 and inside linebackers from 2003-05. Franklin served with Banks in 2003-04 as Maryland's recruiting coordinator and wide receivers coach. Donovan coached Maryland running backs in 2005 and quarterbacks in 2006. Galt directed the strength and conditioning effort for Maryland football while Banks served on the Terp staff. Griffin served as Maryland's assistant recruiting coordinator in 2006.

Hand Worked With UC Head Coach

Vanderbilt offensive line coach **Herb Hand** and Cincinnati Head Coach **Butch Jones** were members of the West Virginia offensive staff in 2005-06.

With Hand coaching tight ends and Jones mentoring wide receivers, the Mountaineers recorded back-to-back 11-win campaigns, earned a pair of top-10 national rankings. West Virginia also notched victories in the Sugar Bowl and Gator Bowl during those years.

Beatty, UC's Johnson Coach Ties

Prior to joining the Franklin staff this year, Vanderbilt offensive recruiting coordinator/wide receivers coach **Chris Beatty** served three years at West Virginia with current Cincinnati tight ends coach **Dave Johnson**.

Beatty coached running backs, slot receivers and directed the recruiting effort as a WVU coach from 2008-10. Johnson served the same three years as the Mountaineers' offensive line coach.

Prep Teammates Facing Off

Two Commodores will face prep teammates when the Commodores and Bearcats meet in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl.

- Andrew Bridges (R-Fr., OT) was a teammate at Westminister School in Atlanta with Cincinnati's Ralph David Abernathy IV (Fr., RB).
- John Townsley (Jr., QB) and Cincinnati's Blake Annen (R-So.) were teammates at Upper Arlington (Ohio) H.S. Townsley is a first-year walk-on.

Smith Reaches Milestones


Larry Smith (R-Sr., QB) has surpassed three career passing milestones this season: 300 completions, 600 attempts and 3,000 yards.

Defensive Back Casey Hayward Earns All-America Recognition

Casey Hayward (Sr., DB) became the first Commodore in three years to garner All-America recognition when he was named to the second team defense by the prestigious Walter Camp Football Foundation on Dec. 7.

Hayward, a native of Perry, Ga., was also named as a Second Team All-America by both Yahoo! Sports and Rivals.com, and Third Team All-America by Phil Steele's.

Hayward is the first Commodore All-America since another defensive back, **D.J. Moore**, received widespread recognition in 2008.

Hayward and Moore are tied for second on Vanderbilt's alltime interceptions list. With 13 career picks, Hayward trails only Leonard Coleman, who

In early December, Hayward was named All-Southeastern Conference for the second consecutive year by coaches and sportwriters. He also was named as a midseason semifinalist for Jim Thorpe Award given annually to the nation's top defensive back.

Hayward ranks among the SEC and NCAA leaders this season with five interceptions and 14 passes defended. With 13 career interceptions, he is also the SEC's active career leader.

Hayward also has 40 solo tackles and 6.5 tackles for loss this year. He has amassed 190 career tackles.



All-SEC 'Backer Chris Marve Returns Home for Bowl; Co-Captain Ranks 9th Among Vandy Career Tacklers

Chris Marve, a three-time All-Southeastern Conference linebacker and two-year defensive co-captain, will play the final game of his Commodore career in his hometown.

Marve, a product of White Station High School, ranks among Vanderbilt's Top Ten career tacklers, and has a chance to become just the eighth Commodore to reach the 400-tackle plateau.

In early December, Marve was named second team All-SEC by both the Associated Press and league's 12 head coaches. It marked the third consecutive season that Marve received all-conference recognition.

This season, Marve topped the Vandy defense with 45 solo stops and 84 total tackles. He also produced seven tackles for loss, an interception, forced fumble and quarterback sack.

In Vanderbilt's regular season finale at Wake Forest, Marve had five tackles, passing former linebacker **Shelton Quarles** (1990-93) into ninth place on the career

Marve also has 28 tackles for loss for his career. He ranks eighth all-time on the team's tackles for loss chart, and will pass former standouts **Jamie Duncan** (1994-97) and **James Manley** (1992-95) with his next tackle for loss.

A captain for the past two years, Marve has achieved at least 80 tackles in each of his four seasons. He set a personal single-season career high as a sophomore, posting 121 total tackles. Marve also was a standout in his previous bowl appearance, contributing 10 tackles in Vanderbilt's 16-14 victory over Boston College in the 2008 Music City Bowl.

Just two weeks ago, Marve completed his undergraduate coursework, earning degrees in sociology and Human & Organizational Development. After his football career concludes, the 2011 Lott Impact Trophy semifinalist plans to attend law school.

The Commodores are 8-6 all-time in regular season games held in Memphis, and 2-4 in six appearances at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium.

Records indicate that Vanderbilt have played games in four venues in Memphis: Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium opened in 1965, Crump Stadium opened in the mid-1930s, and two venues that do not remain: Red Elm Park and Billings Park.

Rodgers Effective As Commodores' Starting Quarterback

Jordan Rodgers (R-Jr, QB) has been effective since being inserted as the Commodore starting quarterback at midseason.

In six career starts, Rodgers has accounted for 12 TDs – eight passing and four rushing.

Since the starts, Rodgers has been one of the Southeastern Conference leaders in passing yards (208.7 ypg) and total offense (259.2 ypg).

Rodgers also has thrown for 1,498 yards, the most of any first-year Vanderbilt starting quarterback. He has also thrown at least one touchdown in every start, becoming the first

In the bowl-clinching victory at Wake Forest, Rodgers was 7-of-15 for 139 yards and a TD. He also hurt the Demon Deacons by rushing for 90 yards on 16 carries.

Rodgers' 297 passing yards at Florida was the most by a Commodore since **Chris Nickson** threw for 446 yards vs. Kentucky on Nov. 11, 2006.

In addition to ranking among NCAA leaders with 17 interceptions (T-12th in NCAA), the veteran-laden unit ranks high nationally in several statistical categories, including total defense, rushing defense and passing efficiency.

The defense has limited opponents to 20.8 ppg (27th in the NCAA) and just 324.6 ypg (19th in NCAA). The unit also ranks high in rush defense (27th), defensive pass efficiency (22nd), first downs allowed (25th) and pass defense (33rd).

The Commodores have dialed up 17 offensive plays of 40 or more yards to pace the 12 conference teams. Arkansas and LSU are closest to the Commodores with 15 plays of at least 40 yards.

When reviewing stats for plays of at least 30 yards, Vanderbilt is tied with Arkansas for the SEC lead with 31 plays. Only one other team (Alabama, 29) is within eight of the Vanderbilt-Arkansas total.

The added big plays have resulted in a scoring average of 26.9 points, 10.0 points more than the team's 2010 scoring average.

The offense is producing more big plays via the rush and pass. The unit has 46 rushes of 12 yards or more, 12 more than a year ago. It also has produced 41 passes of 15 yards or more, five more than in 2010

Teammates Vote Fischer, Hayward, Marve, Smith, Spear as Team Captains

Kyle Fischer, Casey Hayward, Chris Marve, Larry Smith and **Carey Spear** were voted by teammates to serve as captains for the 2011 season.

Fischer (R-Sr., OT) and Smith (R-Sr., QB) serve on the offensive side; Hayward (Sr., CB) and Marve (R-Sr., LB) on defense; and Spear (So., PK) on special teams. Fischer, Hayward, Smith and Spear are first-time cocaptains. Marve served in the role last year.

FISCHER: A 37-game starter on the offensive line, Fischer embraced a greater leadership role this year. As a senior, he has moved to right tackle after playing guard, and has developed into one of the SEC's top linemen, earning honorable mention All-SEC recognition.

HAYWARD: The latest in a string of excellent Vandy defensive backs and the Commodores' newest All-America, Hayward has five interceptions this season and ranks among the SEC active leaders with 13 picks. The senior has started a team-high 36 consecutive games.



VANDERBILT 25 - AUBURN 13



JACKSONVILLE, Fla. - Still hurting from a dislocated right elbow suffered in the Tennessee game, quarterback Don Orr scored two touchdowns and set up another as the Commodores defeated No. 8-ranked Auburn in the 11th Gator

The Vandy defense provided a huge lift for the 'Dores, recovering five fumbles in the win.

Vanderbilt's first score was set up when Orr recovered an Auburn fumble. Eight plays later, Joe Stephenson ran seven yards for the VU TD.

Auburn answered on a 38-yard TD pass from Howell Tubbs to Rob James in the second quarter, but the rest of the game belonged to the Black and Gold. On Vanderbilt's following possession, Orr carried the ball 44 yards to the Tigers' 28. He then passed to Joe Scales, who advanced to the Auburn 4-yard line. On

the next play, Orr carried the ball over the line after a fake to fullback Phil King to give Vanderbilt a 13-7 lead at the half.

At the opening of the third quarter, Vanderbilt guard Sonny Tatum recovered an Auburn fumble, and the Commodores marched quickly into scoring position as Orr crossed the goal line for his second touchdown of the day to make the score 19-7. Both teams scored once more in the fourth quarter. Vanderbilt's score came on a oneyard run off right tackle by Charley Horton.

Vanderbilt coach Art Guepe cleared his bench in the final minutes, using 38 of the 39 men dressed for the game. Capitalizing on Auburn's five fumbles and using an ailing quarterback, the Commodores captured its first bowl appearance.



TEXAS TECH 6 - VANDERBILT 6



ATLANTA, Ga. - The 1974 Peach Bowl was a game with no champion but two winners, the Commodores and Texas Tech Red Raiders.

Despite the effective rushing of Red Raider tailback Larry Isaac and fullback Cliff Hoskins, the Commodore defense held Texas Tech without points in the first half and entered halftime with a 3-0 lead after Mark Adams kicked a 31-yard field goal with 10 minutes remaining.

Neither team was able to muster much offense in the third quarter, though Texas Tech did tie the score at 3-3 after a drive stalled at the Vanderbilt

Early in the fourth quarter, the Commodores' freshman lineman Dennis Harrison stopped a deep Texas Tech threat by blocking a Red Raider field goal attempt. The Tech drive started following one of two VU turnovers during the game.

After the blocked field goal, the Commodores responded with a possession that ended with Adams' second field goal of the day, a 26-yarder that resulted in a 6-3 Vanderbilt margin. However, Texas Tech tied the game at the 2:00 mark on a 35-yard field goal by Brian Hall. On its final drive, Vanderbilt could not move into scoring range.

The Commodore offense struggled much of the day, with quarterback David Lee hitting just five of 14 attempts. Running back Jamie O'Rourke had 76 rushing yards.

The limited offensive production from both teams resulted in numerous defensive and scoring records being set in the game.

Within hours of the conclusion, Vanderbilt Head Coach Steve Sloan announced he was leaving his position to accept the head coaching job at Texas Tech.



VANDERBILT 28 - AIR FORCE 36



BIRMINGHAM, Ala. – Without question, the Hall of Fame Bowl was one of college football's most exciting 1982 postseason games.

The game matched one of the nation's most potent aerial attacks featuring Vanderbilt All-SEC quarterback Whit Taylor and one of America's most devastating rushing attacks in the Falcons' vaunted option attack.

Offensively, this game lived up to the hype as 33 Hall of Fame records were broken and another eight were tied in Legion Field. Unfortunately for the Commodores, Air Force walked away the winner 36-28 after a remarkable fourth quarter comeback.

For three quarters, Whit Taylor was unstoppable. Connecting with a variety of wide receivers and running backs, Taylor's fourth touchdown pass of the game, a four-yarder to

Norman Jordan, gave the 'Dores a 28-17 margin entering the fourth quarter. Down by double digits, the Air Force Academy scored rushing TDs on three consecutive possessions to take the victory.

Taylor was named the Most Valuable Player, after completing a team-record 38 passes of 51 attempts for 452 yards, which remains as the second highest single-game passing yardage total in Vanderbilt history. Jordan's performance arguably was more remarkable. Though rushing for just four yards, Jordan hauled in 20 receptions for 173 yards and three touchdowns, breaking five Hall of Fame Bowl records.



NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Vanderbilt won a bowl game for the first time in exactly 53 years, with Bryant Hahnfeldt kicking a 45-yard field goal with 3:26 left for a 16-14 win over #24 Boston College in the Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl held on New Year's Eve in Nashville's LP Field.

The Commodores hadn't played in a bowl since 1982 – the SEC's longest drought. The victory gave Vanderbilt (7-6) its first winning season since that season. This is just the fourth time in the past 50 years that Vanderbilt has won seven games in a season.

The Eagles got the ball twice after Hahnfeldt's third field goal. They had to punt the first time, then Vanderbilt DB Myron Lewis picked off a pass with 1:36 left.

Vanderbilt scored its lone TD when freshman safety Sean Richardson fell on a Commodore

punt that bounced off the knee of BC's Paul Anderson with 10:35 left in the third quarter.

The 'Dores gave redshirt freshman Larry Smith his first career start at quarterback. Hahnfeldt, a Nashville product playing his final game as a Commodore, matched a single-game career high with the three field goals. The Commodores also forced two interceptions while allowing none.





JAMES FRANKLIN



In the span of 12 months, James Franklin has changed the culture of Commodore Football, raising expectations among followers that a Brand New Vanderbilt has arrived in Nashville.

Franklin's enthusiasm, passion and drive have left a strong statement that Vanderbilt Football is headed for lots of success in the future.

Named as the team's 27th head coach in team history last December, Franklin became the first new Commodore coach to guide his initial team into postseason play. His 6-6 Vanderbilt squad will face the 9-3 Cincinnati Bearcats in the 53rd AutoZone Liberty Bowl.

The Commodores are vastly improved under Franklin. Statistically, the Vanderbilt offense and defense rank as the most improved in the powerful Southeastern Conference. The offense tallied more points than any Vanderbilt unit in 50 years. The improvement on defense has been even more pronounced, as it ranks among the nation's Top 20 in total defense. They also are an exciting team to watch, offering an array of trick plays to the delight of fans.

Upon arriving on campus, Franklin promised to reverse the football fortunes on West End. He immediately began changing expectations among players and support staff, inspiring a championship mentality within the entire Vanderbilt Football community.

Around campus and in Nashville, Franklin enthusiastically promoted his squad. Franklin draws attention to the Vanderbilt program in various ways, whether speaking before civic groups or producing must-see YouTube videos for public consumption. He also provides rare insider experience, such as allowing remarkable fifth-grader Andrew Kittrell to lead the Commodores onto the field against Connecticut.

Franklin's impact was immediate. The offseason conditioning program guided by Dwight Galt, a former Franklin associate at Maryland, was a huge success in building as much team chemistry as it did individual strength. Franklin's positive message grew interest in the team's spring practices, and helped attract the largest crowd in years to the team's Black & Gold Spring Game.

While the Commodores opened the season with a convincing 45-14 victory over outmanned Elon, a series of events late in the Connecticut game brought the Commodores even closer together. Seeing a lack of energy

with his team trailing 21-14 in the fourth quarter, an emotional Franklin rallied his squad, telling all that this Vanderbilt football team was different from the others. Within minutes, cornerback Casey Hayward returned an interception 50 yards for a touchdown, and Carey Spear capped the comeback with a 31-yard field goal to give the program its first big win in two full seasons.

Franklin's reaction after a bitter 33-28 midseason defeat to SEC East rival Georgia drew more admiration from Commodore fans.

"We're going to compete with class," Franklin said at the post-game press conference. "But we are not going to sit back and take stuff from anybody. Those days are long gone and never coming back. Ever!"

The Commodores seemed to take momentum from the Georgia disappointment. They had a chance to win all six games afterward, and outscored those opponents 193-117. Vanderbilt defeated Kentucky 38-8, the widest margin over an SEC team in 40 years, and thrashed Wake Forest 41-7 on the road to claim bowl eligibility. The Commodores' three late-losses in conference play came by a total of 14 points.







Franklin and Tampa Bay Bucs Head Coach Raheem Morris. The two served as coordinators at Kansas State in 2006.

Franklin's first Vanderbilt team notched four more victories than the 2009 and 2010 Commodore teams. They recorded five home wins, the most by a Commodore squad since the mid-1990s. They also outscored their opponents by 73 points, a remarkable 244-point improvement over the previous year. The point differential by the Commodores is the largest since 1974.

Several Vanderbilt players enjoyed tremendous seasons during Franklin's first year on campus. Stacy put together the finest rushing season in Commodore history, setting a team single-season record of 1,136 yards. He also rushed for 13 touchdowns, the highest total in modern-day team history. Rodgers passed for 1,498 yards – the most ever by a first-year Vanderbilt quarterback - and tossed nine touchdowns, including at least one in the last six games. Sophomore Jordan Matthews blossomed as Rodgers' top target, averaging 121 receiving yards during the final five games. Another young

receiver. Chris Boyd, topped all SEC freshmen with seven touchdown catches.

The offensive line jelled despite a rash of injuries. Three linemen -Wesley Johnson, Ryan Seymour and Kyle Fischer earned weekly honors from the SFC.

On defense, Hayward, linebacker Chris Marve and defensive end Tim Fugger earned All-conference recognition.

The unit made tremendous strides over the previous year, jumping from 93rd in the nation to 19th in total defense by

averaging nearly 94.6 less yards per game. They also owned the line of scrimmage, limiting opponents to just 123 rushing yards. The defense also earned a reputation for scoring points off turnovers, returning a schoolrecord four interceptions for touchdowns.

After the team's victory at Wake Forest, Vanderbilt's administration committed to Franklin on a long-term basis, extending his contract with a pay raise and promising a series of program upgrades, including adding an indoor practice facility, new jumbotron and meeting rooms.

FRANKLIN'S FIRST YEAR AT VANDERBILT: BUILDING A WINNER AND CREATING FAN INTEREST



FRANKLIN INTRODUCED IN NASHVILLE ★ Dec. 17, 2010

James Franklin is introduced as Vanderbilt's 27th head football coach in a press conference held in the Board of Trust Room at Sarratt Student Center. At 39, the former assistant head coach/offensive coordinator at Maryland becomes the youngest Vandy head coach in nearly two decades.

FRANKLIN: "It's time that this football program starts reflecting everything else on this campus, and that's a commitment to excellence. There's going to be high expectations from day one. There is no part of this program that will settle. Everything we do will be about championships."

FRANKLIN ANNOUNCES OFFENSIVE STAFF ★ Jan. 13, 2011

The head coach announces the hirings of his offensive coaches, including new coordinator John Donovan, and Dwight Galt, the man who will guide the Commodores' conditioning program. He also names key administrators in the football office.

FRANKLIN: "We're really laying the foundation right now with the offensive staff, the administrative staff, the strength coach, to put together what my focus is on, which is to build the best staff in the country. When I say that, I'm talking about people that are passionate about being at Vanderbilt."

FRANKLIN INTRODUCED AT BASKETBALL GAME ★ Jan. 20, 2011

Franklin takes the floor during halftime of the men's basketball game against Ole Miss in Memorial Gymnasium, asking students and fans for their support for the football team in the coming months.

FRANKLIN: "We have a plan; we have a vision for what this program could be, but we can't do it alone. We need everybody's support. We need this community, we need this campus to come together and unite more than it ever has before."

FRANKLIN NAMES DEFENSIVE STAFF ★ Jan. 31, 2011

Four defensive coaches are named to fill out Franklin's staff: defensive coordinator and safeties coach Bob Shoop, linebackers coach and co-defensive coordinator Brent Pry, secondary coach Wes McGriff and defensive line coach Sean Spencer.

NATIONAL SIGNING DAY ★ Feb. 2, 2011

Fueled by a strong finish to recruiting, Franklin lands 21 signees coming from 13 states. The class, which includes a pair of 4-star prospects, is regarded as Vanderbilt's most talented class in years.

FRANKLIN TO AUDIENCE OF FANS: "Basically, this staff was not going to take 'no' for an answer. We told every recruit that. We would go into their homes and tell them reasons they should come and tell their family. In the end, we would look them in the eye and tell them we weren't taking 'no' for an answer and they were coming to Vanderbilt."

FRANKLIN STAGES STUDENT TRYOUTS ★ Feb. 15, 2011

After visiting dorms and fraternity row, Franklin personally conducts tryouts for the Vanderbilt student body to make the team's spring roster. Seventeen students participated in the tryouts. Eventually, six students would join the team for spring drills.



FRANKLIN GUIDES SPRING DRILLS ★ March 18, 2011

Franklin oversees his first spring practice as head coach at the John Rich Practice Facility on campus. During the ensuing 14 practices, Franklin puts his stamp on the Commodore program: upbeat, energetic, disciplined, physical and positive.

THOUSANDS ATTEND SPRING GAME ★ April 17, 2011



The 'Dores conclude a month of drills with the Black and Gold Spring Game in Vanderbilt Stadium. The Black Team comes away with a 19-7 victory in front of a large and enthusiastic crowd. It marks the first spring intrasquad game on campus in more than 10 years. A fireworks display caps the spring finale.

GETS 'DORES OFF RIGHT WITH 3-0 START ★ September 2011

Donovan's offense has been a big hit at Vanderbilt, a school that has struggled with point production in recent years.

The former Maryland offensive coach accepted the offensive coordinator position when former Terp assistant James Franklin was named Vanderbilt head coach last December.

Since arriving on campus, Donovan has developed a balanced attack featuring the rushing ability of junior Zac Stacy, and passing game of

Jordan Rodgers targetting young receivers Jordan Matthews, Chris Boyd and Jonathan Krause.

The youthful unit produced points and yards in abundance. The offense scored more total points than any Commodore team since 1948. It averaged

In addition to coordinating the Commodore offense, Donovan has mentored Zac Stacy to the most impressive single-season rushing performance in team history. The second team All-SEC selection broke team records with 1,136 rushing yards and 13 touchdowns.

10 points more this year than in 2010. The unit's 26.9-point average ranks as Vanderbilt's highest since Jay Cutler's senior campaign in 2005. Since midseason, the offense has been extremely consistent, scoring at least 21 points in its last seven outings.

The offense is averaging 342.8 yards of total offense, the highest average by a Commodore unit in five years. Donovan's offense surpassed the 2010 Vanderbilt unit in every key statistical category, producing 28.8 more rushing yards and 15.8 additional passing yards. The offense produced 14 more toucdowns than in 2010, ranked among the SEC's best in explosive plays, and helped the Commodores finish with nearly a three-minute improvement in time of possession.



Def. Coordinator-Safeties 1st vear on Vanderbilt staff

Shoop's first defense at Vanderbilt enjoyed a remarkable turnaround in 2011, jumping from 93rd in the NCAA to 19th in total defense. The one-year difference was staggering: in 2010, the Commodores ranked 10th or worse among SEC teams in virtually every defensive statistic; this season, Vanderbilt ranked seventh or better

in 12 of 13 top defensive stat categories. This year, the 'Dores defense allowed 10.4 fewer points and 94.6 less yards than in 2010.

By limiting foes to a 20.8-point average, the Commodores jumped from 94th in scoring defense to 27th in 2011. The rush defense ranked fourth

in the SEC, allowing 70 yards less yards a game than one year ago and holding opposing rushers to just a paltry 3.4-yard average. The unit nabbed 17 interceptions, eight more than the previous season, helping the Commodores to a plus-6 improvement in

turnover margin. The defense was especially effective limiting rushing touchdowns (3rd in the SEC with 10 TDs) and first downs (17.8 per game), and getting quarterback sacks (24, 5th in the SEC).

Shoop's aggressive, attacking defense was paced by a trio of senior All-SEC performers: defensive back Casey Hayward, linebacker Chris Marve, defensive end Tim Fugger. Hayward also earned second team All-America honors from the Walter Camp Foundation, Yahoo! Sports and Rivals.com.

The unit held three BCS-level teams - Ole Miss, Kentucky and Wake Forest – to no more than a touchdown.

After working alongside James Franklin in Maryland for the past two seasons, Bankins brought his expertise in special teams and tight ends play to the Vanderbilt campus.

Bankins' special teams lived up to Franklin's promise of quality play from the third phrase of football, and helped spark Vanderbilt's 6-6 regular season.

The Commdoores' kickoff returns and net punting ranked among the top five in the SEC. The Commodores were splendid in punt and kickoff coverage. In a midseason conference game against Georgia, a 96-yard kickoff return for a TD and blocked punt nearly provided the Commodores victory over the nationally-ranked Bulldogs.

Bankins' special team schemes made fourth downs fun to watch.

Vanderbilt converted multiple fakes on fourth down, including a unique punter-to-snapper pass that converted a fourthand-long situation.



The only coach rehired from the former staff, Hand did a remarkable job molding a undersized offensive line corps.

Hand innovatively dealt with the lack of roster spots along the offensive line. During the summer, Hand made his boldest move, switching three

returning starters to new positions. The moves – senior Kyle Fischer from guard to tackle, junior Ryan Seymour from tackle to guard, and

sophomore Wesley Johnson from tackle to center – gave Hand the versatility he needed to get the most out of his corps. Throughout $\,$

the season, Hand's ability to adapt to key injuries allowed the Commodore offense to gain confidence and produce better results.

The improved line helped Vanderbilt add 28.8 yards to its 2010 rushing average. It also did a better job of protecting the quarterback, allowing 11 fewer sacks.

Hand's coaching job with an underappreciated and inexperienced offensive front didn't go unnoticed. The three players that switched positions with Hand's encouragement also were rewarded for making a decision for the good of the entire team. All three enjoyed the distinction of earning SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week honors after an outstanding individual performance.

Def. Recruiting Coordinator•DBs 1st year on Vanderbilt staff

McGriff's collection of defensive backs looked to create turnovers and big plays. They succeeded on both fronts.

Vanderbilt defensive backs contributed 10 interceptions, three returns for touchdowns, seven tackles behind the line of scrimmage and nearly 20 pass breakups.

From the opening game, McGriff's pupils made game-deciding plays. Junior cornerback Trey Wilson returned picks for touchdowns in wins over Elon and Ole Miss while senior Casey Hayward repeated the trick against Connecticut. It marked the first time in team history that Vanderbilt returned interceptions for touchdowns in three consecutive games.

Hayward finished the season with five interceptions, ranking fourth in the SEC. After the regular season, Hayward earned All-America recognition from several sources, including the Walter Camp Foundation and Rivals.com.

Wilson put together his finest year, finishing

with career highs in interceptions (3), passes defended (10) and total tackles (29).

McGriff also received valuable contributions from Andre Hal, Steven Clarke and Eddie Foster among others.

McGriff's defensive backs started strong and stayed that way for much of the season. His top pupil, senior Casey Hayward, earned All-America recognition after nabbing five interceptions, running his career total to a SEC-high 13. Co-Defensive Coordinator•LBs 1st year on Vanderbilt staff

Like Shoop, Pry accepted James Franklin's offer to move from Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) power Georgia Southern to join the Commodore defensive staff. And like Shoop, Pry made the most of the opportunity.

Charged with coaching a linebacking corps of inexperienced prospects surrounding multiple All-Southeastern Conference pick Chris Marve, Pry molded the group into an efficient and effective unit.

The linebackers were vital to the Commodores' improvement in

virtually every statistical category. The defense soared in SEC and NCAA rankings, finishing the regular season 19th in total defense, 27th in scoring defense, and 27th in rush defense.

MORE ON PRY

Aside from two-year captain Chris Marve returning at middle linebacker, Pry mentored three inexperienced prospects into productive roles as starting linebackers.

Pry's pupils stepped forward from the season opener. Marve earned All-SEC honors for the third straight year after leading the squad with 84 tackles. Tristan Strong, Chase Garnham and Archibald Barnes made immediate impacts when inserted into the starting lineup.

Rahne worked with two quarterbacks during the season, Larry Smith and Jordan Rodgers, and directed the development of a trio of true freshman prospects.

Both Smith and Rodgers had success under Rahne. Smith increased

2011 GAME RECAP

Franklin showed his willingness to gamble with the team considered the worst in the Southeastern Conference, going for it on fourth down three times to keep drives alive scoring 17 points. Smith

GAME 1 SEPT. 3, 2011 NASHVILLE converted the second on fourth-and-3, running 16 yards for a TD.

The win snapped a seven-game skid for the Commodores who scored more points than they did in all but two games last

season. When Trey Wilson picked off a pass and ran it 21 yards for a TD after Smith's second score, Vandy had almost as many points in 14 seconds as the Commodores averaged (16.9) per game in 2010.


Elon outgained the Commodores 323-309 in total offense and held the ball for more than 35 minutes. But Vanderbilt forced three turnovers and turned each of them into touchdowns.

PLAY OF THE GAME

An offensive explosion in the fourth quarter put the game out of reach for the Commodores. Two touchdown passes from Larry Smith to Chris Boyd and a 23-yard run from Wesley Tate put the points on the board. For Boyd it was the first two receptions of his career.




Hayward didn't think McEntee would throw to his side of the field. When he did, Hayward took the ball and looked for the end zone.



COLUMBIA, S.C. – For the first time in his seven years at South Carolina, Steve Spurrier team is 4-0. But like most of his Gamecocks teams, he can't get the offense where he wants it.

No. 12 South Carolina (4-0, 2-0 Southeastern Conference) beat Vanderbilt 21-3. But Stephen Garcia threw four interceptions, Marcus Lattimore was held under 100 yards rushing and all-SEC

GAME 4 SEPT. 24, 2011 COLUMBIA, S.C. receiver Alshon Jeffery caught just two passes for 34 yards.

Spurrier had no problem admitting his defense bailed this one out. The Gamecocks held the Commodores (3-1, 1-1) to 77 yards and just five first downs. South Carolina

recovered two fumbles, both forced by freshman defensive end Jadeveon Clowney, and sacked Vanderbilt's quarterbacks six times. It was the fewest yards allowed by a South Carolina team since holding Wake Forest to 66 yards in November 1987.


But great defensive games are just a small comfort to Spurrier, a Heisman Trophy winning quarterback at Florida who then revamped offenses in the SEC as a coach at his alma mater, winning a national title and six SEC crowns with his Fun-and-Gun attack.



The Crimson Tide defense shows why it's one of the best in the nation holding the Commodores to 41 yards on the ground and 190 total yards on 43 plays.






The Commodores finished with a season-high 530 yards and a handle on the possibilities to come.





Turnovers Cost Vanderbilt Chance for Win in Tennessee

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. – Every time Vanderbilt came close to taking control against Tennessee, the Commodores somehow got in their own way as the Volunteers registered a 27-21 victory in overtime.

No Vanderbilt mistake was more damaging than an interception in overtime. Eric Gordon picked the pass off and ran 90 yards for the touchdown that gave the Volunteers the victory. The Commodores

had four turnovers to just two by Tennessee.



The officials didn't help Vanderbilt's cause. They first ruled Gordon's knee down but overturned their call on review, ending

Southeastern Conference Coordinator of Officials Steve Shaw said in a statement released more than two hours after the game ended that the play should not have been reviewed.

Had the play not been reviewed, Tennessee would have faced first down at the 25-yard line and would have needed just a field goal to win the game.


Vanderbilt's last four losses in league action have come by a total of 19 points.

Quarterback Jordan Rodgers had 229 total yards for the Commodores (6-6). Rodgers threw for 139 yards and one touchdown and ran for 90 more.

Stacy scored on runs of 1 and 20 yards in the second quarter as Vanderbilt built a 20-point halftime lead, then iced the win for Vanderbilt with his 40-yard TD run midway through the fourth quarter.

Larry Smith, the Commodores' former starting ΩB , also hit a 45-yard flanker option pass for a score, and Ryan Fowler made field goals of 33 and 30 yards, as Vanderbilt became bowl-eligible for the first time since 2008.

Tanner Price threw for 157 yards and one touchdown before coming out of the game late in the fourth quarter for the Demon Deacons (6-6), who had their lowest-scoring game of the season.

PLAY OF THE GAME

Brandon Barden's 73-yard touchdown reception was one of the highlights of the season. The TE hurdled a Wake Forest player and stiff armed another on his way to the Commodores' longest pass play since 2008.
