LAST TIME

Vanderbilt dropped to 15-15 overall and finished the regular season 7-11 in SEC play after falling to Ole Miss, 65-62, on Saturday in Oxford. Junior Dai-Jon Parker scored a career-high 25 points to lead all scorers in the game. Freshman Damian Jones posted his fifth career double-double with 10 points and 11 rebounds, while fellow freshman Luke Kornet added a career-high 13 points in a career-high 34 minutes. For the game, Vanderbilt shot 40% from the floor and outrebounded the Rebels, 38-35. The deciding statistic was free throws, with the Rebels making 24 of 39 from the line, while VU was 14 for 16.

SEC TOURNY

Vanderbilt will be the 11th seed at the SEC Tournament for the first time since the tournament was reinstated in 1979. The Commodores have been a 10 seed on two other occasions - 1985 and 2013. Vanderbilt has advanced to the semifinals of the last four tournaments, and won their first SEC tournament crown since 1951 in 2012 when the Commodores defeated #1 Kentucky.

TERRIFIC 10

The Commodores have seven scholarship players and ten overall on the roster after Josh Henderson was lost for the season with a left knee injury Dec. 5 against Marshall and Eric McClellan was dismissed from the team on January 10.

ODOM LEADS DORES

Rod Odom was recently named to the All-SEC 2nd Team by league coaches after averaging a team-leading 13.6 points this season. He has made three or more threes in a game on 14 occasions in 2013-14, scored 20 or more points seven times this year, is sixth in the league in three-point field goal percentage (.385) and fourth in threes made (2.7). Earlier this year, Odom won the SEC Player of the Week for his performances against Tennessee and Arkansas, when he averaged 24.0 points and 4.0 rebounds per game in the two games.

JONES SEC ALL-FRESHMAN

Freshman post player Damian Jones has had an outstanding freshman campaign, and was named to the All-SEC Freshman team by the league's coaches to prove it. He is averaging 11.1 points and 5.7 rebounds per contest, has scored in double figures in 19 games this season, and has five double-doubles on the season, including the regular season finale at Ole Miss (11 points, 10 rebounds). He won SEC Freshman of the Week when he averaged 16.5 points and 5.5 rebounds in games against Missouri and Auburn earlier this year.

RANKED IN SEC

Five of Vanderbilt's seven scholarship players are ranked in the top 10 in the SEC in one category or another, with Rod Odom leading the way (ranked in four different categories).

VU AND THE SEC TOURNY	<p>★ Vanderbilt will be the #11 seed at the 2014 SEC Tournament in Atlanta. It is the first time Vanderbilt has ever been an 11 seed.</p> <p>★ Vanderbilt owns a 37-50 all-time mark at the SEC Tournament. THE SEC TOURNAMENT IN ATLANTA	The SEC Tournament returns to Atlanta, Ga., this week for the 14th time in tournament history. Vanderbilt is 9-13 all-time in the tournament when it is held in Georgia. The Commodores are 7-10 in the Georgia Dome (1995, 1998-2000, 2002, 2004, 2007, 2008, 2011), 0-1 in the Omni (1987), and 2-2 in the Atlanta Athletic Club (1933-34).
STALLINGS AT SEC TOURNAMENT	Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings is 12-12 all-time at the SEC Tournament, and has advanced to the semifinals five times and the finals once during his previous 14 trips. The Commodores advanced to the semifinals in 2004 at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta and in the last four seasons at the Bridgestone Arena in Nashville (2010, 2013), the Georgia Dome in 2011, and the New Orleans Arena in 2012. His Commodore team made the finals and won the tournament championship in 2012.

WORK- HORSES

With VU down to seven scholarship players, a few players have logged some major minutes in SEC play. Guard Dai-Jon Parker has played the full 40 minutes eight times since league play began, with Rod Odom and Kyle Fuller doing it five times apiece. The trio is 1, Parker (38.3 mpg), 2, Odom (36.8), 6, Fuller (35.1) in minutes played in SEC play. Only one other player has played the full 40 minutes in league play this year (Trevor Releford, vs. LSU).

678-668

Vanderbilt is 678-668 all-time in Southeastern Conference play. VU is in their 80th SEC season.

BLOCK PARTY

The Commodores currently have 135 blocks as a team this year, which already places them fifth on the all-time list for team blocks in a season. The record is 171, which came in the 2009-10 season. James Siakam (1.4) and Damian Jones (1.4) lead Vanderbilt this season in blocks.

FULLER

Senior point guard Kyle Fuller is having a solid senior season, averaging 11.0 points per game in all games and 11.9 points per game in league play. Fuller is ranked second in the SEC in assists in all games (4.2) and is also second in SEC games only (4.5). Fuller has scored in double-figures in 16 games this season, and has had 11 games with five or more assists. He has two double-doubles, with the first coming against Tennessee with 12 points and 10 assists, and added his first career double-double with a 17-point, 10-assist game vs. Kentucky.

CONTRIBUTING WALK ONS	Two Commodore walk-ons, Carter Josephs and Nathan Watkins, played significant minutes at Auburn and helped Vanderbilt to a win on February 22. The two entered the game at the 8:12 mark of the first half with the team trailing, 27-11, and left the game with 12:03 to go in regulation with the Commodores leading 47-45. Each played 16 minutes, with Josephs dishing out a career-high nine assists, and Watkins adding a career-high seven points and three rebounds. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented.

The Commodores added senior manager Rob Cross to the roster on January 16. Cross served as the senior manager for the last two seasons, and has been a part of the program for four years. RECAP & NOTES

OXFORD - Marshall Henderson scored 18 points, Jarvis Summers added 12 and Mississippi rallied to beat Vanderbilt 65-62.

Ole Miss (18-13, 9-9 Southeastern Conference) won for just the second time in eight games. The Rebels trailed for almost the entire afternoon, but pushed ahead 61-60 on two free throws by Henderson with 3:36 remaining.

Henderson struggled with his shot on his senior day, finishing 5 of 19 from the field, including 2 of 13 from 3-point range, but he hit several clutch free throws in the final minutes.

Vanderbilt (15-15, 7-11) lost its fourth straight game. Dai-Jon Parker scored a career high 25 points and Luke Kornet also had a career high with 13. The Commodores had a chance to tie the game in the closing seconds, but Nathan Watkins missed a 3-pointer just before the buzzer.

Ole Miss won despite struggling to shoot from just about everywhere on the floor. The Rebels made just 18 of 54 (33.3 percent) shots from the field, including 5 off 22 (22.7 percent) from long range. The Rebels did force Vanderbilt into 17 turnovers.

Parker led the Commodores with 12 points in the first half while Kornet added 11.

Vanderbilt stretched its lead to 44-32 early in the second half before a Henderson 3-pointer stopped the rally. It was one of the few times the Commodores let him get a decent look from long range.

The Rebels continued their methodical comeback throughout the second half.

Ole Miss couldn't get any separation until Martavious Newby hit a pair of free throws to give the Rebels a 65-62 lead with 26.6 seconds left. A defensive stand in the final seconds helped secure the win, with Watkins getting a hurried look as time wound down.

Notes:

★ Dai-Jon Parker scored a career-high 25 points.

★ Freshman Luke Kornet also tallied a career-high (13 points) in a career-best 34 minutes.

★ The deciding statistic of the day was free throws - Ole Miss was 24-39 from the free throw line, while the Commodores were 14-16.

★ Vanderbilt outrebounded the Rebels, 38-35, and also outshot Ole Miss, 40% to 33.3%.

★ Damian Jones added the fifth double-double of his career with 10 points and 11 rebounds.

★ Freshman Carter Josephs received his first career start against Ole Miss and dished out five assists in 21 minutes played.

HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM IN 62ND SEASON

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 62nd season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renowned for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

VANDERBILT BASKETBALL QUICK HITTERS

- This is the 112th year of Vanderbilt basketball, with the first season taking place in 1900-01. There were no teams in 1904-05 and 1905-06.
- The Commodores have been to 13 NCAA Tournaments and 11 NIT's. Vanderbilt advanced to the Elite 8 in 1965 (field of 23), and the Sweet 16 in 1988, 1993, 2004, and 2007. The Commodores captured the NIT Championship in 1990 and finished runner-up in 1994.
- The Commodores are a charter member of the SEC, with the 2013-14 season being the 80th year in the conference.
- Vanderbilt is the only private institution in the SEC with the lowest enrollment of any of the 14 schools (6,738).
- Vanderbilt's Perry Wallace became the first African-American scholarship basketball player in the SEC when he took the court in 1967.
- The Commodores have 43 career 1,000-point scorers, with Shan Foster (2004-08) the all-time leading scorer with 2,011 career points.
- Vanderbilt has had 12 All-Americans since 1950. They are: Billy Joe Adcock (1950), Clyde Lee (1965), Tom Hagan (1969), Jan van Breda Kolff (1974), Will Perdue (1988), Billy McCaffrey (1993), Dan Langhi (2000), Matt Freije (2004), Derrick Byars (2007), Shan Foster (2008), and John Jenkins (2011).
- The Commodores had three players drafted in the first 31 picks of the 2012 NBA Draft - John Jenkins, Atlanta, 23rd pick, Festus Ezeli, Golden State, 30th pick, Jeffery Taylor, Charlotte, 31st pick - the most by the Commodores in one draft. In all, 35 Vanderbilt players have been selected in the NBA Draft since 1950.
- The Commodores ended a 61-year SEC Tournament drought in 2012 by claiming the tournament championship in New Orleans, the team's first SEC championship since 1951.
- Coach Stallings is the winningest coach in Vanderbilt history after surpassing legendary mentor Roy Skinner on November 15, 2013, against Lipscomb.
- Stallings has led his Commodore teams to 10 postseason tournaments since his arrival in 1999 and has had seven 20+-win seasons. His 2004 and 2007 teams advanced to the Sweet 16 for the first time since the tournament expanded to 64+ teams.
- Stallings has appeared in the NCAA Tournament six times, including a stretch of three consecutive appearances from 2010-2012. It was the first time in school history that Vanderbilt has advanced to three consecutive NCAA Tournaments.
- All three of the university's top all-time scorers played for Coach Stallings (Foster, Jeffery Taylor, Matt Freije). John Jenkins, who is 10th on the list, also played for him.
- Vanderbilt's intercollegiate athletics teams are nicknamed the Commodores, in honor of the nickname given to founder Cornelius Vanderbilt, who made his fortune in shipping. Vanderbilt donated \$1 million to begin "Central University" in 1875 - the campus was later renamed for Cornelius because of his generosity. Cornelius never stepped foot on the campus that bears his namesake.

AUSTIN - Isaiah Taylor had 14 points and eight assists and Texas won its first game against a power conference team this season in a 70-64 victory over Vanderbilt on Monday.

Demarcus Holland and Javan Felix each scored 12 points for Texas (7-1). Felix went 2 of 3 from beyond the arc and Kendall Yancy contributed 11 points and six rebounds.

The Longhorns led by as many as 13 points in the second half and were able to hold off Vanderbilt (4-3), which trimmed the Longhorns lead to one point in the final minute after an Eric McClellan steal and dunk.

Felix sunk a pair of key free throws to make it 65-62 before Holland's three-point play with 12.6 seconds left sealed the win.

Austin native McClellan scored a team-high 22 points for Vanderbilt while Josh Henderson scored 12 points on 5 of 8 shooting and Rod Odom had 11 points.

Texas needed second-half comebacks in four of its previous six wins this year but started the game on an 8-2 run and never looked back. The Longhorns led for the final 39 minutes of the game, using a 16-3 run to take a 31-25 halftime lead.

Vanderbilt trimmed Texas' lead to three points when Henderson knocked down a jumper to make it 57-54 with 2:30 left to play.

Then, Taylor helped the Longhorns take control of the game down the stretch. He completed a three-point play and hit a floater following a steal by Holland all in less than 30 seconds to give Texas a 62-54 lead with 1:47 to go.

The Longhorns initially struggled from the free throw line, making just 10 of 16 attempts before knocking down five straight in the final 24 seconds.

Texas, whose victory Monday came in the first-ever Big 12-SEC challenge, has now won 46 consecutive home games against unranked non-conference opponents. The Longhorns have also won seven of their first eight games for the first time in three years.

NASHVILLE - Vanderbilt held on to win the game with a money shot and a big stop, but also lost a seasoned player to injury in a 69-67 victory over Marshall.

Dai-Jon Parker sank a 3-pointer just inside the final minute to give the Commodores (5-3) a 69-65 lead over the hard-charging Thundering Herd (4-4). Shawn Smith sank his final two free throws and Marshall had a chance to tie it on a drive into the paint before James Siakam stole the ball.

"We changed and had a small lineup, not knowing they also changed and had a small lineup," VU Coach Kevin Stallings said. "James (Siakam) came off and defended on a ball screen. He tends to give guards trouble because he has a seven-foot wingspan. Obviously their coach thought he got fouled."

"James made a very good defensive play. I'm proud of him for that nine seconds - at that point anything can happen."

Siakam and freshman center Damian Jones scored 15 points apiece, and Rod Odom added 11 points including two 3-pointers.

Vanderbilt junior center Josh Henderson, however, suffered a knee injury at 11:15 of the first half right after back-to-back blocks by his teammates on a Herd fast break. Initial indications are a torn ACL and MCL, with an MRI scheduled to confirm the damage.

"It's tough because he was playing well," Stallings said. "He really improved in the offseason and had three really good games in a row. I'm disappointed for him."

Jones, starting his fifth straight game, played a career-high 28 minutes and was a force inside. Marshall Coach Tom Herrion said the freshman from Baton Rouge, La., had the chance to be "something special" and played like he had even more points and rebounds than Jones actually did.

Jones' 3-point play a half-second before intermission handed Vanderbilt the largest lead of the first half at 35-26. He powered in a basket after halftime, then slammed in a dunk on a loose ball for a 41-30 advantage.

Point guard Kareem Canty, last week's Conference USA freshman of the week, led the Thundering Herd with 18 points. His third 3-pointer of the game cut what had been a 13-point lead to 66-65, and Marshall put the ball in Canty's hands for the chance to tie.

NASHVILLE - Rod Odom scored 18 points -- including four 3-pointers -- and Vanderbilt rallied from 14 points down in the first half to end Georgia Tech's three-game win streak 76-63.

Dai-Jon Parker added 13 points and a pair of treys, while Kyle Fuller came off the bench to score 12 points for the Commodores (7-3).

Daniel Miller had 11 of his 16 points in the first half for the Yellow Jackets (8-4). He then went 27 minutes without a field goal, scoring his final five points in the last 3 minutes of the game. Miller, who has started all 105 games in his Tech career, finished with 10 rebounds.

Miller extended Georgia Tech's advantage to 25-15 on a three-point play. Stacey Poole Jr. then had back-to-back baskets to push the lead to 29-15 on a 12-0 run.

Vanderbilt, which cut a 14-point deficit to 31-29 at halftime, opened the second half with a 9-2 run. Odom's second 3-pointer of the game put the Commodores ahead 34-33 for their first lead since 11-10, and Vanderbilt stretched it to 43-36 on five straight points by Kyle Fuller.

Solomon Poole's third 3-pointer cut it to 43-39, but Shelby Moats sank a trey for Vanderbilt. The Commodores then pushed it out to 52-39 on Odom's jumper, Luke Kornet's 2-of-3 free throws, and Eric McClellan's dunk after a steal.

The Commodores completed a 29-point turnaround to take a 56-41 advantage with 10:21 left on Fuller's drive and subsequent assist to Kornet. The Yellow Jackets scored only 10 points over a period of 17-plus minutes and were outscored 41-12 during the decisive run.

Odom, who missed only one of five 3-point shots, hit two 3-pointers during an 11-4 spurt down the stretch to hold off the Yellow Jackets. Parker added his own 3-pointer to give Vanderbilt its largest lead at 71-54.

NASHVILLE - Jordair Jett scored 17 points to spark Saint Louis to its sixth straight victory, 57-49 over host Vanderbilt.

After trailing much of the game, Rob Loe had back-to-back baskets, including a dunk after Jett's steal, to put Saint Louis back on top 41-40 with 6:49 left -- its first lead since midway through the first half. Saint Louis stretched it to 49-44 on Dwayne Evans' steal and subsequent dunk on the fast break with 2 minutes left.

Damian Jones scored 12 points to lead the Commodores (7-4), who saw a three-game win streak end with its first home court loss this season. It was Vanderbilt's lowest offensive output at Memorial Gym since scoring 43 in back-to-back losses in February 2002.

The Billikens' defense, ranked fourth in the nation in points allowed and 3-point percentage, held Vanderbilt to 33.9 percent shooting overall and 17.6 percent from beyond the arc (3 of 17). Commodore leading scorer Rod Odom went 0-for-8 from 3-point range and scored just six points.

Evans, the Billikens' leading scorer, cut his first basket just after halftime, and SLU then cut it to 27-25 on Jett's fast-break. Evans and McCall scored nine points apiece, and Evans also got a key rebound during the stretch run on Jett's missed free throw and made one of his two free throws.

Glaze finished with 10 rebounds and Evans added nine.

Saint Louis shot ahead 6-0 on three straight drives with Jett scoring the first two buckets after neither team scored the first 3 1/2 minutes.

Vanderbilt closed to 6-5 on Damian Jones' inside basket and Dai-Jon Parker's 3-pointer, but the Billikens pushed ahead 11-5 with their own 5-0 run capped by McCall's 3-pointer.

The Commodores took their first lead at 12-11 on one of two free throws by Eric McClellan after putbacks by James Siakam and Jones. Jones then threw down a dunk on an alley-oop and finished off an 11-0 run with a turn-around jumper for a 16-11 lead.

Austin McBroom's two straight treys put Saint Louis back ahead 17-16, but Luke Kornet nailed a 3-pointer to spark an 11-2 Vanderbilt spurt. The Commodores took their largest lead at 27-19 on McClellan's jumper and led 27-21 at halftime.

BATON ROUGE, La. - Johnny O'Bryant scored 22 points and grabbed 12 rebounds as LSU defeated Vanderbilt 81-58.

O'Bryant had struggled in the past four games -- three of which were Tigers losses. O'Bryant averaged ten points and six rebounds in those four games. In LSU's overtime defeat at Ole Miss last Wednesday, O'Bryant had only six points and five rebounds.

Going against a Commodores team with just seven scholarship players available, O'Bryant was 5-of-10 from the field and 11-of-14 at the foul line. The 22 points were his most since the season-opener at Massachusetts when he scored 25 points. The 12 rebounds were O'Bryant's second most of the season.

Jordan Mickey had 13 points for the Tigers (11-5, 2-2). Jarell Martin and Andre Stringer scored 11 and 10 points, respectively. Rod Odom led Vanderbilt (9-7, 1-3) with 20 points. Damian Jones had 16 points, while Dai-Jon Parker finished with 10.

O'Bryant was dominant in the opening half for LSU with 13 points and 10 rebounds. He even made his first 3-pointer of the season in the first 20 minutes.

The Tigers took control of the game with a 10-0 run during the middle of the opening half. O'Bryant started the outburst with two foul shots which tied the score at 11-11 with 12:22 remaining before halftime. A basket by Martin on the next possession gave LSU the lead for good.

Mickey made one of two free throws and Tim Quarterman connected on a 3-pointer. A basket by Stringer put the Tigers in front 19-11 with 9:17 remaining in the half.

Vanderbilt came no closer than five points during the rest of the first half. A pair of foul shots by both O'Bryant and Quarterman in the last 90 seconds gave LSU a 35-25 lead at the break.

The Tigers didn't allow the Commodores to cut into their comfortable halftime advantage. Back-to-back field goals by O'Bryant and Malik Morgan put LSU on top 45-32 with 16:16 remaining in the game. Vanderbilt came no closer than nine points the rest of the way.

NASHVILLE - Marshall Henderson struggled with Vanderbilt's sticky defense trying to keep the Mississippi guard under control. As usual, he hit the biggest shots of the night helping the Rebels pull out another key win.

Henderson hit back-to-back 3-pointers in an 11-point spurt where Mississippi took control of a 63-52 win over Vanderbilt after blowing a 13-point lead in the second half.

The Rebels (13-5, 4-1 Southeastern Conference) now have won three straight overall and leave Memorial Gym with back-to-back wins in a place where they had won in only six of their first 5

ATHENS, Ga. - Rod Odom scored 16 points as Vanderbilt defeated Georgia 59-54 and ended the Bulldogs' eight-game home winning streak.

Odom scored Vanderbilt's (11-8, 3-4 SEC) last field goal with 3:23 to play, nailing a 3-pointer to put the Commodores up 44-36. Vanderbilt made 15 of 21 free throws the rest of the way to thwart any comeback efforts by Georgia (10-9, 4-3).

Dai-Jon Parker scored 15 for Vanderbilt, and Kyle Fuller added 13 -- 10 of those from the line.

Charles Mann led Georgia with 20 points, hitting 9 of 11 free throws. The Bulldogs shot 27 percent from the field and a woeful 4 for 23 from behind the 3-point line.

Brandon Morris's 3-point basket 90 seconds into the game launched Georgia to an early 8-2 lead. But the Bulldogs did not make another 3 in the first half, missing 11 straight. The streak reached 17 straight misses before Georgia hit three of its last five 3-pointers in the last minute of a desperation comeback attempt.

The teams were tied 12-12 after Morris hit one free throw with 10:17 to play, but Vanderbilt went on a 13-2 run, highlighted by Odom's four-point play.

The Commodores twice led by as much as 10 points, the last time at 27-17 after two free throws by Fuller with 4:51 to play. Vanderbilt did not score again in the first half.

Georgia managed to narrow the gap to 27-21 with 3:42 to play, and then the Bulldogs did not score again in the half.

Georgia took a different approach to start the second half as point guard Mann started to penetrate, getting two early layups and a free throw to help tie the game 28-all with 17:20 to go.

However, Vanderbilt regained the lead. The Commodores never put together a dramatic run, but gradually pulled away from the struggling Bulldogs.

Walk-on Taylor Echols hit a 3-pointer with 57.3 seconds to play that closed the gap for the Bulldogs to 51-44. Another 3-pointer by Mann with 15.8 seconds left cut it to 56-52, but an intentional foul on Georgia's Kenny Paul Geno gave Vandy a chance to ice the game with 3 of 4 free throws.

Morris added 12 points for Georgia, which had not lost a home game since arch-rival Georgia Tech won 80-71 Nov. 15.

NASHVILLE - Slow down the game by using up as much of the shot clock each possession as possible or playing zone on defense, the Vanderbilt Commodores are willing to do whatever it takes.

Now they're starting to string together some victories.

Rod Odom scored 18 points, and Vanderbilt beat Mississippi State 55-49 for their third straight win.

"All the ones that we win are probably going to be just like this," Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings said. "They're probably going to be dog fight, grind-it-out games where we've got to make some plays down the stretch and at the end. And I'm proud of our team because we're getting better at doing that."

The Commodores (12-8, 4-4 Southeastern Conference) have to work harder because they're down to only seven scholarship players. Kyle Fuller added 14 points playing a full 40 minutes for his fourth game since league play started in January, and Dai-Jon Parker notched his sixth such game. Odom got a minute of rest in the first half that kept him from his fifth.

Vanderbilt returned to Memorial Gym after winning its first two road games this season and started a three-game home stand by adding yet another win over Mississippi State. The Commodores held the Bulldogs to a season-low in points in winning their fourth in five games in this series.

Damian Jones also had 13 for Vanderbilt, helping the Commodores to a 26-16 scoring edge in the paint.

Mississippi State (13-8, 3-5) now has lost three straight, scoring a season-low in each of the last two. The Bulldogs also extended their road skid to 13 straight. Coach Rick Ray noted Thursday night's loss was to No. 3 Florida and now a good Vanderbilt team on the road.

Thomas scored 16 points for the Bulldogs. Craig Sword, the Bulldogs' leading scorer averaging 13.9 points a game, didn't score until he hit a jumper with 11:18 left. He finished with four points.

Vanderbilt outshot the Bulldogs 44.7 percent (21 of 47) compared to 40.4 percent (19 of 47). Ray said his Bulldogs' shooting woes are "well documented." But he wasn't happy with his Bulldogs turning the ball over 18 times, which Vanderbilt turned into 24 points.

NASHVILLE - Michael Qualls sank a 3-pointer with 4 seconds remaining to lift Arkansas to its first road victory of the season in a 77-75 win that ended Vanderbilt's four-game win streak.

Qualls finished with 17 points for the Razorbacks (15-8, 4-6 Southeastern Conference). Coty Clarke added 14, Rashad Madden scored 12 and Mardracus Wade had 11.

Rod Odom scored 22 points and Kyle Fuller had 20 for the short-handed Commodores (13-9, 5-5), who have only seven scholarship players. Fuller's two free throws with 11.6 seconds left gave the Commodores a 75-74 lead, and Odom missed a jumper on the buzzer.

Fuller hit one of two free throws and Siakam made an inside bucket as Vanderbilt went ahead 71-68 with 3 minutes left after a 12-0 run. Madden's 3-pointer, however, ended the Razorbacks' drought and evened the game again.

Damian Jones scored 12 points for Vanderbilt, and Dai-Jon Parker had 11 including 3-for-4 from 3-point range.

The Razorbacks' hot shooting (15 of 22 for 68 percent the first 16 minutes) and full-court press (nine first-half steals) were on the Commodores' small roster. Vanderbilt played only eight including a walk-on due to injury, dismissal and departures.

Parker picked up his fourth foul with 16 minutes to go just after his 3-pointer pulled the Commodores within 51-48. Wade's three-point play on the foul pushed Arkansas back out to 54-48, and Bobby Portis stepped out for a 3-pointer for the largest lead at 57-48.

Fuller did a flip after being fouled on the break following Siakam's block, the basket dropped in and Fuller -completed the three-point point play to cut it to 68-62. Vanderbilt then tied it after Siakam had two big defensive plays, stealing an interior pass before Odom's 3-pointer and taking a charge before Jones powered it in for a tie at 68.

Clarke had 11 first-half points on the way to a 20-17 Razorbacks lead, including nine straight during an 11-5 run.

Arkansas scored seven straight points for a 27-19 lead on Qualls' first 3-pointer and two steals off the press that led to Jaremy Williams' back-to-back baskets. But the Commodores retook the lead 31-30 with a 12-3 spurt including four free throws by Fuller and consecutive treys by Parker and Fuller.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - For a kid from the South, snow on the ground is a rare treat. For Sindarius Thornwell, this season's two snow storms have meant strong performances and South Carolina victories.

Thornwell scored 19 points to lead the Gamecocks to a 65-59 victory over Vanderbilt in a game delayed because of a winter storm that postponed Wednesday night's regularly-scheduled tipoff.

The only other Southeastern Conference victory for South Carolina (9-15, 2-9) came on another snow day that closed campus back on January 29th. And Thornwell had 19 points in that victory over Texas A&M.

The Gamecocks will likely have to rely more on the play of their 6-foot-5 freshman guard instead of waiting on Mother Nature to send more snow the rest of the season.

Thornwell has scored in double digits in eight of the Gamecocks' 11 league games. He turned things up when his team needed it with 13 of his points coming in the second half.

Thornwell's value was seen at the end when Vanderbilt had cut a 13-point lead to 58-52 on Rod Odom's 3-pointer with 2:52 remaining. That's when Thornwell hit a foul shot, then followed with a bucket to give the Gamecocks back some breathing room. He scored six of his team's final seven points.

Stallings said he didn't believe his players were affected by the delay or extra time in town. "We're not a program that looks for excuses," he said. Duane Notice's 3-pointer with 13:59 left put South Carolina ahead for good, 41-38. Thornwell added a 3-pointer moments later for a 44-40 lead and started a 17-5 run as the Gamecocks took control.

Brenton Williams added 14 points for South Carolina and Notice 10.

Kyle Fuller led the Commodores with 20 points. Freshman center Damian Jones had 16 points, 10 rebounds and a career-high seven blocks for Vanderbilt.

The Gamecocks held Vanderbilt's top scorer, reigning SEC player of the week Odom, to 3-of-9 shooting for 10 points, five fewer than his season's average.

South Carolina moved in front 58-45 on Brian Steele's fast-break finish with 3:58 to go. Vanderbilt put together a final charge with seven straight points to draw within 58-52 on Odom's 3-pointer.

But Thornwell added a foul shot and a bucket to restore the big margin and South Carolina closed things out.

COLUMBIA, Mo. - Jordan Clarkson scored 21 points, including all 11 free throw attempts, as Missouri held off Vanderbilt 67-64.

Earnest Ross added 16 points for the Tigers (19-7, 7-6 SEC), who survived an off-game from top scorer Jabari Brown in a matchup of schools tied for fifth place in the conference. Brown, held to nine points on 3 for 11 shooting, averaged 23.9 points the previous 10 games including 22 the first meeting at Vanderbilt last month.

Damian Jones had 19 points and seven rebounds for Vanderbilt (14-11, 6-7). Down eight points with just over two minutes to go, the Commodores shaved the deficit to two on Shelby Moats' 3-pointer with 19.4 seconds to go.

Kyle Fuller's bid to force overtime on a shot that drew iron from beyond midcourt came after the buzzer. Fuller made just one of 12 shots and had four points, eight below his average.

Missouri helped make the finish exciting by going 6 for 12 at the free throw line the final 1:31.

Clarkson scored nine points in the final six minutes, including three baskets in a 13-2 run that put the Tigers up 61-53.

Vanderbilt led 21-20 at the half with both teams shooting 33 percent and enduring lengthy dry spells. Missouri went nearly seven minutes without a point and Vanderbilt was scoreless more than 4 1/2 minutes before Jones's tip-in to end the half for the lead.

The first-half scoring total was a season-worst by five points for Missouri. Vanderbilt's season low was 19 points its last time out against Texas A&M.

AUBURN, Ala. - Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings turned to the walk-ons to get his team out of its early lull.

Then, the Commodores finished the job with Dai-Jon Parker and a barrage of 3-pointers. Parker scored a career-high 21 points and Vanderbilt rallied from a 16-point deficit to beat Auburn 67-59.

The Commodores (15-11, 7-7 SEC) made 10 of 18 3-pointers in the second half after hitting just one before halftime. With Rod Odom nursing a sore leg and the team struggling, Stallings turned to walk-ons Nathan Watkins and Carter Josephs for a spark with 8 minutes left in the half.

"Our bench by and large was better than our starters," Stallings said. "That hasn't happened much but I wasn't going to watch that garbage that I watched the first eight or nine minutes. We were down and I said to hell with that, we're going to put some guys in who are going to play hard."

Parker led Vandy's 3-point barrage with three in a row during an 18-4 run early in the second half. He was 5 of 9 from 3-point range.

Damian Jones scored 14 points and Luke Kornet added 10.

KT Harrell and Chris Denson each scored 13 points for Auburn. But that was 14 shy of the combined average for the nation's No. 2 scoring duo.

Harrell was just 4-of-15 shooting and Denson made 3 of 15 shots.

Vanderbilt, which had lost three of four games, trailed 29-13 with less than seven minutes remaining in the first half before pulling to within seven by halftime.

The Commodores were 23-of-52 shooting (44.2 percent) in addition to clamping down on the Tigers' shooters. Auburn was 21 of 62 (33.9 percent) and made just 4 of 24 3-pointers (16.7 percent).

Kyle Fuller's 3-pointer with 2:28 left gave Vanderbilt its biggest lead, 66-57.

Auburn didn't end its drought until Allen Payne's jumper in the final minute.

Parker hit three consecutive 3-pointers during an 18-4 run early in the second half to give the Commodores their first lead, going ahead 43-38. Vandy's six baskets during that stretch were all 3s.

The Commodores, down to seven scholarship players, had to turn to the walk-ons with several starters having foul trouble.

Watkins, who hadn't played more than two minutes in a game, had seven points in 16 minutes. Carter Josephs dished out nine assists with no turnovers.

KNOXVILLE - Antonio Barton had a season-high 21 points and a career-high six assists Saturday as Tennessee trounced cold-shooting Vanderbilt 76-38.

Barton's 21 points were three off his career high. Barton scored 24 against Tennessee State while playing for Memphis on Jan. 2, 2011.

Jarnell Stokes added 12 points and 11 rebounds for Tennessee. Kyle Fuller had nine points for Vanderbilt (15-13, 7-9).

Before Saturday, Tennessee's most one-sided victory over Vanderbilt was a 56-21 blowout on Feb. 22, 1947. The most one-sided win by either team is a 108-68 Vanderbilt triumph on Jan. 8, 1991.

Vanderbilt finished the game with more turnovers (14) than baskets (11).

The Vols entered Saturday's game on the NCAA tournament bubble. Tennessee's inconsistency had turned up the pressure on Vols coach Cuonzo Martin, who is seeking his first NCAA bid in his third season on the job.

The performance was a stark contrast from Tennessee's 64-60 loss at Vanderbilt on Feb. 5.

In the first meeting between these two teams, Vanderbilt shot 60 percent in the first half and owned a 12-point lead early in the second half. In Saturday's rematch, Tennessee led 41-18 at halftime.

Tennessee got a big contribution from Barton, who had struggled for much of the season. After losing his starting job in late January, Barton moved back into the starting lineup Wednesday in a 75-68 victory at Mississippi State.

Barton shot 3 of 4 from 3-point range and had four assists in the first half Saturday. He stayed hot in the second half as Tennessee led by as many as 40 points and never trailed in the game.

Any hopes for a Vanderbilt comeback pretty much vanished when starting center Damian Jones picked up his second, third and fourth fouls in the first 80 seconds of the second half. Jones' foul trouble tested the depth of a Vanderbilt team that has only seven healthy scholarship players.

Rod Odom, who scored a career-high 26 points in Vanderbilt's Feb. 5 victory over Tennessee, scored just four points and shot 1 of 7 in the rematch.

NASHVILLE - Johnny O'Bryant scored 25 points and grabbed 10 rebounds as LSU rallied from a 16-point deficit in the first half to beat Vanderbilt 57-51.

The Tigers (18-11, 9-8) also snapped a seven-game road skid in the Southeastern Conference with their first win away from home since Jan. 11. They overcame a poor shooting first half where they hit only 8 of 30 (26.7 percent) and survived two scoring droughts, the second that stretched 6:49.

Andre Stringer added 11 points for LSU, which hit all eight free throws in the final 3:23 for the win.

Vanderbilt (15-14, 7-10) lost its third straight and fourth in five games with the two senior starters struggling to shoot on Senior Night. Rod Odom was 4 of 18 and finished with 15 points. Point guard Kyle Fuller missed his first seven shots and wound up 2 of 15 with seven points.

The Tigers started like they forgot when tipoff was. They missed eight straight shots twice in the first half and went 6:49 without scoring as Vanderbilt outshot and outthrew them. Vandy took its biggest lead at 28-12 on a pair of free throws by Odom.

LSU finished the first half with a 12-4 run to pull within 32-24 at halftime, and it opened the second half with an 11-5 spurt with Shavon Coleman's two free throws pulling the Tigers within 37-35 with 14:55 remaining. That set up a tight finish with the Commodores hitting just enough shots to keep their lead until they went cold.

Odom missed 10 straight shots before his 3-pointer went down with 6:26 left for a 46-41 lead. O'Bryant scored, and Stringer hit two free throws to pull LSU within 46-45. Fuller drove for a layup with 5:25 left, but Vanderbilt didn't hit another bucket. The Commodores wound up 6 of 29 (20.7 percent) in the second half.

O'Bryant hit two free throws with 3:23 tying it at 49, and Coleman hit two more with 3:02 left giving LSU a 51-49 lead -- its first since the opening bucket of the game. The Tigers just padded the lead down the stretch as Vanderbilt missed shot after shot.

Things went so well in the first half for Vanderbilt that walk-on Nathan Watkins hit a 3-pointer seconds after checking in, and added a reverse layup after Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings had yelled for one of his Commodores to go into the paint. O'Bryant finally ended the Tigers' scoring drought with a jumper with 2:32 left, starting the Tigers' on their 12-4 finish to the half.
