VANDERBILT-SC SERIES NOTES

- ★ After snapping a seven-game losing streak in 2007, Vanderbilt is seeking its third victory over South Carolina in its last four years.
- ★ The Commodores are 2-8 overall vs. the Gamecocks in Vanderbilt Stadium, and won the last encounter between the teams in Nashville (24-17 in 2008).

KEY GAMES IN THE SERIES

- ★ **2008** Playing before a sellout crowd and ESPN audience on Thursday night, the Commodores topped No. 24 South Carolina 24-17, notching their first victory over a ranked team in Vanderbilt Stadium since 1992.
- ★ **2007** Vanderbilt jumped out to an early double-digit lead and used a stiff defense to defeat the No. 6 Gamecocks in Columbia 17-6. **Mackenzi Adams** threw two TD passes in the first quarter to give the Commodores all the points they would need. The defense produced seven QB sacks and two interceptions by DB **D.J. Moore**.
- ★ **2005** Senior QB **Jay Cutler** and freshman WR **Earl Bennett** try to match Gamecock QB Blake Mitchell and freshman WR Sydney Rice pass for pass in a shootout decided in the final minute. Cutler passes for career-high 339 yards, leading Vanderbilt back from late 28-14 deficit. Bennett is remarkable, hauling in 16 passes for 204 yards.
- ★ **2003** Cutler turns in the best performance of his young career, throwing for 319 yards and three touchdowns in a 35-24 loss in Columbia. In the second half, Cutler hits on 19 of 22 passes.
- ★ **1999** In a game that featured little offense, Vanderbilt QB **Greg Zolman** connects with WR **Todd Yoder** on a four-yard TD pass, giving the Commodores a three-point cushion. Vanderbilt needed all the points, eventually winning 11-10 in Columbia.
- ★ **1998** A plunge by TB **Jared McGrath** in the fourth quarter gave Vanderbilt its first lead in a 17-14 Commodore victory. Zolman threw for 279 yards in the win.
- ★ **1993** QB **Ronnie Gordon** and TB **Jermaine Johnson** led a second half Commodore comeback that fell just short, as Vanderbilt dropped a 19-16 decision. Gordon scored a late touchdown while Johnson rushed for 121 yards.

THE 2009 VANDERBILT-SC GAME

Vanderbilt (10) at #24 So. Carolina (14) Williams-Brice Stadium (75,624) • Oct. 24, 2009 • ESPN

COLUMBIA, S.C. – Warren Norman had a 99-yard kickoff return for a touchdown and Vanderbilt carried a 10-7 lead into the fourth quarter, but could not hold on as No. 24 South Carolina used a 99-yard touchdown drive to defeat the Commodores 14-10 Saturday night at Williams-Brice Stadium.

The Commodores were hurt by a missed interception by safety Joel Caldwell late in the game that would have ended the Gamecock scoring threat.

The winning score was controversial, as a replay ruled that USC receiver Alshon Jeffery had a foot inbounds that resulted in a game-deciding, 43-yard touchdown catch in the fourth-quarter.

The reception provided the Gamecocks (6-2, 3-2 Southeastern Conference) the winning margin over Vanderbilt and broke a two-game losing streak to the Commodores (2-6, 0-5).

The Commodores got the ball one last time with 4:00 left and drove to South Carolina's 25. However, Commodore quarterback Larry Smith was called for intentional grounding on third down, then did not get close to the necessary yardage on fourth-and-32.

Smith was 16 of 33 for 132 yards. Besides his 99-yard touchdown return, Norman also contributed 83 rushing yards for the Commodores. Norman also became the first Commodore to ever return two kickoffs for scores.

VANDERBILT IN 2010: LOTS OF YOUTH

Looking for a quick description for Robbie Caldwell's first Vanderbilt squad? *Youthful* would work.

Five weeks into the season, the list of 'Dores seeing action features 21 sophomores, 11 redshirt freshmen and 13 true freshmen.

Only eight Commodore seniors have contributed this season.

FIFTEEN NEW STARTERS THIS YEAR

Fifteen Commodores – eight on defense, six on offense and one specialist – have enjoyed their first career starts this season.

Kennard Reeves (R-Sr., RB) earned his first career start in the Commodore offensive backfield against Eastern Michigan.

Besides Reeves, the following offensive players have made their first career starts this year: **Jabo Burrow** (R-So., OG), **Wesley Johnson** (R-Fr., LT), **Jonathan Krause** (Fr., WR), **Caleb Welchans** (R-So., OG-OT) and **Turner Wimberly** (R-Sr., WR).

Defensive players earning initial starts this year are **Archibald Barnes** (R-So., LB), **Nate Campbell** (R-Sr., LB), **Eddie Foster** (So., CB), **Jay Fullam** (R-Fr., safety), **Kenny Ladler** (Fr., safety), **Rob Lohr** (R-So., DT), **Colt Nichter** (R-So., DT) and **Trey Wilson** (So., CB).

Punter **Richard Kent** (R-So.) also is a first-year starter.

30 'DORES SEE FIRST COLLEGE ACTION

Thirty Commodores have played their first snaps this season.

THIRTEEN TRUE FRESHMEN SEE ACTION

Only six teams across the nation have played more true freshmen than Vanderbilt this year.

The Commodores have played 13 true freshmen, including C/OG **Logan Stewart** and DT **Jared Morse** who saw their first snap two weeks ago in Vanderbilt's win over Eastern Michigan.

Florida and Air Force lead the NCAA with 17 true freshmen contributors.

Besides Stewart and Morse, other contributing first-year players are **Karl Butler** (safety), **Steven Clarke** (DB), **Chase Garnham** (LB), **Andre Hal** (DB), **James Kittredge** (OC), **Jonathan Krause** (WR), **Kenny Ladler** (safety), **Fitz Lassing** (TE), **Jordan Matthews** (WR), **Andre Simmons** (safety) and **Carey Spear** (PK).

COACHES FROM PALMETTO STATE

Commodore head coach **Robbie Caldwell** is one of four Vanderbilt coaches with close family ties to South Carolina.

Caldwell is a native of Pageland, a rural community near the So.-No. Carolina border southeast of Charlotte, N.C.

After graduating from Pageland H.S., Caldwell went on to be a stand-out lineman at Furman, located in Greenville, S.C. His first coaching position was at Hanahan H.S. north of Charleston. He later coached eight years at Furman.

Three Commodore assistants – offensive coordinator/QB coach **Jimmy Kiser**, running backs mentor **Des Kitchings** and tight ends coach/special teams coordinator **Ted Cain** – are natives of the state.

- Cain is a native of Aiken, and graduate of Furman. He also served many years as an assistant coach for the Paladins. His son, Matt, is a third-year offensive assistant at Presbyterian College.

- Kiser is another with Furman ties, having played for the Paladins in the late 1970s. He is a native of Rock Hill.

- Kitchings, a native of Wagener, was a receiver/return specialist at Furman, and later served four years on the Paladin staff as an offensive assistant.

A fifth Commodore assistant, **Bruce Fowler**, also at Furman, then served many years as an assistant coach at the school.

Several other Commodore staffers have ties to the state. The team's director of operations, **Michael Hazel**, is a native of Easley. **Joey Orck**, the team's offensive graduate assistant,, is a native of Dutch Fork and former letterwinner at Presbyterian College.

CALDWELL, SC AD HAVE CLOSE TIES

Robbie Caldwell and South Carolina Athletics Director **Eric Hyman** also have a close relationship dating back 30 years.

Caldwell and Hyman were members of the same Furman coaching staff for several years in the late 1970s-early 80s under Paladin head coaches Art Baker and Dick Sheridan. Both earned master's degrees from Furman.

CALDWELL: FIRST-YEAR HEAD COACH

Robbie Caldwell, the 26th head coach in Vanderbilt football history, will be one of just 11 first-time head coaches in the NCAA FBS subdivision this season.

Caldwell, a veteran of more than three decades of collegiate coaching, was named to replace retiring Bobby Johnson on July 14.

Caldwell and Kentucky mentor Joker Phillips are the SEC's only first-time head coaches this year.

Besides Caldwell and Phillips, other first-time FCS head coaches are Sonny Dykes (La. Tech), Dan Enos (Central Michigan), Jimbo Fisher (Florida State), John "Doc" Holliday (Marshall), Mike MacIntyre (San Jose State), Larry Porter (Memphis), Jeff Quinn (Buffalo), Charlie Strong (Louisville) and Willie Taggart (Western Kentucky).

Caldwell has the most collegiate coaching experience of the 11 coaches, with Holliday having the second longest tenure.



COMMODORE NOTES

COMMODORE HOMECOMING RESULTS

Vanderbilt is 25-36-3 in its homecoming games since World War II. Vanderbilt has struggled in recent homecoming appearances. The squad has lost its last seven homecoming games, and are 1-9 in their last 10 games. The 'Dores last homecoming victory came against Connecticut in 2002.

Since WWII, Vanderbilt is 9-3 in homecoming encounters against teams not affiliated with the Southeastern Conference. The Commodores lost 37-27 to Navy (in 2003) in their last homecoming game against a non-SEC squad.

The Commodores are 16-31-4 against SEC homecoming foes, and have lost the last six homecoming outings against SEC teams. Its last homecoming win against an SEC opponent came in 1998 - a 17-14 decision over South Carolina.

HAND NEWEST COMMODORE COACH

Herb Hand, a veteran offensive coach with excellent credentials, is the newest Vanderbilt coach. Hired in early August, Hand serves as offensive line coach and is the first staff hire by Robbie Caldwell.

Hand came to Vanderbilt after three years at the University of Tulsa, a tenure that featured some of the NCAA's most productive offenses. As Tulsa's offensive coordinator, Hand directed 2007 and 2008 offenses that topped the nation. Tulsa's 2008 unit averaged 570 yards and 47 points. Hand also spent six successful years with the University of West Virginia's productive spread offense before going to Tulsa.

COMMODORES FROM SOUTH CAROLINA

Four Commodores, including a pair of starters, call South Carolina home.

Offensive guard **Kyle Fischer** (R-Jr., Spring Valley HS, Columbia) is expected to earn his 20th career starting assignment when the Commodores and Gamecocks face off.

Ryan Fowler (R-So., Eastside HS, Taylors) has started every game of his Commodore career as placekicker.

Two other Commodores are from the Palmetto state: DE **Terrial Brannon** (R-Sr., Broome H.S., Spartanburg) and **Logan Stewart** (Fr., OC/OG, Boiling Springs H.S., Boiling Springs). Brannon has played in 29 career games and started twice. Stewart is one of 13 true freshmen who have played for the Commodores this year.

PREP TEAMMATES SQUARE OFF

Several Commodores will be facing former high school teammates when Vanderbilt and South Carolina meet Saturday.

★ **Ryan Seymour** (R-So., OT) played at Camden County (Ga.) HS with Gamecocks' **Josh Dickerson** (Sr., LB) and **DeAngelo Smith** (WR, R-Fr.). Seymour starts at right tackle for the Commodores while Dickerson ranks as the Gamecocks' fifth leading tackle in his final year.

★ Three Commodores – **Ryan van Rensburg**, **Mason Johnston** and **Tray Herndon** – played with South Carolina sophomore TE **Miek Triglia** at The Bolles School in Jacksonville, Fla.

★ Vanderbilt's **Logan Stewart** (Fr., OL) and SC's **Dylan Thompson** (Fr., QB) were teammates and classmates at Boiling Springs HS in South Carolina.

★ Vanderbilt's **Blake Southerland** (R-Fr., LB) and Gamecock **Corey Simmons** (Fr., TE) were defensive teammates for Greater Atlanta Christian in Georgia.

CALDWELL AS FIRST-YEAR COACH

How does **Robbie Caldwell** match up with other first-year Vanderbilt head coaches?

In just six games, Caldwell has matched the win total of four of the last six Commodore coaches.

Since Fred Pancoast's first team won seven games in 1975, the highest first-year win total was accomplished by Gerry DiNardo in 1991 (5).

MARVE RETURNS AFTER ONE WEEK

Top Commodore tackler **Chris Marve** (R-Jr., LB) returned to action at Georgia just 10 days after he underwent an arthroscopic procedure to repair a knee injured during Vanderbilt's game at Connecticut.



NOTES FROM GEORGIA GAME

★ With the loss, Vanderbilt's streak of scoring points in 76 consecutive games dating to the 2003 season finale came to a close.

★ Vanderbilt falls to 0-4 when opponents score the first points. The Commodores are 2-0 when they score first.

★ For the first time this season all four of Vanderbilt's captains (**Joey Bailey**, **T.J. Greenstone**, **Chris Marve** and **Adam Smotherman**) dressed out for the same game. Smotherman made his first appearance of the season, returning from a knee injury that occurred during spring drills.

Injuries have hindered all four this season. Greenstone missed his third straight game due to an ankle injury. Marve returned to action after missing the prior game with an injury. Bailey missed the second half with a foot injury.

★ For the second time this season, an SEC opponent limited the Commodores to less than 150 yards of total offense. Vanderbilt managed just 140 total yards. Earlier, LSU held the Commodore offense to 135 total yards.

★ Vanderbilt was attempting to win consecutive SEC road games for the first time since 11 years.

★ Two Commodore defenders, **John Stokes** (Sr., LB) and **Kenny Ladler** (Fr., safety), posted career-high tackle totals with 11 and nine, respectively.

★ **Casey Hayward** (Jr., DB) had a season-high nine tackles, but saw his consecutive-game streak with an interception snap at four games.

Hayward succeeded for much of the day matched up with Georgia All-America WR A.J. Green, who finished with three receptions.

★ Vanderbilt did post a season-low three penalties. Its previous low this year was six infractions.

★ The Commodore defense did not produce a QB sack for the second time this season. The unit has managed more than one sack in just in game.

★ **Larry Smith** (R-Jr., QB) had just 70 passing yards, a season low. Under pressure for much of the game, Smith connected just twice with wide receivers.

★ Vanderbilt's lack of success converting third downs resulted in big Georgia advantage in time of possession. The Bulldogs owned a 37:15-22:45 advantage in possession.

The advantage for Georgia came after Vanderbilt held the ball for 8:21 of the first quarter.

★ The average Vanderbilt possession started at its own 21-yard line. The Commodores never began a drive beyond its own 34-yard line.

★ Vanderbilt opened the game with running backs **Warren Norman** and **Zac Stacy** in the starting unit. It was the team's first two-back starting lineup this season.

★ The Commodores allowed 547 yards of offense by the Bulldogs, the most this year by a Vanderbilt opponent.

It was the most yards allowed by the Commodores since Georgia Tech gained 597 yards in a 25-point win last year.

RECENT WINS OVER RANKED FOES

Vanderbilt has notched five wins over ranked opponents since 2005. The Commodores play their second ranked opponent this season when South Carolina visits Nashville.

Despite those victories, the 'Dores have lost six straight to teams ranked by the Associated Press Top 25 after dropping a 27-3 decision to LSU on Sept. 4.

In 2008, Vanderbilt registered three victories over ranked foes. The 'Dores beat No. 24 Boston College in the Gaylord Hotels Music City Bowl, No. 13 Auburn before an ESPN *College GameDay* crowd and No. 24 South Carolina.

NORMAN MOVES UP RETURN CHARTS

Though just a sophomore, **Warren Norman** continues to move up Vanderbilt all-time kickoff return charts.

Norman, who had 155 yards on eight returns at Georgia, moved up three positions to No. 6 all-time on the list. He is averaging 25.4 yards per return this year, ranking sixth in the SEC and 44th in the NCAA.

Norman is now averaging 26.0 yards per kickoff for his career. In 2009, he set a modern-day Vanderbilt team record in 2009 with a 26.2 yard average.

SMOTHERMAN RETURNS TO ACTION

Six months after going down with an knee injury that required surgery, **Adam Smotherman** (R-Sr., DT) returned to action at Georgia.

The defensive co-captain earned limited snaps against the Bulldogs, entering the game in the second quarter.

Smotherman started 23 consecutive games prior to the injury, second most on the team by only the 29 straight starts by LB **Chris Marve** that ended Oct. 9.

STOKES NOMINATED FOR SCHOLAR ATHLETE AWARD

Senior linebacker **John Stokes** (Sr., LB) has been nominated by Vanderbilt Athletics for the prestigious National Scholar Athlete Award sponsored by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame.

Stokes is the team's third leading tackler and tops the squad with a pair of fumble recoveries in his final year as a starter.

Stokes maintains a 3.8 GPA, majoring in Medicine, Health & Society. He is a two-time District IV Academic All-American. The son of Vanderbilt graduates also received early admission into Vanderbilt's Medical School after his sophomore academic year on campus, and is expected to start postgraduate classes next fall.

Stokes also is involved as an executive board member of one of Vanderbilt's largest student organizations, Manna Project International. He serves as site development coordinator, in charge of planning and creating community service trips abroad during Spring Break 2011.

There have been four previous Vanderbilt recipients of the award: Hunter Hillenmeyer, 2002; Andy McCarroll, 1989; Doug Martin, 1974; and Wade Butcher, 1961.

Struggles converting third downs continues to have a ripple effect on the Vanderbilt offense.

The unit has made just 24 percent of its third downs this season (18 of 74). The problem surfaced against Saturday when the Commodores made just 1 of 11 third down tries.

The lack of third-down success is apparent in several statistical categories. The Commodores rank 12th in the SEC in first downs, time of possession, scoring offense and total offense. Only two teams in the NCAA, New Mexico and New Mexico State, have punted with more frequency than the Commodores.

JOHNSON: NAMED TOP SEC OL VS. OLE MISS

Redshirt freshman tackle **Wesley Johnson** earned the SEC's top weekly honor for offensive lineman honor for his play against Ole Miss Sept. 18.

Johnson recorded six knock-down blocks and produced key blocks on a pair of long scoring rushes.

Johnson became the first Commodore to earn SEC top offensive lineman honors since left tackle Chris Williams was recognized in 2007.

UNIFORM CHANGE: NAMES ON JERSEYS

For the first time since 2001, Vanderbilt jerseys sport player names.

The uniform change was introduced in the season opener versus Northwestern.

Jerseys during the Bobby Johnson tenure did not identify players.

TOP INDIVIDUAL PERFORMERS

Chris Marve, Casey Hayward and **Warren Norman** are playing up to their preseason hype.

Marve, a junior LB from Memphis, and Norman, a sophomore RB/RS from Stone Mountain, Ga., were both named first team All-Southeastern Conference team by coaches and writers. Hayward, a junior CB from Perry, Ga., was mentioned on several preseason ballots.

All are performing well this year: Marve ranking among the SEC's leading tacklers; Norman among the league's top all-purpose runners; and Hayward among the conference's interception leaders.

CHRIS MARVE (R-Jr., LB)

Named to watchlists for the Nagurski Trophy, Butkus Award and Lombardi Award, Marve returned to action at Georgia after missing the previous game to injury. He contributed three tackles in the loss, and currently ranks sixth in the SEC in tackles (8.4 pg).

Marve is trying to become the first SEC player to achieve three consecutive seasons of at least 100 tackles since former Vanderbilt All-America linebacker Jamie Winborn achieved the feat in 1998-2000.

WARREN NORMAN (Jr., KR/RB)

Norman, the 2009 SEC Freshman of the Year, ranks fourth in the SEC in all-purpose yardage (150.3 ypg). He had 188 all-purpose yards vs. Georgia.

Norman also leads Vanderbilt in rushing yards (58.3 ypg). Just a sophomore, Norman tops all Commodores with 1,139 career rushing yards and seven rushing TDs.

Last year, Norman topped the SEC with 1,951 all-purpose yards, breaking the legendary Herschel Walker's freshman SEC record in the process. He also matched an SEC mark with three kickoff returns for TDs.

CASEY HAYWARD (Jr., DB)

Junior cornerback shares SEC lead with four interceptions and tops the conference with eight defensed passes.

Facing Georgia and its standout WR A.J. Green, Hayward was credited with nine tackles and a defensed pass for the defense.

OTHER TOP CANDIDATES

SEAN RICHARDSON (Jr., Safety) Regarded as one of the SEC's top safeties, Richardson blossomed as a starter at strong safety in 2009, earning 84 total tackles and 4.5 tackles for loss.

★ *Richardson is SEC's seventh leading tackler (8.2 per game)*

BRANDON BARDEN (R-Jr., TE) Finished 2009 with 29 receptions, good for 357 yards and a TD. Former prep QB ranks as Vanderbilt's active career leader with 65 receptions and 718 receiving yards.

★ *Barden tops team in catches (18) and receiving yards (180)*

RYAN FOWLER (R-So., PK) Untested entering '09, Fowler connected on 11 of his last 12 attempts, including final eight. Fowler's 16 FGs tied a school record, earning Freshman All-America and SEC honors.

★ *Fowler is 3-4 on the season in FGs*

REMEMBERING RAJAAN BENNETT

The Commodores are without one student-athlete who was expected to be a key member of the 2010 signing class, **Rajaan Bennett**.

Bennett, a highly sought-after running back from McEachern High School in Powder Springs, Ga., died tragically on Feb. 18, 2010. Bennett was the victim of a residential shooting that shocked the McEachern and Vanderbilt communities. On Sept. 3, the school honored Bennett by retiring his No. 5 jersey and erecting a monument at its football stadium.

At a memorial service days after the death, his literature teacher read an essay entitled "*Strength*" written by Bennett within a week of his death.

The essay closed with the following lines:

"There will never be a time that I will give up. I work hard at whatever I do for that man upstairs to smile down on me with the rays of the sun."

"My drive cannot be stopped or even slowed down, because every obstacle has a way around it."

"Every day I become stronger from the weights physically, the books mentally and life emotionally. There is no limit to my strength and at the end of the day, I want to be known as the strongest."

Bennett rushed for 1,857 yards and 28 touchdowns as a senior captain, helping McEachern to an undefeated regular season. A Rivals' 4-star recruit and one of Georgia's most decorated seniors, Bennett earned the state's AAAAA Offensive Player of the Year Award. At McEachern, Bennett was a campus leader and honors student.

The son of Narjaketha Bennett and the late Charles Bennett, Rajaan is survived by a younger brother and sister.
