Vanderbilt Heads To Honda Puerto Rico Tipoff

After a history-making Friday night opening win against Presbyterian at Memorial Gym, the Commodores head to San Juan, Puerto Rico, for the 2010 Honda Puerto Rico Tipoff for an opening round game against Nebraska on Thursday afternoon. The game tips off at 12:30 p.m. CT and can be heard on the Vanderbilt Sports Network from IMG College and vucommodores.com, and will be televised on ESPNU.

Tinsley Makes History Against Presbyterian

Junior guard Brad Tinsley tallied Vanderbilt's first-ever triple-double against Presbyterian when he posted 11 points, 10 rebounds, and 10 assists. Tinsley, from Oregon City, Oregon, assumed the point guard role from the graduated Jermaine Beal, who was an all-SEC first-team selection in 2009-10. Tinsley garnered his first ever SEC Player of the Week honor on Monday afternoon.

Taylor Has Career-Best Night

Lost in the exuberance of Tinsley's triple double was junior forward Jeffery Taylor's career-high 27-point effort. Taylor was 11-for-12 from the floor against the Blue Hose, which tied Mike Rhodes' for the second-best field goal percentage in a single game with 10 or more attempts from the floor. Rhodes went 11-for-12 (.917) against Alabama on January 21, 1978. A.J. Ogilvy has the all-time record for a single-game field goal percentage (12-for-13, Auburn, 3/13/08).

Quick Hits From Presbyterian Game

- Vanderbilt now advances to 10-1 against Big South schools.
- Head Coach Kevin Stallings moves to 11-1 in season openers with the lone loss coming against Georgetown on November 15, 2006.
- Vanderbilt is now 52-7 in home openers at Memorial Gym.
- Vanderbilt has now made a three-pointer in 763 consecutive games, a streak that began in 1986, the first year of the three-point line.
- After a Presbyterian layup with 3:36 remaining in the first half, the Commodores went on a 20-0 run into the second half to take a 52-22 lead with 16:31 remaining.
- Vanderbilt had four players score in double-figures. Jeffery Taylor had 27, Brad Tinsley recorded 11, Festus Ezeli had 14 and John Jenkins topped it off with 10 points.
- Ten Vanderbilt players scored, while 13 saw game action.
- Vanderbilt's 41 point win was the largest margin of victory since a 93-52 win over Kentucky on February 12, 2008.
- The last time Vanderbilt held a team to less than 50 points was November 24, 2009 when Chaminade put up 41.
- The Commodores 22 assists were the most since they had 22 against Mercer on December 21, 2009.

Commodores In Preseason Tournaments

Vanderbilt has been successful in recent Thanksgiving tournaments, finishing runner-up at the 2006 San Juan Shootout, claiming the 2007 South Padre Island Invitational and the 2008 Cancun Challenge, and finishing 2-1 at the Maui Invitational in 2009.

About Nebraska

Nebraska is 2-0 after defeating Arkansas-Pine Bluff, 83-40, on November 15. Christian Standhardinger paced the Cornhusker effort with a 20-point, 11-rebound night against Pine Bluff. Standhardinger leads Nebraska in scoring after two games with a 15.0 points per game average. Junior college transfer Andre Almeida is next at 12.5 ppg.

In 2009-10, Nebraska finished the season 15-18 overall and 2-14 in Big 12 play.

Stallings Versus Nebraska

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings has never faced Nebraska in his career.

Stallings In Non-Conference Play

Entering his 12th season at the helm of the Commodores, Kevin Stallings is 130-45 in non-conference games and an astounding 96-8 in home non-conference games.

Vanderbilt Vs. The Big 12

Vanderbilt is 38-20 all-time against the Big 12. Nebraska is one of two Big 12 teams on the Commodore schedule in 2010-11 - Vanderbilt takes on Missouri on December 8 in Columbia.

3-Point Streak Continues Through 21st Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 763 consecutive games, a streak which began at the inception of the 3-point line in 1986-87. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (771) for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (650) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented.

Exhibition Games

Vanderbilt Vs. Southern Indiana

Vanderbilt knocked off Southern Indiana, 77-40, in their final exhibition game Monday night at Memorial Gym behind John Jenkins' 20-point effort. Jenkins was 5-for-12 from the floor, 4-for-8 from three, and 6-for-6 from the charity stripe in 26 minutes of action. Jeffery Taylor added 13 and Brad Tinsley chipped in 10 points in the winning effort, while Andre Walker led the team on the boards with eight rebounds.

It took the Commodores some time to get their offense going, but Vanderbilt's defense was stellar throughout the night. A 23-0 run at the end of the first half and the beginning of the second was enough to pull away from the Screaming Eagles, but VU's defense held Southern Indiana to 25.4% from the field for the game and only 1-for-17 from beyond-the-arc.

Vanderbilt Vs. Alabama-Huntsville

The Commodores defeated the Chargers, 69-53, behind a 19-point effort from sophomore guard John Jenkins, who was 8-for-16 from the field, had four rebounds, and blocked three shots in the win. Junior center Festus Ezeli added 12 points and seven rebounds, and junior forward Jeffery Taylor added 11 points and six rebounds.

Vanderbilt led 31-19 at the half and was up 42-34 with less than 12 minutes to go in regulation when the Commodores went on a 13-0 run to push the lead to 21 at 55-34. Vanderbilt shot 46.8% from the field and held the Chargers to 33.9% from the floor. The Commodores also blocked nine shots, and outrebounded Huntsville, 36-29.

Exhibition Stat Leaders

Sophomore guard John Jenkins led the team in scoring in the two exhibition games, averaging 19.5 points per game and making 6-of-15 from beyond-

Preseason Team Notes

Commodores Return Nine Scholarship Players From 2009-10

Vanderbilt returns nine scholarship players from 2009-10 and three walk-ons to the fold for the 2010-11 campaign. The Commodores' roster will sport three seniors (Joe Duffy, Darshawn McClellan, Chris Meriwether), seven juniors (Jeffery Taylor, Brad Tinsley, Andre Walker, Festus Ezeli, Steve Tchiengang, Lance Goulbourne, and Aaron Noll), two sophomores (John Jenkins, Jordan Smart), and four freshmen (Kyle Fuller, Josh Henderson, Rod Odom, James Siakam).

2009-10 Postseason Player Accolades

Senior guard Jermaine Beal became the 51st Vanderbilt player to make the All-SEC First Team since voting began in the 1948 campaign. The Commodores have had a player on the first team in four out of the last five years, and six in the last nine. Vanderbilt's last first-team selection was Shan Foster in 2008 - Foster also claimed the league's Player of the Year honor.

Jeffery Taylor's selection is his first to the All-SEC second team. He made the All-SEC freshman team in 2009. A.J. Ogilvy's selection to the second team is his third in three years. He was named to the All-Freshman team in 2008, and named to the second team in 2008, 2009, and now 2010.

John Jenkins is the 10th Vanderbilt player to be named to the All-Freshman team, and only the second to claim the league's Sixth Man of the Year award. Scott Hundley was the only other Commodore to be awarded with the honor, when he won it in 2004.

Stallings Wins SEC Coach of the Year in 2010

Vanderbilt head coach won his second SEC Coach of the Year award in 2010 in a vote by SEC Coaches. He was also awarded with the honor in 2007 by the league's coaches. Stallings was also named the District 21 Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches, and a finalist for the Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award.

Quick 2009-10 Recap

- Vanderbilt made its 11th appearance in the NCAA Tournament, and its fourth since 2004. The Commodores lost a heartbreaking, 66-65, decision to Murray State in San Jose, Calif.
- With the win over Ole Miss on February 18, 2010, Kevin Stallings clinched his fifth 20-win season as head coach of the Commodores, and his ninth as a head coach. Stallings is one

20-win season away from tying legendary VU head coach Roy Skinner (1959, 1962-76), who had six.

- The Commodores went 12-4 in SEC play in 2009-10, the most conference wins since the 1992-93 season when the Commodores won the SEC regular season title with a 14-2 record. The 12 wins is a new league high under head coach Kevin Stallings.

- Vanderbilt finished SEC play with a 6-2 road record - the six wins is a new Stallings-era record for road league victories in a season, and ties for the most since divisional play began in the SEC in the 1991-92 season. The 1992-93 team also had six road wins in league play.

- The Commodores had a regular season sweep of Florida, the first since 2000-01, and Tennessee, the first time since the 2004-05 campaign. The last time Vanderbilt was unbeaten against Tennessee and Florida in the same season - 1966.

- The Commodores finished the season 14-2 in home games at Memorial Gym, the sixth time in the Stallings' era that Vanderbilt has finished with 14 or more wins at home.

- For the year, VU had 167 blocks, a new record for blocks in a season for a Vanderbilt team. The previous best was 137 blocked shots, which happened in 2008-09.

- Vanderbilt finished the regular season with 23 wins, which tied for third most in school history with the 1965 and 1974 teams ... Only the 1993 and 2008 teams had more regular season victories (25).

- Vanderbilt made 616 free throws in 2009-10, which is the second most in school history and most since making 742 during the 1989-90 season ... VU surpassed its total of 594 from the 1971-72 season.

- Vanderbilt was ranked in the Top 25 10 times in 2009-10 and for eight straight weeks. The number 13 ranking in the AP poll was Vanderbilt's best since January 7, 2008, when the Commodores also came in at the 13 spot in the Associated Press poll.

Getting to the Line

In 16 SEC games, Vanderbilt went to the free throw line an SEC-best 471 times, an average of 29.4 times per game. In fact, the Commodores made 355 in SEC play, which is more than nine teams in the SEC attempted in league play. VU was first in the league in free throw percentage in all games (72.1, 616-854) and in SEC games only at 75.4% (355-471).

Beal and Ogilvy Depart

Two Vanderbilt All-SEC players from 2009-10, Jermaine Beal and A.J. Ogilvy, have departed the Commodore roster for the 2010-11 campaign. Beal, who graduated in May, and Ogilvy, who left school early to pursue professional basketball opportunities, combined to score 36.4% of the team's points a year ago. Both also left as 1,000-point scorers.

International Flavor

The Commodores sport a very wordly roster, with players from four different countries. , Festus Ezeli is from Nigeria, Jeffery Taylor is from Sweden, and Steve Tchiengang and James Siakam are from Cameroon.

Commodores Add Four Freshmen In 2010-11

The Commodores have added four freshmen to the roster in 2010-11. Freshman point guard Kyle Fuller (6'1, 180), center Josh Henderson (6'11, 220), forward Rod Odom (6'9, 207), and James Siakam (6'7, 210) have joined the Vanderbilt roster.

Vanderbilt And National Rankings

The Commodores ended the season ranked 26th in the nation in blocks (5.2 bpg), 29th in scoring offense (76.9), and 34th in field goal percentage (47.0).

McClellan Redshirting

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings announced after the Alabama Huntsville game that senior forward Darshawn McClellan will redshirt the 2010-11 season. He is on track to graduate in May with a degree in Human and Organizational Development and will have one year of eligibility remaining.

Memorial Magic - The Home To Vanderbilt Hoops Since 1952

HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM IN 59TH SEASON

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 59th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renowned for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last four home games against the top team in the country, most recently, a 72-69 victory over in-state rival Tennessee on February 26, 2008.

- The Commodores have posted a 696-188 (.787) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.
- VU concluded the 2007-08 season 19-0 at Memorial Gym. It marks the most games won at Memorial Gym in one season, and the sixth time a Vanderbilt team has gone undefeated at home.
- Vanderbilt has won 116 of its last 123 home games against non-conference opponents.
- Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 163-15 non-conference record at home (.915 win percentage).
- The Commodores are 96-8 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.
- The Commodores have posted six undefeated seasons at home.
