NOTES ON THE TENNESSEE SERIES

Vanderbilt snapped a 22-game losing streak versus Tennessee in 2005, earning a come-from-behind 28-24 victory in Knoxville. The Commodore win also ended a 14-game Vanderbilt losing streak in Neyland Stadium that dated to a 17-14 victory in 1975.

In 2007, Vanderbilt held a fourth quarter lead before the Volunteers rallied to score 16 points to earn a 25-24 victory.

The Commodores have played Tennessee more than any other team. It is the SEC's fourth most frequently played rivalry. The series is in dispute – Vanderbilt recognizes a 1918 win; Tennessee does not recognize the game. Vanderbilt also controlled the early years between the universities, holding a 19-2-3 overall record through 1927.

KEY GAMES IN TENNESSEE SERIES

★ **Jay Cutler** cemented his status among Commodore fans with his play against Tennessee. He threw for more than 300 yards against the Volunteers as a junior and senior. Cutler's last pass as a Commodore – a five-yarder to **Earl Bennett** – proved the margin points in a 28-24 Vanderbilt win in Knoxville last year.

★ On Nov. 27, 1982, **Whit Taylor** threw for 391 yards and three TDs against the Vols, but it was his one-yard keeper around right end in a rainstorm that Commodore fans fondly remember as the clinching points in a 28-21 victory in Nashville.

★ In 1992, QB **Marcus Wilson** and end **Clarence Sevellian** connected on the longest touchdown pass in Commodore history – 88 yards – against Tennessee.

★ The first year Vanderbilt and Tennessee ever played, in 1892, the Commodores won twice, 22-4 in October and 10-0 in a November snowstorm. Two days later, the Commodores went to Atlanta and beat a tough Georgia Tech team 20-10.

★ Two TD passes by captain **Jess Neely** guides 'Dores to 14-6 win in 1922. Today, when the teams enters Vanderbilt Stadium from their locker room in McGugin Center, they cross Jess Neely Drive.

★ When **Dan McGugin** arrived as head coach at Vanderbilt in 1904, his Commodores quickly took control of the series. From 1904 until 1926, McGugin's team went 13-2-1 against the Vols.

★ In 1901, Bell Buckle's **John Tigert** guided the 'Dores to a 22-0 home win. Later, Tigert would become the first Tennessean selected as a Rhodes Scholar, a U.S. Education Commissioner and University of Florida president. He is a member of the College Football Hall of Fame.

THE 2009 VANDERBILT-UT GAME

Vanderbilt (16) at Tennessee (31)

Neyland Stadium, Knoxville (100,124) • Nov. 21, 2009 • ESPN

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. – The Volunteers notched their third consecutive victory over the in-state Commodores 31-16 after jumping out to a 14-point margin at halftime.

With the score tied 10-10 after one quarter, the Vols (6-5, 3-4 Southeastern Conference) became bowl eligible with a pair of Jonathan Compton touchdown passes in the second quarter.

Late in the game, after two Ryan Fowler field goals narrowed the Tennessee margin to 24-16, the Commodores failed to score on three fourth quarter possessions, then watched a deflected Mackenzi Adams pass returned for a last-second touchdown.

The Commodores (2-10, 0-8) finished without a conference win for the first time since 2002.

Adams hit on 19 of 35 passes for 174 and a touchdown. Warren Norman was the top Commodore rusher with 73 yards. Tight end Brandon Barden contributed five receptions for the Commodores.

VU: SEC GRADUATION SUCCESS LEADERS

The Vanderbilt football team tops the SEC in graduation success rate, according to an NCAA report released last week.

The Commodores' graduation success rate for football (freshmen class of 2002-03) was 89 percent.

TOP BACKS JOIN GROWING INJURY LIST

Zac Stacy (So., RB), one of the Commodores' top backs for the last two seasons, will join fellow sophomore running back **Warren Norman** on the sidelines for the rest of the 2010 season due to injury.

It's been a season marred with injuries for the young Commodore squad. Nineteen contributors have missed action, including more than a dozen that have missed three games or more.

Last week, **Mason Johnston** (R-Fr., TE) became the latest added to the injury list. Johnston will miss the Tennessee and Wake Forest games after suffering a serious knee injury at Kentucky.

Stacy, the team's second leading rusher, will not return this season after sustaining a head injury two weeks ago in the Florida game. One week earlier, Norman was lost for the season when he sustained a wrist dislocation in the second half at Arkansas. Team physicians repaired Norman's injury during surgery on Nov. 2.

A third promising running back, **Wesley Tate** (R-Fr.) has never been at full speed this season due to a tender lower leg.

At Kentucky, the Commodores inserted **Kennard Reeves** (R-Sr.) into the starting lineup. Reeves responded by rushing for 105 yards, a career high.

Stacy, Norman and Johnston are three of five key Commodores to sustain probable season-ending injuries in recent weeks.

Two weeks ago, **Jamie Graham** (R-Jr., DB) underwent knee surgery that is expected to require more than a month of rehab. Graham earned two starts this year at nickel back and has 15 starts in his college career. He was injured vs. South Carolina.

During preparations for the Florida game, **Adam Smotherman** (R-Sr., DT) re-injured an knee repaired last spring. Smotherman, a 23-game starter at tackle, played in three games before sustaining the practice injury that effectively ended his career.

LOOKING TO FORCE TURNOVERS

The Vanderbilt has been unable to force key turnovers during its current five-game losing streak.

The Commodores have forced just three turnovers in the stretch against tough SEC foes. As a result, the 'Dores are minus-3 in turnover margin for the season.

ALLOWING TOO MANY OPPONENT PLAYS

Vanderbilt's struggling offense (18 ppg) is evident in the fact that opponents are averaging 75 plays per game against the Commodore defense. The play total has contributed to an eight-minute imbalance against the Commodores in time of possession (33:58-26:02).

NO SENIORS AMONG VU STAT LEADERS

How young are the Commodores? The squad does not have a single statistical category topped by a senior.

In stat categories, the leading senior rusher (**Kennard Reeves**) ranks fourth, the leading senior receiver (**Turner Wimberly**) ranks seventh and the leading senior tackler (**John Stokes**) ranks third.

THIRTEEN TRUE FRESHMEN SEE ACTION

Just six teams across the nation have played more true freshmen than Vanderbilt this year where 13 first-year contributors have enjoyed action. Air Force leads the nation with 17 true freshmen contributors, with Florida (19) and Tennessee (16) close behind.

Besides Stewart and Morse, other contributing first-year players are **Karl Butler** (safety), **Steven Clarke** (DB), **Chase Garnham** (LB), **Andre Hal** (DB), **James Kittredge** (OC), **Jonathan Krause** (WR), **Kenny Ladler** (safety), **Fitz Lassing** (TE), **Jordan Matthews** (WR), **Jared Morse** (DT), **Andre Simmons** (safety), **Logan Stewart** (OC) and **Carey Spear** (PK).

30 'DORES SEE FIRST COLLEGE ACTION

Thirty Commodores have played their first snaps this season.

TWENTY-TWO NEW STARTERS THIS YEAR

Twenty-two Commodores – 12 on defense, nine on offense and one specialist – have enjoyed their first career starts this season.

One offensive player – **Keenard Reeves** (R-Sr., RB) – was a new starter at Kentucky. Three defenders – **Walker May** (R-Fr., DE), **Johnell Thomas** (R-So., DE) and **Andre Hal** (Fr., DB) – earned initial starts two weeks ago against Florida.

Besides those three, other defenders earning their initial starts are **Archibald Barnes** (R-So., LB), **Nate Campbell** (R-Sr., LB), **Eddie Foster** (So., CB), **Jay Fullam** (R-Fr., safety), **Kenny Ladler** (Fr., safety), **Rob Lohr** (R-So., DT), **Colt Nichter** (R-So., DT) and **Trey Wilson** (So., CB).

Offensive players making their first career starts are **Jabo Burrow** (R-So., OG), **Tray Herndon** (R-Jr., WR), **Wesley Johnson** (R-Fr., LT), **Mason Johnston** (R-Fr., TE), **Jonathan Krause** (Fr., WR), **Kennard Reeves** (R-Sr., RB), **Logan Stewart** (Fr., center), **Caleb Welchans** (R-So., OG-OT) and **Turner Wimberly** (R-Sr., WR).

Punter **Richard Kent** (R-So.) also is a first-year starter.



COMMODORE NOTES

LOOKING TO STOP LOSING STREAK

The Commodores face Tennessee looking to end a five-game losing streak dating back to early October.

Vanderbilt's last victory came against non-SEC foe Eastern Michigan (52-6) on Oct. 9.

The Commodores have also dropped five consecutive games in conference play, with the last league victory coming Sept. 18 at Ole Miss (28-14).

NOTES FROM THE KENTUCKY GAME

★ Vanderbilt failed in its bid to notch consecutive wins in Lexington for the first time since 1992 and 1994.

★ The Commodores fall to 2-3 in games when it scores first. Vanderbilt has posted the initial points in recent losses to South Carolina, Arkansas and Kentucky.

★ The Vanderbilt defense was victimized by four huge Wildcat plays in the second half: runs of 52 and 73 yards by all-purpose athlete Randall Cobb, a 83-yard TD rush by Derrick Locke and a 55-yard scoring pass from Mike Hartline to WR Chris Matthews.

★ Placekicker **Ryan Fowler** (R-So.) was 2-of-2 in field goals, hitting from 20 and 29 yards. His first conversion early in the first quarter was his first field goal attempt in five games.

★ **Jonathan Krause** (Fr., WR) posted a career-long rush (45 yards) and reception (52 yards) in the first half

As a rare rush threat, Krause is averaging 24.2 yards per carry.

★ **T.J. Greenstone** (R-Jr., DT) tied a season high with seven tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss. **John Stokes** (Sr., LB) had a team-high 10 tackles, his third double-digit tackle total of the season.

★ **Kennard Reeves** (R-Sr., TB) set a career high with 105 rushing yards in his first starting assignment. He also added a career-long rush of 31 yards in 19 carries, the highest single-game total of his career.

★ The Vanderbilt offense produced 242 total yards in the first half, the highest total against an SEC foe this season.

★ Vanderbilt lost its first game this season when leading at halftime. The Commodores took a 13-10 edge over the Wildcats entering intermission.

The Commodores have owned two previous halftime leads this season – in eventual wins over Ole Miss and Eastern Michigan.

★ The Vanderbilt offense was far more effective against the Wildcats than in other recent outings, producing 19 first downs and 400 total yards in 81 plays.

The unit's first down, yardage and play totals were team highs against SEC opponents this season. The Commodores also held an advantage in time of possession for the first time this season.

★ **Jordan Matthews** (Fr., WR) has touchdown receptions in consecutive games. He had a 4-yard TD catch vs. the 'Cats.

★ Both coordinators – **Des Kitchens** (offense) and **Jamie Bryant** (defense) – worked from the coaches box. In Kitchens' first two games since taking over the OC uties, he called plays from the sideline.

DUO AMONG NCAA STATISTIC LEADERS

Vanderbilt standouts **Casey Hayward** (Jr., CB) and **Tim Fugger** (R-Jr., DE) remain among the national leaders in key defensive stats.

Hayward ranks second in the SEC lead with five interceptions and tops the league with 13 defended passes. Fugger ranks fourth nationally with four forced fumbles.

Hayward, believed to be the first Commodore of the modern era to achieve interceptions in four consecutive games, also tops the squad with seven career picks. Hayward's current interception total has been bettered by only two Commodores in the last 30 years: **D.J. Moore** (2007, 2008), and **Leonard Coleman** (1982). The team's single-season record of eight INTs is held by Coleman (1982) and **Thomas Wingfield** (1973).

Fugger's forced fumble total is just as rare. Only two 'Dore defenders since 1983 have posted more forced fumbles in a season: **Jamie Duncan** (5, 1996) and **Shelton Quarles** (5, 1991).

VANDERBILT IN 2010: LOTS OF YOUTH

Looking for a quick description for Robbie Caldwell's first Vanderbilt squad? *Youthful* would work.

The list of 'Dores seeing action features 21 sophomores, 11 redshirt freshmen and 13 true freshmen.

Only eight Commodore seniors have contributed this season.

NORMAN SIXTH: KICKOFF RETURNS

Though just a sophomore, **Warren Norman** ranks sixth all-time on the Vanderbilt all-time kickoff return charts.

Norman, who will miss the rest of this season after suffering a wrist injury against Arkansas two weeks ago, is averaging 25.4 yards per return this year, ranking sixth in the SEC and 45th in the NCAA.

For his career, Norman is averaging 25.9 yards per kickoff. In 2009, he set a modern-day Vanderbilt team record in 2009 with a 26.2-yard average.

Four Commodores were in Phil Steele's Midseason All-SEC team released Oct. 19.

The football magazine named **Casey Hayward** (Jr., CB) to its second team All-SEC defense. Included on its third team All-SEC squad were **Brandon Barden** (R-Jr., TE), **Warren Norman** (So., KR) and **Chris Marve** (R-Jr., LB).



STOKES, COLE EARN ACADEMIC HONORS

John Stokes (Sr., LB) and **John Cole** (R-So., WR) have been named to the CoSIDA/ESPN Academic All-District IV first team, the Academic All-America Committee announced Nov. 2.

Stokes, from Memphis, has played in 46 games as a Commodore and currently ranks third on the team with 42 solo tackles and 69 total tackles. Both totals are single-season highs for Stokes. He also is the team leader with two fumble recoveries.

Stokes has maintained a 3.80 GPA while majoring in Health, Medicine and Society.

This marks the third consecutive year that Stokes has been recognized at the district level for his academic achievements.

Cole, of Somerset, Ky., is second on the team with 20 receptions and 242 receiving yards. He has also returned 15 punts for 113 yards. He holds a 3.63 GPA while majoring in Human and Organizational Development.

ESPN The Magazine and CoSIDA will announce its Academic All-American Team on Nov. 23.

★ **Adam Smotherman** (R-Sr., DT) was teammates at Smyrna H.S. southeast of Nashville with UT's and **Rodriquez Wilks** (R-So., DB).

★ **Wesley Johnson** (R-Fr., OT), **Fitz Lassing** (Fr., TE) and **Reggie Ford** (R-Fr., DB) attended Nashville's Montgomery Bell Academy with Vol **Ben Bartholomew** (R-So., TE).

★ **Jay Fullam** (R-Fr., safety) and UT's **Joseph Ayres** (Fr., OT) were teammates at the McCallie School in Chattanooga.

★ **Steven Clarke** (Fr., DB) and Tennessee's **Gerald Williams** (Sr., DT) both starred at Boyd Anderson H.S. near Fort Lauderdale.

★ One year ago, **Jordan Rodgers** (Jr., QB) was taking snaps at Butte J.C. in Northern California from current UT center **Darin Gooch**.

★ **James Kittredge** (Fr., C/OG) and Tennessee's **Phil Simms** (Jr., QB) were standouts at one of the most nation's top high school programs, Don Bosco Prep in New Jersey.

HAND NEWEST COMMODORE COACH

Herb Hand, a veteran offensive coach with excellent credentials, is the newest Vanderbilt coach. Hired in early August, Hand serves as offensive line coach and was the first staff hire by Robbie Caldwell.

Hand came to Vanderbilt after three years at the University of Tulsa, a tenure that featured some of the NCAA's most productive offenses. As Tulsa's offensive coordinator, Hand directed 2007 and 2008 offenses that topped the nation. Tulsa's 2008 unit averaged 570 yards and 47 points. Hand also spent six successful years with the University of West Virginia's productive spread offense before going to Tulsa.

FOURTH CO-CAPTAIN MISSES ACTION

The Commodores will not play this year with all four captains seeing action in the same game.

Adam Smotherman (R-Sr., DT) will miss the final four games by suffering a knee reinjury last week in practice.

All four captains have spent time on the sideline due to injury. **Joey Bailey** (R-Sr., center) missed three recent games with an ankle injury. Two other defensive captains – **T.J. Greenstone** (R-Jr, DT) and **Chris Marve** (R-Jr., LB) – are back in action, but missed midseason games with leg injuries.

KITCHINGS NEW OFF. COORDINATOR

Running backs mentor **Des Kitchings** replaced **Jimmy Kiser** as the Commodores' offensive coordinator on Oct. 25.

Kitchings, in his third year on the Vanderbilt staff, moved into the offensive coordinator post for the first time in his coaching career.

Kiser continues to coach Commodore quarterbacks.

Earlier this year, the following coaching changes were made:

★ **Bruce Fowler** moved to assistant head coach/linebackers coach under Caldwell.

★ **Jamie Bryant** became the sole defensive coordinator while continuing as the team's secondary coach.

★ **Rick Logo** added recruiting coordinator duties to his primary role as defensive tackles coach.

★ **Mike Pelton** was hired as defensive ends coach.

★ **Ted Cain** was moved to TE coach and special teams coordinator.

CALDWELL AS FIRST-YEAR COACH

How does **Robbie Caldwell** match up with other first-year Vanderbilt head coaches?

Caldwell has matched the win total of four of the last six Commodore coaches.

Since Fred Pancoast's first team won seven games in 1975, the highest first-year win total was accomplished by Gerry DiNardo in 1991 (5).

The Vanderbilt offense is still looking for improvement in its second year of operating the no-huddle attack.

★ Vanderbilt is on pace to complete less than 50 percent of its passes for the third consecutive season. The Commodores are 122 of 258 (47.3%) on the season.

★ The Commodores also are on pace to produce less than 200 first downs for the third straight year after reaching at least 209 first downs for five straight years (2003-07).

CALDWELL: FIRST-YEAR HEAD COACH

Robbie Caldwell, the 26th head coach in Vanderbilt football history, is one of just 11 first-time head coaches in the NCAA FBS subdivision this season.

Caldwell, a veteran of more than three decades of collegiate coaching, was named to replace retiring Bobby Johnson on July 14.

Caldwell and Kentucky mentor Joker Phillips are the SEC's only first-time head coaches this year.

Besides Caldwell and Phillips, other first-time FCS head coaches are Sonny Dykes (La. Tech), Dan Enos (Central Michigan), Jimbo Fisher (Florida State), John "Doc" Holliday (Marshall), Mike MacIntyre (San Jose State), Larry Porter (Memphis), Jeff Quinn (Buffalo), Charlie Strong (Louisville) and Willie Taggart (Western Kentucky).

Caldwell has the most collegiate coaching experience of the 11 coaches, with Holliday having the second longest tenure.

THIRTEEN PLAYERS ON COUNCIL

Thirteen players participate in the Leadership Council, serving as an entity that addresses team and student-athlete issues while acting as their teammates' voice in communicating with Vanderbilt coaches.

Co-captains **Joey Bailey**, **T.J. Greenstone**, **Chris Marve** and **Adam Smotherman** are members of the Leadership Council. Others voted by teammates to represent various position groups include **Larry Smith**, QBs; **Kennard Reeves**, RBs; **Brandon Barden**, TEs/HBs; **John Cole**, WRS; **Tim Fugger**, DL; **John Stokes**, LBs; **Sean Richardson**, safeties; **Casey Hayward**, DBs; and **David Giller**, specialists.

MARVE WEARS DOSTER "KD1" PATCH

Chris Marve (R-Jr., LB) became the fourth Vanderbilt player to wear the "KD1" jersey patch when the Commodores opened against Northwestern. The recognition is one of the most significant awarded by fellow Commodore players.

The patch honors the memory of Kwane Doster, the only Commodore ever to receive the SEC Freshman of the Year Award. Doster was shot and killed in his hometown of Tampa, Fla., on Dec. 26, 2004. It is displayed on the front of Marve's No. 13 jersey.

ROAD WINS IN THE SEC

STOKES UP FOR PRESTIGIOUS AWARDS

Senior linebacker **John Stokes**, a semifinalist for the prestigious National Scholar Athlete Award, has also been named as one of 10 finalists for the Awards and Recognition Association (ARA) Sportsmanship Award. The ARA Award winner will be announced in November.

Stokes and **John Cole** (R-So., WR) were also selected as ESPN District IV Academic Americans last week. Both are up for national Academic American recognition.

A native of Memphis, Tenn., Stokes also is a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, the prestigious collegiate honor formerly known as the Draddy Trophy.

Stokes is the team's third leading tackler (59 total tackles) and tops the squad with a pair of fumble recoveries in his final year as a starter.

Stokes maintains a 3.8 grade point average majoring in Medicine, Health & Society. He is a two-time District IV Academic All-American. The son of Vanderbilt graduates also received early admission into Vanderbilt's Medical School after his sophomore academic year on campus, and is expected to start postgraduate classes next fall.

Stokes also is involved as an executive board member of one of Vanderbilt's largest student organizations, Manna Project International. He serves as site development coordinator, in charge of planning and creating community service trips abroad during Spring Break 2011.

There have been four previous Vanderbilt recipients of the award: **Hunter Hillenmeyer**, 2002; **Andy McCarroll**, 1989; **Doug Martin**, 1974; and **Wade Butcher**, 1961.

KENT'S SOLID NET PUNTING

Punter **Richard Kent** (R-So.) is having a solid season as a first-year starter.

Kent ranks as the SEC's eighth leading punter (41.6 yards). As a net punter, he has helped Vanderbilt to a fifth place ranking in the SEC with an 38.0 net average.

Just 22 of Kent's 79 punts have been returned.

THIRD-DOWN STRUGGLES

The Vanderbilt offense has struggled with third-down production for much of the year.

The offensive production was much improved against Kentucky. The unit converted seven of 17 third downs, helping result in 19 first downs.

Through 10 games, the Commodores rank 12th in the SEC in both first downs (12.9 pg per game) or third down efficiency (23% success rate).

The overall lack of success in key situations has Vanderbilt trailing in other key offensive statistical categories, including scoring and total offense.

JOHNSON: NAMED TOP SEC OL VS. OLE MISS

Redshirt freshman tackle **Wesley Johnson** earned the SEC's weekly offensive linemen award for his play against Ole Miss Sept. 18.

Johnson recorded six knock-down blocks and produced key blocks on a pair of long scoring rushes.

Johnson became the first Commodore to earn SEC top offensive lineman honors since left tackle Chris Williams was recognized in 2007.

UNIFORM CHANGE: NAMES ON JERSEYS

For the first time since 2001, Vanderbilt jerseys sport player names.

The uniform change was introduced in the season opener versus Northwestern.

Jerseys during the Bobby Johnson tenure did not identify players.

TOP INDIVIDUAL PERFORMERS

Casey Hayward and **Chris Marve** are playing up to their preseason hype. A third Commodore, **Warren Norman**, was performing just as well prior to a season-ending injury.

Marve, a junior LB from Memphis, and Norman, a sophomore RB/RS from Stone Mountain, Ga., were both named first team All-Southeastern Conference team by coaches and writers. Hayward, a junior CB from Perry, Ga., was mentioned on several preseason ballots.

All have performed well this year: Hayward ranks among the conference's interception leaders, Marve is among the SEC's leading tacklers, and Norman still ranks among the league's top all-purpose runners and kickoff returners despite now being injured.

CASEY HAYWARD (Jr., DB)

Junior cornerback ranks second in the SEC behind Alabama's Robert Lester with five interceptions.

He also tops the conference – and is tied for fourth in the NCAA – with 14 defensed passes.

CHRIS MARVE (R-Jr., LB)

Named to watchlists for the Nagurski Trophy, Butkus Award and Lombardi Award, Marve returned to action at Georgia after missing the previous game to injury. He contributed just four tackles vs. Kentucky, but still ranks as the SEC's eighth leading tackler (8.0 per game).

Marve is trying to become the first SEC player to achieve three consecutive seasons of at least 100 tackles since former Vanderbilt All-America linebacker Jamie Winborn achieved the feat in 1998-2000.

WARREN NORMAN (So., KR/RB)

Norman, the 2009 SEC Freshman of the Year, ranks fourth in the SEC in all-purpose yardage (140.9 ypg). Norman suffered a season-ending wrist injury in the second half against Arkansas in the eighth game of the season.

Norman also leads Vanderbilt in rushing yards (57.4 ypg). Norman is the team's active career leader with 1,248 career rushing yards and seven rushing TDs.

Last year, Norman topped the SEC with 1,951 all-purpose yards, breaking the legendary Herschel Walker's freshman SEC record in the process. He also matched an SEC mark with three kickoff returns for TDs.

OTHER TOP CANDIDATES

SEAN RICHARDSON (Jr., Safety) Regarded as one of the SEC's top safeties, Richardson blossomed as a starter at strong safety in 2009, earning 84 total tackles and 4.5 tackles for loss.

★ *Richardson is SEC's seventh leading tackler (8.2 per game)*

BRANDON BARDEN (R-Jr., TE) Finished 2009 with 29 receptions, good for 357 yards and a TD. He ranks as Vanderbilt's active career leader with 85 receptions, 884 receiving yards and eight TDs.

★ *Barden tops all Commodore receivers with 28 catches, 318 receiving yards and three TDs.*

REMEMBERING RAJAAN BENNETT

The Commodores are without one student-athlete who was expected to be a key member of the 2010 signing class, **Rajaan Bennett**.

Bennett, a highly sought-after running back from McEachern High School in Powder Springs, Ga., died tragically on Feb. 18, 2010. Bennett was the victim of a residential shooting that shocked the McEachern and Vanderbilt communities. On Sept. 3, the school honored Bennett by retiring his No. 5 jersey and erecting a monument at its football stadium.

At a memorial service days after the death, his literature teacher read an essay entitled "*Strength*" written by Bennett within a week of his death.

The essay closed with the following lines:

"There will never be a time that I will give up. I work hard at whatever I do for that man upstairs to smile down on me with the rays of the sun.

"My drive cannot be stopped or even slowed down, because every obstacle has a way around it.

"Every day I become stronger from the weights physically, the books mentally and life emotionally. There is no limit to my strength and at the end of the day, I want to be known as the strongest."

Bennett rushed for 1,857 yards and 28 touchdowns as a senior captain, helping McEachern to an undefeated regular season. A Rivals' 4-star recruit and one of Georgia's most decorated seniors, Bennett earned the state's AAAA Offensive Player of the Year Award. At McEachern, Bennett was a campus leader and honors student.

Bennett and his family were honored during in-game ceremonies Oct. 23.

TAILBACK REEVES RUSHES FOR 100 YARDS

Vanderbilt reached a key stat line against Kentucky has usually leads to Commodore team success.

For the first time in seven years, the Commodores lost a game which featured a Vanderbilt running back rushing for at least 100 yards. **Kennard Reeves** (R-Sr., RB) ended with 105 yards on 19 carries against the Wildcats.

Dating back to 2003, Vanderbilt had won 14 consecutive games in which its rushing attack featured a 100-yard rusher.

Reeves was the second running back this season to top 100 yards. **Warren Norman** had 111 rushing yards in the Commodores' 28-14 victory at Ole Miss on Sept. 18.

NASHVILLE – Dan Persa threw for 222 yards and three touchdowns to three different receivers, and Northwestern beat Vanderbilt 23-21 Saturday night in the regular season game between the Big Ten and the Southeastern Conference.

This was Persa's first start with Mike Kafka now gone, and the junior was nearly perfect as he helped ruin the debut of Vanderbilt's new head coach Robbie Caldwell in the season opener for both teams.

Persa was 19 of 21 passing and he also led the Wildcats with 82 yards rushing.

Vanderbilt had plenty of chances to make Caldwell the first Commodores' coach to win his debut since Woody Widenhofer in 1997.

Larry Smith threw for 240 yards and a touchdown with Warren Norman and Zac Stacy each running for touchdowns. But the Commodores missed an extra point, a 48-yard field goal and were stopped on two 2-point conversions -- the last with 2:25 left on a bad snap.

Northwestern faced third-and-6 from its own 33 when Persa was hit a yard short of the first down marker by Vandy safety Jay Fullam. But officials flagged him for a high hit and a personal foul, allowing Northwestern to run out the clock even though it looked on replay as if Fullam simply put his shoulder into Persa's shoulder for the stop.

The crowd, a couple thousand short of a sellout at 37,210, booed the officials off the field.

NASHVILLE – Quarterback Larry Smith threw for 253 yards and two touchdowns and ran for another as Vanderbilt rolled to a 52-6 victory over Eastern Michigan on Saturday night.

The Commodores (2-3) scored 24 points in the second quarter, including 17 in the last seven minutes of the half, as they snapped a nine-game losing streak at home.

Smith completed his last eight passes of the half, starting with a 65-yard catch-and-run touchdown to Udom Umoh with 4:21 to go. It was the longest play of both players' careers.

Smith hooked up with tight end Mason Johnston - his first career catch - for a 1-yard touchdown and a 31-3 lead with 22 seconds left in the half.

Eastern Michigan (0-6) has lost 18 straight, the second-longest streak in the Football Bowl Subdivision - with its last win coming on Nov. 28, 2008, against Central Michigan.

NASHVILLE – Brian Maddox rushed for a career-high 146 yards and the game-clinching touchdown to lead No. 19 South Carolina to a difficult 21-7 win over Vanderbilt on Saturday night, giving Steve Spurrier his 40th victory with the Gamecocks.

The win snapped South Carolina's seven-game Southeastern Conference road losing streak that dated back to 2008 and put the Gamecocks (5-2, 3-2) in first place in the SEC East. South Carolina had lost two of the last three to Vanderbilt (2-5, 1-3).

Maddox didn't carry the ball until South Carolina's fourth series with about 6 minutes left in the first half, replacing an ineffective Kenny Miles, who started in place of injured freshman Marcus Lattimore. And he wasn't much of a boost for the mistake-prone Gamecocks until the second half when he rushed for 48 yards on the game-changing drive midway through the third quarter.

His touchdown from 2 yards out with 4:59 left in the third quarter broke a 7-7 tie and seemed to shake the Gamecocks awake.

Spurrier has struggled with the Commodores since moving to Columbia. The Gamecocks needed a fourth-quarter touchdown to beat Vanderbilt 14-10 last season and with Lattimore out South Carolina continued to struggle in the series.

A combination of intense first-half pressure on quarterback Stephen Garcia and the Gamecocks' own mistakes kept the Commodores in it most of the way.
