n their 1999 season **I** opener, the Commodores were determined to make a statement to Alabama and the rest of the SEC that this was not the "same old Vanderbilt."

The Commodores took a giant step toward earning that respect in a 28-17 loss. VU stood toe-to-toe with the Tide on a sweltering Dudley Field before Alabama's Heisman hopeful, Shaun Alexander, rallied his team to victory.

VU took a 7-0 lead

early in the second quarter when freshman WR Dan Stricker made his first career reception, scoring from 11 yards out.

Sophomore quarterback Greg Zolman pushed through the line from one vard out to give VU a 17-14 lead that held until the 10:00 mark of the 4th quarter.

Then, Alexander proved to be too much. The senior ran in for a three-yard touchdown and later got free in the Commodore secondary on a 51-yard pass that put the contest out of reach.

For the first time in two years, Vanderbilt did not commit a turnover in the game.

Things looked bleak I when Vanderbilt trailed NIU 28-3 at home late in the third quarter.

But the Commodores engineered a breathtaking comeback with three touchdowns in a sixminute span at the end of the third quarter and beginning of the fourth to cut the deficit to 28-23.

The teams exchanged

field goals in the fourth and the VU defense, out of timeouts, made a crucial stop on third down to force the Huskies to punt with less than two minutes.

Jimmy Williams fielded the punt, cut to his right, juked past a pair of would-be tacklers, and then burned his way down the sideline for a 65-yard touchdown with 1:41 to go.

The clock expired just as Northern Illinois entered field goal range to secure the largest comefrom-behind victory in school history.

#### Game 3

#### Mississippi

F or the second straight week, Vanderbilt battled back from an early deficit to claim victory in the waning moments. It was VU's first SEC road win in five years.

Greg Zolman rallied the Commodores from a 14-0 deficit as he threw for 344 yards, the most by a VU quarterback in 15 years. Zolman capped off the rally with a three-yard TD pass to Todd Yoder with 0:49 to play, sending the game into overtime.

The Rebels got a field goal in their opening possession in OT, but Zolman found TE Elliott Carson with an eight-yard TD pass to win it. It was the junior's 41st career reception in 22 starts but his first career TD grab.

Vanderbilt's defense played a key role in the comeback as Ole Miss did not convert on third down after the midway point of the second quarter.

The Commodores recovered from a slow start to spoil Duke's homecoming in a definitive 31-14 victory at Wallace Wade Stadium.

The game was scoreless until the final minute of the first quarter when Greg Zolman hit Elliott Carson for a nine-yard touchdown.

With the score tied 7-7 approaching halftime, momentum shifted to Vanderbilt when Jonathan

Shaub took a direct snap on a fake punt and ran 34 yards to the Duke 21. Two plays later, with 0:07 left in the second quarter, Zolman ran in on a fouryard keeper to put VU up 14-7 at the half.

The Commodores took command in the second half as Zolman scored on a one-yard run and Rodney Williams added a three-yard TD scamper. Williams' touchdown was set up by a Rushen Jones interception, his second of the game.

The win improved VU to 3-1 on the year, marking the team's best start since 1984 when the team went 4-0 to open the season.

### Mississippi State

V anderbilt's threegame winning streak came to a halt as No. 16 Mississippi State jumped out to a big halftime lead en route to a 42-14 victory.

Wearing gold jerseys for the first time since 1989, Vanderbilt never got on track, fumbling a handoff at its own 18 on the game's first play from scrimmage. Four plays later, MSU scored its first touchdown. The Bulldogs scored two touchdowns and made two field goals in the second quarter to take a 25-0 halftime lead.

Vanderbilt got on the board late in the third when Rodney Williams ran in from 20 yards out. On MSU's next possession, Doyle Crosby sacked Bulldog QB Wayne Madkin forcing a fumble that Jamie Winborn ran in for his first career TD.

Mississippi State's dominated the offensive and defensive lines where VU was held to 32 yards rushing in the game while VU yielded six sacks.

#### Game 6

#### The Citadel

Playing in a steady rain, Vanderbilt rained down on The Citadel, posting a 58-0 win on Homecoming.

The Commodores wasted no time in building their lead. Rodney Williams scored on a 59-yard TD run on VU's second play from scrimmage. After a Bulldog fumble, VU's next play was a 36-yard TD pass from Greg Zolman to Dan Stricker.

Less than four minutes into the game, VU was up 14-0. By the end of the first quarter, Williams had rushed for two more TDs to put the team up 28-0.

Early in the second quarter, Williams scored again, this time from 17 yards out. His four TDs was one shy of the school record. In the game, he had 127 yards on 10 carries, his fifth career 100-yard rushing effort. Vanderbilt took a 38-0 lead into the locker room at the half.

VU outgained The Citadel 476-119 in the game and cleared its bench in the second half as the reserves got some work.

V anderbilt let a potential upset of No. 14 Georgia slip away as the Bulldogs rallied from a 17-3 fourth quarter deficit to defeat the Commodores 27-17.

VU built a 17-0 lead on a John Markham field goal, a wide receiver option pass from Tavarus Hogans to QB Greg Zolman for a TD and a Lamont Turner 59-yard interception return for a touchdown. Vanderbilt held a 17-3 edge entering the fourth quarter, but Georgia scored quickly on a deflected pass to cut the deficit to 17-10. After an unsuccessful fake punt, Georgia got the ball back moments later on the VU 15 and three plays later tied the score.

Vanderbilt's ensuing drive saw Zolman get intercepted at the UGA 32. The Bulldogs drove down the field to take a 24-17 lead and would add a late field goal to account for the 27-17 final.

Four second half interceptions, three of them coming in Georgia territory, hurt Vanderbilt's upset bid.

The Commodore defense held USC to 163 yards of total offense in the game while the offense, although sluggish, produced when it counted.

The two teams traded field goals in the first half and headed to the lockeroom tied 3-3 at the break.

The Gamecocks would

go up 8-3 in the third quarter on a field goal and a safety which occurred when a short ball went between Jimmy Williams' legs and out of the back of the end zone.

Still trailing in the fourth, VU got the ball at its own 10 yard line and produced the team's longest drive of the year. The Commodores marched down the field, capping off a 90-yard drive with a three-yard TD pass from Greg Zolman to Todd Yoder. Yoder would also catch the two-point conversion pass.

A late, intentional safety accounted for the 11-10 final, VU's first ever win in the state of South Carolina in four tries.

he Commodore defense held Steve Spurrier's Fun n' Gun offense to historical lows, but the end result was a familiar one as Florida defeated Vanderbilt, 13-6, on Homecoming.

The Commodores' upset bid was unsuccessful despite an inspired game by Jared McGrath, who ran for a career-high 125 yards, helping Vanderbilt control the flow of what became a battle of ground games.

The Commodores

trailed 13-0 entering the fourth quarter, but a pair of John Markham field goals drew VU to within a touchdown late in the game.

VU got the ball back with 1:08 to go on its own 18, and QB Greg Zolman quickly drove the team down the field to the UF. 19. But the drive stalled and the Gators escaped.

Vanderbilt outgained UF by 100 yards, with the Commodore defense holding the Gators to their lowest total offense and passing yardage numbers ever at The Swamp under Spurrier. Vanderbilt had its chances on offense as all but three Commodore drives ended in Florida territory.

#### Game 10

### Kentucky

national television audience watched two 5-4 teams battle for an invitation to a postseason bowl, and in the end, it was the Cats who prevailed.

The teams traded touchdowns and field goals in the first half and went into the locker rooms deadlocked 10-10.

Kentucky posted a safety early in the second half when Zolman was flagged for intentional grounding in the end zone. The VU defense, which held UK under its season passing average by 168.7 yards, soon yielded its only big play of the day, an 80-yard TD, that put Kentucky up 19-10 after three quarters.

Vanderbilt rallied in the fourth. Zolman found Elliott Carson in the end zone for a two-yard TD with 5:20 to play, capping a 62-yard drive.

The VU defense recovered a fumble at the UK 40 with 3:10 to play. However, VU would fumble three plays later. The team's fourth turnover proved fatal as, without any timeouts left, UK was able to run out the clock to secure the 19-17 final.
