SCORING LOST	The Commodores lost their first, third, and fourth leading scorers from 2013-14 in seniors Rod Odom, Kyle Fuller, and junior Dai-Jon Parker. Odom, a second-team All-SEC selection by the league's coaches, averaged 13.6 points per game, while Fuller added 11.0 ppg and Parker 8.3 ppg. Odom and Fuller both graduated, while Parker transferred for his senior season.						
DIV. II	Trevecca will be Vanderbilt's first regular season Division II opponent since playing Chaminade in the EA Sports Maui Invitational on November 24, 2009 (W, 68-41).						
KORNET	Sophomore seven-footer Luke Kornet was one of only eight seven footers in the SEC in 2013-14, but was the only one who shot threes on a regular basis. Kornet finished 21-89 for the season, and was one of only two to have shot a three in 2013-14 (Darcy Malone, LSU, 3-7 in 2013-14). Against Ole Miss in Oxford, he scored a career high 13 points in a career-best 34 minutes of action.						
SEC NETWORK+	Vanderbilt will produce four contests this season in house for the SEC Network Plus Digitial Network, with Trevecca leading off the broadcasts. Local radio personality Kevin Ingram and former Commodore player Ross Neltner will serve as the talent for the game against the Trojans, with the game being produced by Doug Stanton, a former producer for WGN Sports, where he produced Cubs, Blackhawks, and Bulls games, and for FSN Midwest, where he produced St. Louis Cardinals broadcasts.						
STRONG 2015 SIGNING CLASS	Head Coach Kevin Stallings recently signed four players to National Letters of Intent for next season - Djery Baptiste, a 6'11 center from Plano, Texas, Camron Justice, a 6'2 guard from Hindman, Kentucky, Samir Sehic, a 6'9 forward from Cypress, Texas, and Joseph Toye, a 6'7 wing from Chicago, each signed with the Commodores on the first day of the signing period on November 12.

FISHER, THOMPSON COURTSIDE TO CALL Action on Vanderbilt Radio Network From IMG College

Joe Fisher and Tim Thompson are back at courtside this season, describing the action of every Commodore game to Vanderbilt followers throughout the Southeast.

Fisher, the Voice of the Commodores, will anchor Vanderbilt play-by-play for the 17th consecutive year. A Nashville native, Fisher also handles the play-byplay broadcasting duties for Commodore football and a

Select number of baseball games. He also serves as the Director of Broadcasting for Vanderbilt Student Athletics. Prior to working for Vanderbilt, Fisher served as a

television sports anchor in the Nashville market (1987-1996), with stints at WSMV-4 and WKRN-2. He also worked in the public relations field for two years.

Thompson, who is in his 14th year providing color commentary, played for Vanderbilt from 1975-79, receiving the Outstanding Leader and Civitan Sportsmanship Awards. He currently works with Nike College Sports Marketing.

Broadcast Engineer Bob Horner is in his 32nd year courtside producing broadcasts of Commodore basketball. During his tenure, Horner has worked more than 750 games for Vanderbilt.

The broadcasts are produced by IMG College, the exclusive multi-media rightsholder for Vanderbilt. Jeff Miller is the general manager.



RECAP

NASHVILLE- Damian Jones scored 14 points and had eight rebounds and paced the Commodores to a 67-38 win over Sewanee Tuesday night in the team's final exhibition game of the season at Memorial Gym.

A pair of freshmen, Shelton Mitchell and Wade Baldwin IV, also added 12 points apiece in the first meeting since 1961 between the two inaugural members of the Southeastern Conference.

"It was an okay performance for not shooting the ball worth a darn." said Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings. "We didn't shoot it at all really from the foul line or from the three. We defended and rebounded particularly towards the end of the game. Towards the end, I thought we started getting more aggressive on the offense. I thought Jeff Roberson in the second half gave us some good minutes, and he gave us ten rebounds.'

The Commodores did not have the shooting night it had against Illinois-Springfield in the exhibition opener, but Vanderbilt out rebounded the Tigers, 47-31, and held Sewanee to only 28.6% from the floor. The Commodores also forced 14 Tiger turnovers.

Although Vanderbilt never trailed in the game, the Commodores had to overcame a sluggish start early on against the Tigers. VU led by only two at 9-7 with 12:24 to go in the first half, but the Commodores reeled off 18 consecutive points to push their lead to 27-7 and led 30-11 at the half.

After shooting 37.5% from the floor in the first half, the Commodores were more efficient from the floor in the second half, converting on 46.2% of its attempts from the field. Vanderbilt held its largest lead at 30 with 6:56 to play in regulation.

Vanderbilt outscored Sewanee, 34-14, in the paint and 19-9 in points off of turnovers for the game.

Another freshman, Jeff Roberson, was the team's leader in rebounding with 10. Mitchell and Jones each added eight rebounds apiece.

"Rebounding has been part of my game," said Mitchell. "My coaches since I was younger always said I needed to rebound, just because it starts the break up faster, so hopefully I can keep on rebounding like I am, so we can start the break quicker. "

Keshonn Carter was the Tigers' leading scorer on the night with eight points.

HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM IN 63RD SEASON

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 63rd season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.






