



# 2009-10 SEASON REVIEW

## Commodores Return Nine Scholarship Players From 2009-10

Vanderbilt returns nine scholarship players from 2009-10 and three walk-ons to the fold for the 2010-11 campaign. The Commodores' roster will sport three seniors (Joe Duffy, Darshawn McClellan, Chris Meriwether), seven juniors (Jeffery Taylor, Brad Tinsley, Andre Walker, Festus Ezeli, Steve Tchiengang, Lance Goulbourne, and Aaron Noll), two sophomores (John Jenkins, Jordan Smart), and four freshmen (Kyle Fuller, Josh Henderson, Rod Odom, James Siakam).

## 2009-10 Postseason Player Accolades

Senior guard Jermaine Beal became the 51st Vanderbilt player to make the All-SEC First Team since voting began in the 1948 campaign. The Commodores have had a player on the first team in four out of the last five years, and six in the last nine. Vanderbilt's last first-team selection was Shan Foster in 2008 - Foster also claimed the league's Player of the Year honor.

Jeffery Taylor's selection is his first to the All-SEC second team. He made the All-SEC freshman team in 2009. A.J. Ogilvy's selection to the second team is his third in three years. He was named to the All-Freshman team in 2008, and named to the second team in 2008, 2009, and now 2010.

John Jenkins is the 10th Vanderbilt player to be named to the All-Freshman team, and only the second to claim the league's Sixth Man of the Year award. Scott Hundley was the only other Commodore to be awarded with the honor, when he won it in 2004.

## Stallings Wins SEC Coach of the Year in 2010

Vanderbilt head coach won his second SEC Coach of the Year award in 2010 in a vote by SEC Coaches. He was also awarded with the honor in 2007 by the league's coaches. Stallings was also named the District 21 Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches, and a finalist for the Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award.

## Quick 2009-10 Recap

- Vanderbilt made its 11th appearance in the NCAA Tournament, and its fourth since 2004. The Commodores lost a heartbreaking, 66-65, decision to Murray State in San Jose, Calif.
- With the win over Ole Miss on February 18, 2010, Kevin Stallings clinched his fifth 20-win season as head coach of the Commodores, and his ninth as a head coach. Stallings is one 20-win season away from tying legendary VU head coach Roy Skinner (1959, 1962-76), who had six.
- The Commodores went 12-4 in SEC play in 2009-10, the most conference wins since the 1992-93 season when the Commodores won the SEC regular season title with a 14-2 record. The 12 wins is a new league high under head coach Kevin Stallings.

- Vanderbilt finished SEC play with a 6-2 road record - the six wins is a new Stallings-era record for road league victories in a season, and ties for the most since divisional play began in the SEC in the 1991-92 season. The 1992-93 team also had six road wins in league play.
- The Commodores had a regular season sweep of Florida, the first since 2000-01, and Tennessee, the first time since the 2004-05 campaign. The last time Vanderbilt was unbeaten against Tennessee and Florida in the same season - 1966.
- The Commodores finished the season 14-2 in home games at Memorial Gym, the sixth time in the Stallings' era that Vanderbilt has finished with 14 or more wins at home.
- For the year, VU had 167 blocks, a new record for blocks in a season for a Vanderbilt team. The previous best was 137 blocked shots, which happened in 2008-09.
- Vanderbilt finished the regular season with 23 wins, which tied for third most in school history with the 1965 and 1974 teams ... Only the 1993 and 2008 teams had more regular season victories (25).
- Vanderbilt made 616 free throws in 2009-10, which is the second most in school history and most since making 742 during the 1989-90 season ... VU surpassed its total of 594 from the 1971-72 season.
- Vanderbilt was ranked in the Top 25 10 times in 2009-10 and for eight straight weeks. The number 13 ranking in the AP poll was Vanderbilt's best since January 7, 2008, when the Commodores also came in at the 13 spot in the Associated Press poll.

## Getting to the Line

In 16 SEC games, Vanderbilt went to the free throw line an SEC-best 471 times, an average of 29.4 times per game. In fact, the Commodores made 355 in SEC play, which is more than nine teams in the SEC attempted in league play. VU was first in the league in free throw percentage in all games (72.1, 616-854) and in SEC games only at 75.4% (355-471).

## Beal and Ogilvy Depart

Two Vanderbilt All-SEC players from 2009-10, Jermaine Beal and A.J. Ogilvy, have departed the Commodore roster for the 2010-11 campaign. Beal, who graduated in May, and Ogilvy, who left school early to pursue professional basketball opportunities, combined to score 36.4% of the team's points a year ago. Both also left as 1,000-point scorers.

## Taylor Adds 25 Pounds To Frame For 2010-11

Junior forward Jeffery Taylor, an All-SEC 2nd team member last year and a member of the All-SEC Defensive team, put on 25 pounds of muscle this offseason and is ready for a breakout season in 2010-11. Taylor has scored in double-digits in 45 career games, and has started every game of his Vanderbilt career.

### Jenkins Has Stellar Freshman Season

Sophomore sensation John Jenkins (6'4 guard, Hendersonville, Tenn.) has added 10 pounds to his frame and has been working tirelessly in the gym all summer. His 48.3% from three ranked as the third-best single-season three-point percentage in the program's history last year, and ranks as the 11th-best single season in SEC history. He also set a new freshman three-point made record with 72.

### Tinsley Has Big Shoes To Fill

Junior guard Brad Tinsley will assume the role of point guard after first-team All-SEC member Jermaine Beal's departure. Tinsley, who has assumed more of a leadership role with the team this summer, will be backed up by freshman Kyle Fuller. Tinsley will also see some time at the two-guard position. Tinsley hopes to return to his freshman-year form, when he averaged 11.0 points per game and made 69 threes. In 2009-10, his average dropped to 6.9 points per contest.

### Ezeli In The Middle

6'11 junior center Festus Ezeli is poised to take over for A.J. Ogilvy, who left school for professional basketball. Ezeli is already ranked eighth on Vanderbilt's all-time block list (65) and will provide a defensive presence for the Commodores in the paint for 2010-11.

### International Flavor

The Commodores sport a very wordly roster, with players from four different countries. , Festus Ezeli is from Nigeria, Jeffery Taylor is from Sweden, and Steve Tchiengang and James Siakam are from Cameroon.

### 3-Point Streak Continues Through 21st Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 762 consecutive games, a streak which began at the inception of the 3-point line in 1986-87. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (770) for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (649) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented.

### Commodores Add Four Freshmen In 2010-11

The Commodores have added four freshmen to the roster in 2010-11. Freshman point guard Kyle Fuller (6'1, 180), center Josh Henderson (6'11, 220), forward Rod Odom (6'9, 207), and James Siakam (6'7, 210) have joined the Vanderbilt roster.

### Vanderbilt And National Rankings

The Commodores ended the season ranked 26th in the nation in blocks (5.2 bpg), 29th in scoring offense (76.9), and 34th in field goal percentage (47.0).

No. 24 Vanderbilt shot 69 percent in the second half to overcome a five-point deficit at the break and beat Arizona 84-72 in the fifth-place game of the Maui Invitational.

A.J. Ogilvy had 20 points, seven rebounds and four blocks to lead the Commodores, who racked up 12 fouls on Arizona in the first half. Jermaine Beal added 18 points and five assists.

The Commodores (4-1) shot 53 percent from the field overall, including 7 of 20 from beyond the 3-point line to make up for woeful free-throw shooting -- 15 for 29.

Ogilvy had 13 points in the second half.

Arizona (3-2) was led by Solomon Hill's 17 points and Kyle Fogg's 10. Nic Wise, coming off a 30-point effort in an overtime win over Colorado, was limited to nine.

A.J. Ogilvy bumbled around the basket. Jeffery Taylor struggled to find his shot. Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings didn't mind. He still had Jermaine Beal available to rescue the Commodores.

Beal scored 25 points and Vanderbilt (No. 23 ESPN/USA Today, No. 21 AP) won its 10th straight game with an 85-76 victory over No. 14 Tennessee. It was Vandy's first win in Knoxville in five tries and its first win over a ranked opponent this season.

Stallings has plenty to feel good about besides Beal's clutch play. Vanderbilt (16-3, 5-0 Southeastern Conference) is off to its best start in the league since 1966.

The teams traded the lead until a 3-pointer by Brad Tinsley with 8:42 left put Vanderbilt up 59-56, a lead it did not relinquish.

Beal hit a layup and two 3s in less than a minute to give Vanderbilt control with a 74-60 cushion with 4:58 remaining.

J.P. Prince led Tennessee (15-4, 3-2) with 22 points, and Wayne Chism grabbed 16 rebounds. Scotty Hopson scored 14, while Maze added 12.

Vanderbilt shot 50.9 percent from the floor, the 11th time this season the Commodores have hit more than half their shots.

But it wasn't until the second half that they found their touch. Ogilvy finished with 12 after scoring two points in the first half. John Jenkins, Taylor and Tinsley each added 10 points.

And there were good looks aplenty for the Wildcats, who made 12 of 23 3-point attempts and dominated the boards, outrebounding Vanderbilt 41-22, leading to 20 second-chance points.

Darnell Dodson had 16 points in just his second start of the season. Eric Bledsoe had 13 points and seven rebounds while Patrick Patterson chipped in 12 points.

Jermaine Beal scored 17 points, and No. 18 Vanderbilt held off the Bulldogs 75-72, the Commodores' 11th win in 12 games.

Vanderbilt (17-4, 6-1 Southeastern Conference) bounced back after losing their first league game last weekend at then-No. 1 Kentucky. The Commodores had been on the road for four of the first six games in SEC play, and they looked very happy to be back home before a sold-out crowd where they hadn't lost this season.

But this hasn't been an easy series for the Commodores with Mississippi State having won seven of the past 10.

Taylor scored 16 of his career-high 26 points in the first half, and Vanderbilt (No. 24 ESPN/USA Today, No. 22 AP) never trailed in routing No. 12 Tennessee 90-71, grabbing sole possession of second place in the Southeastern Conference's Eastern Division, one loss behind Kentucky (No. 2 ESPN/USA Today, No. 3 AP).

The Commodores (18-5, 7-2) swept the season series against their instate rival for the first time since 2004-05 -- the season before coach Bruce Pearl took over Tennessee. They did it with the best shooting performance at the free-throw line in Stallings' 11 seasons at Vanderbilt, connecting on 37 of 43.

Jermaine Beal scored 20 points and A.J. Ogilvy had 11 for Vanderbilt, which didn't miss reserve John Jenkins. The freshman, who had been averaging 10.4 points, was hospitalized with the flu Monday and was so ill he needed five bags of fluid intravenously.

Vanderbilt (19-5, 7-2 Southeastern Conference) was without starting forward Andre Walker (shoulder) and reserve guard John Jenkins, who missed his second straight game due to the stomach flu.

Goulbourne, who averages just 13 minutes a game, shouldered most of the load Saturday, playing 26 minutes. He was big on the glass with nine rebounds and clutch at the free throw line, where he was 7 of 9.

After LSU's Tasmin Mitchell scored inside, A.J. Ogilvy hit two more free throws and Jermaine Beal tacked on a three-point play for a 68-61 lead with 2:06 left.

Beal scored 17 points, Jeffery Taylor added 15 and Ogilvy had 12 for Vanderbilt.

A.J. Ogilvy scored 27 points and made all eight free throws attempts in the final 4 minutes to lead No. 17 Vanderbilt to an 82-78 victory over Mississippi.

The Commodores (20-5, 9-2 Southeastern Conference) did it their way, grinding down the Rebels (17-8, 5-6) late with a relentless inside game that led to 34 free throw attempts -- three above their average in league play. Vanderbilt hit 19 of 22 free throws over the final 6:07 for its third straight win and 14th in 16 games.

Ogilvy was 8 of 10 from the field and 11 of 13 from the free throw line, while Jeffery Taylor added 19 points. Jermaine Beal hit 9 of 10 free throws to finish with 14 points.

Chris Warren led Mississippi with 23 points, but like many of the Rebels he spent much of the second half in foul trouble and was never a consistent threat.

Ole Miss opened the game with a flurry, scoring 16 points in the first 3:52 to take its biggest lead, 16-5. The Rebels were 5 of 6 from the field and 4 of 4 from 3-point range in that span. After that, though, they went cold, missing 18 of their next 22 shots and scoring just 12 more points in the half.

The Commodores hit 6 of 6 free throws during an 18-8 run in which the Rebels missed 4 of 5 attempts from the line. Murphy Holloway missed the first shot of a 1-and-1 -- his third failure to convert the bonus -- and Reginald Buckner missed two attempts as Vanderbilt made its move.

A.J. Ogilvy caught a long in-bounds pass by Darshawn McClellan, but his runner in the lane bounced off the rim at the buzzer.

Cousins led Kentucky with 19 points and Patrick Patterson chipped in 13.

Taylor scored 17 points for Vanderbilt, which was a woeful 2 for 20 from 3-point range.

Vanderbilt, the SEC's most prolific free-throw shooting team, used free throws to keep up with the Wildcats, and a pair by Taylor with 6:08 to go gave the Commodores a 49-45 lead, their largest of the game.

Downey came off a ball screen and hit a 3-pointer with 1:48 left to break a 69-all tie, and South Carolina upset Vanderbilt (No. 19 ESPN/USA Today, No. 13 AP) 77-73 in its regular season finale.

Downey had just four points in the first half, but the league's top scorer finished with 26 in rallying the Gamecocks. The senior said his teammates agreed to keep fighting.

Vanderbilt (23-7, 12-4) already had the No. 2 seed in the East locked up before blowing a 10-point lead by going cold from the floor for 9:20. The Commodores rallied and tied it for the ninth time at 69 on Jermaine Beal's 3-pointer.

Downey answered with his sixth 3, Beal missed his 3-pointer and also missed a layup on the next trip down the floor. South Carolina hit 2 of 4 free throws, and Downey avoided being fouled in the final seconds by passing upcourt where Stephen Spinella dunked to seal the victory.

Sam Muldrow added 20 points and nine rebounds for South Carolina.

Beal finished with 21 for Vandy in the senior's final home game, A.J. Ogilvy had 15 and Jeff Taylor 13. Beal finished as the winningest four-year player in Vanderbilt history with 90 wins.

John Jenkins scored 22 of his career-high 25 points in the second half, and Vanderbilt (No. 23 ESPN/USA Today, No. 20 AP) held off Georgia 78-66 in the Southeastern Conference tournament quarterfinals.

The Commodores (24-7) came in with only their third first-round bye since the SEC went to divisional play in 1992 as the East's No. 2 seed, and they managed to reach the semifinals for the first time since 2004 and just the second time in coach Kevin Stallings' 11 seasons.

Jenkins hit 5 of 8 from 3-point range. Jermaine Beal also had 16 points and A.J. Ogilvy had 10 points.

Georgia (14-17) couldn't recreate the magic of 2008 with four wins in four days. Travis Leslie had a career-high 34 points, and Trey Thompkins had 13, all in the second half.

Vanderbilt had lost the last two times after a first-round bye in this tournament. Georgia looked ready to make it three after beating the Commodores in Athens 72-58 on Feb. 6 and losing on the final possession 96-94 in overtime a couple miles away from the Bridgestone Arena on Feb. 25.

These teams looked ready to go to overtime for a second straight game in this series as they swapped the lead back and forth in the opening minutes. Beal's jumper put Vanderbilt ahead 10-9 with 15:16 left, and the Commodores never trailed again.

Phil Turner and Jarvis Varnado also added 11 for the Bulldogs, who won four straight games in the 2009 tournament for their first title in seven years. They received a first-round bye this time after sharing the SEC West Division crown with Mississippi, a team they beat twice this season.

Jermaine Beal scored 11 for Vanderbilt (24-8), which was hoping to reach the SEC tournament championship game for only the second time. The Commodores made the final and won in 1951 and have lost two other times in the semifinals since the league split into divisions in 1992.

With a 33-29 lead just after halftime, Mississippi State went on an 11-0 run. Kodi Augustus blocked a shot by Vanderbilt's Jeffery Taylor, and Bost made a fast-break layup to give the Bulldogs a 44-29 lead with 17:13 left.

Vanderbilt started to show signs of life when a three-point play by Taylor and a 3 by Brad Tinsley launched a 10-0 run. After a pair of free throws by Varnado, Tinsley sank another 3 to cut Mississippi State's lead to 51-48 with 5:37 left. The Bulldogs clamped down on defense and answered with a 9-1 run to seal the win.

When it went down, Murray State's players sprinted to the other end of the floor and fell into a celebratory pile beneath the basket. Vandy star A.J. Ogilvy slumped to the floor in defeat, while his teammates crouched near their bench in utter disbelief.

Vandy knew it could happen. The Commodores have been in this tough position before.

Vanderbilt used a 7-0 burst to build a 60-56 lead with 3:46 left this time, getting five straight points from John Jenkins. Isaiah Canaan and B.J. Jenkins then hit consecutive 3s for Murray State to regain the lead.

Vandy's Festus Ezeli missed a pair of free throws off the front of the rim with 2:28 remaining -- and the misses proved costly.

No Vanderbilt player reached double digits until Beal had 10 points with 17:21 left. He didn't score again until making the late free throws, finishing with 12. John Jenkins scored 13 and Ogilvy had 12 points and six rebounds.
