Vanderbilt And Tennessee To Meet For Second Time This Season

#22/24 Vanderbilt will take on intrastate rival and the program's most frequent opponent #12/12 Tennessee this Tuesday night in a nationally televised game at Memorial Gym. Tip off is set for 6 p.m. CT, and the game can be seen live on ESPN and ESPN360.com. The radio call can be heard on the Vanderbilt-ISP Radio Network and vucommodores.com, with Joe Fisher and Tim Thompson courtside with all of the action.

The Commodores and Volunteers will meet for the 177th time Tuesday night and for the second time this season. Tennessee holds a 108-68 advantage in the all-time series, but Vanderbilt came away with an 85-76 win over the Volunteers in Knoxville earlier this year on January 27. Senior point guard Jermaine Beal carried the Commodores to the win with a 25-point performance, which tied a Vanderbilt individual best this season.

Beal has had a great start to conference play, averaging 17.4 points per game in the team's first eight SEC contests. He has scored 20 or more points three times in league play this year, including 21 points in Vanderbilt's most recent game, a 72-58 loss at Georgia on Saturday evening. Beal is shooting 47.9% from the floor in the eight games and 44.2% from three.

The Commodores struggled in their loss at Georgia, shooting only 32.8% from the floor and 26.1% from three in the game. It was Vanderbilt's second-lowest shooting percentage of the season - the Commodores shot only 27.5% against Cincinnati at the Maui Invitational on November 23. It was only the third game this season that VU has shot less than 40% and Vanderbilt has a 1-2 record in those games (only win was over Alabama).

Besides Beal's performance, Vanderbilt had a solid outing from sophomore shooting guard Brad Tinsley, who scored a season-high 18 points. Beal and Tinsley were 14-26 from the floor against the Bulldogs, while the rest of the team was only 5-for-35. Sophomore Jeffery Taylor and junior A.J. Ogilvy, who came into the game averaging double figures, could only muster eight and six points, respectively. Freshman sharpshooter John Jenkins was held to only one point and was 0-for-9 from the floor and 0-for-7 from three.

Beal leads the team in scoring, averaging 14.4 points per contest. Ogilvy is averaging 13.5 points per game, while Taylor (13.3) and Jenkins (10.4) also average double figures.

Notes From First Tennessee Game

- The Commodores handed Tennessee their first home loss of the season.
- The Commodores' last win in Knoxville was in 2005, an 88-63 win against the Vols.
- The win over UT made VU 3-0 on the road to start SEC play for the first time since 1964-65.
- It was the first time this season that Vanderbilt won the game directly following their entrance into the Top 25.
- Five players scored in double figures (Beal, Ogilvy, Taylor, Tinsley, Jenkins) for the Commodores for the first time since the MTSU game on January 4.
- Jermaine Beal scored 25 points, a season-best, for the 'Dores, leading all scorers...the eight field goals made for Beal was a new career high (8-12).
- Beal logged a season-high 38 minutes of action and also had two assists and a steal with no turnovers.
- Andre Walker contributed in all ways with nine points, seven rebounds, and five assists.
- Vanderbilt had four players with five rebounds or better - Walker (7), Ezeli (5), Ogilvy (7), and Tinsley (5).

Record Against Ranked Foes

The Commodores are 80-200 all-time against ranked opponents and 1-1 this season (win over Tennessee, loss to Kentucky). Vanderbilt has a 25-46 record against ranked opponents in the Stallings' Era.

Vanderbilt At Memorial Gym

The Commodores are 11-0 so far this season at home, and have a 16-game home winning streak dating back to January 25, 2009 (loss to Florida).

Commodores And The Top 25

Vanderbilt has been ranked five times so far this year in the Top 25 - in the most recent poll, the Commodores came in at number 22 (AP) and 24 (ESPN/USA Today) in both polls.

6-2 SEC Start

Is the best for a Vanderbilt team since the 1992-93 season, when VU captured the SEC East title and advanced to the Sweet 16. The 1992-93 team finished the SEC campaign 14-2 that year.

VU Back To Familiar Surroundings

The Commodores began a stretch of five out of their next six at home against Tennessee on Tuesday night.

Tennessee enters the game ranked as the 12th team in the nation and has a 18-4 overall record and a 6-2 mark in SEC play. Tennessee has a three-game winning streak heading into Tuesday's game after defeating South Carolina in their most recent time out in Knoxville Saturday.

Scotty Hopson leads all Tennessee players in scoring with 13.2 points per game, while Wayne Chism adds 13.0 points per contest. Chism also leads the Vols on the glass with a 7.0 rebounding average.

Vanderbilt's Record Against the SEC

Vanderbilt has a 621-622 all-time record against the schools that currently comprise the SEC.

Stallings Versus Tennessee

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings has a 10-12 overall record against Tennessee as a head coach and is 5-5 against the Volunteers at Memorial Gym.

Vanderbilt has three road trips left - at Ole Miss, at Arkansas, and at Florida.

Road Success

Vanderbilt is 3-2 so far on the road in SEC play - the three wins is only one shy of a Stallings-era record for road league victories in a season. The Commodores won four games on the road in the 2005-06 campaign, and won three road games in 1999-00 and 2006-07. The 3-0 start on the road in league play was the best for a Vanderbilt team since 1964-65.

Stallings Now In Second Place On All-Time VU Wins List

Vanderbilt head coach Kevin Stallings, who won his 300th career game as a head coach last season, got his 200th win as Vanderbilt coach against Middle Tennessee State on January 4. He is in sole possession of second place on the all-time Vanderbilt wins list after surpassing Bob Polk's mark of 197 wins against Manhattan.

Now in his 17th season as a head coach, Stallings has the third most wins in the SEC among current coaches (Bruce Pearl, Billy Donovan) and 206 in his 11-year career at Vanderbilt. Stallings trails only Roy Skinner (278, 1962-76) on the all-time coaching wins list.

50% From the Floor...

Vanderbilt has converted 50% or more of its shots from the field in 11 games so far this season, and have a 11-0 record in those games.

FIRST MEETING WITH TENNESSEE

A.J. Ogilvy bumbled around the basket. Jeffery Taylor struggled to find his shot. Vanderbilt coach Kevin Stallings didn't mind. He still had Jermaine Beal available to rescue the Commodores.

Beal scored 25 points and Vanderbilt (No. 23 ESPN/USA Today, No. 21 AP) won its 10th straight game with an 85-76 victory over No. 14 Tennessee. It was Vandy's first win in Knoxville in five tries and its first win over a ranked opponent this season.

Stallings has plenty to feel good about besides Beal's clutch play. Vanderbilt (16-3, 5-0 Southeastern Conference) is off to its best start in the league since 1966 and will head to No. 1 Kentucky with control of the SEC East.

For Tennessee it meant a second straight conference loss after falling at Georgia on Saturday. The Volunteers host Florida on Sunday.

The teams traded the lead until a 3-pointer by Brad Tinsley with 8:42 left put Vanderbilt up 59-56, a lead it did not relinquish.

Beal hit a layup and two 3s in less than a minute to give Vanderbilt control with a 74-60 cushion with 4:58 remaining.

J.P. Prince led Tennessee (15-4, 3-2) with 22 points, and Wayne Chism grabbed 16 rebounds. Scotty Hopson scored 14, while Maze added 12.

Vanderbilt shot 50.9 percent from the floor, the 11th time this season the Commodores have hit more than half their shots.

But it wasn't until the second half that they found their touch. Ogilvy finished with 12 after scoring two points in the first half. John Jenkins, Taylor and Tinsley each added 10 points.

You Never Know What You're Going To Get...

Vanderbilt has had five different leading scorers (Beal, Ogilvy, Taylor, Tinsley, Jenkins), five different leading rebounders (Goulbourne, McClellan, Ogilvy, Taylor, Walker), five different assist leaders (Beal, Jenkins, Taylor, Tinsley, Walker), and seven different leading shot blockers (Ezeli, Goulbourne, Jenkins, McClellan, Ogilvy, Tinsley, Walker) so far this season. Eight different Commodores have scored in double figures this season.

Beal Eclipses 1,000-Point Barrier Vs. Auburn

Senior guard Jermaine Beal became the 40th player in Vanderbilt history to the 1,000-point mark after registering 14 points against Auburn. He is the team's second 1,000-point scorer - A.J. Ogilvy became the first sophomore in VU history to go over the 1,000-point mark last season.

Big Shot Beal

Beal tied a 2009-10 single game high in scoring with a 25-point effort in a 85-76 win over Tennessee on January 27, the Commodores' first win in Knoxville in four years. Beal scored 10 points in a 23-5 Vanderbilt run late in the second half to give the Commodores a cushion they would use the rest of the way to come away with the win.

Beal Also Sees Scoring Increase

Jermaine Beal has seen his scoring increase in every year of his career. So far in 2009-10, he is averaging 14.4 points per game. Last season, he pumped in 12.5 points per game, the team's second highest scoring average, and increased his scoring from his sophomore to junior season by nearly five points (4.9). He averaged 3.8 points per game as a freshman and 7.6 points per game as a sophomore.

VU Block Party

For the year, VU has 125 blocks, and is averaging 5.7 blocks per game, which is ahead of the clip set by last year's team, which set the school record for blocks in a season. Vanderbilt blocked 137 shots in 2008-09, a rate of 4.4 per game.

Ogilvy Grabs SEC Player of the Week Honor

A.J. Ogilvy won his first SEC Player of the Week award for the week of November 30-December 6 after averaging 22.0 points and 6.0 rebounds against Missouri and DePaul, respectively. It was the first player of the week honor for the 6'11 center from Sydney, Australia - he won three SEC Freshman of the Week awards in the 2007-08 season.

Ogilvy Reaches Milestone Vs. Lipscomb

A.J. Ogilvy tallied three blocks against Lipscomb on November 16, which gave him 100 blocks for his career, making him the second Commodore to post 1,000 points and 100 blocks in a career. Vanderbilt great Will Perdue is the only other VU player to accomplish the feat, with 1,281 points and 157 blocks. Ogilvy is only the fourth Vanderbilt player to eclipse the 100-block barrier in his career.

Double-Digit Man

Ogilvy has scored in double-figures in 74 out of 85 games in his three-year career at Vanderbilt. He has 21 career 20+-point outings and has had eight double-doubles in his career.

Ogilvy On Career Lists

Junior A.J. Ogilvy has already made the all-time records list in scoring and blocks after only two years and change of competition. Ogilvy currently has 1,323 points, which places him in 20th place all-time. His total of 133 blocks puts him in second place overall for blocks in a career.

Ogilvy And The 20-Point Barrier

Ogilvy has scored 20 or more points in 21 games in his three-year Vanderbilt career, and the Commodores are 20-1 in those games. Also, when he attempts 10 or more free throws, VU is 16-2 in his three-year career.

International Flavor

The Commodores sport a very worldly roster, with players from five different countries. A.J. Ogilvy is from Australia, Festus Ezeli is from Nigeria, Jeffery Taylor is from Sweden, and Steve Tchiengang is from Cameroon.

Walker Returns From Torn ACL And Excels

Andre Walker, a 6'7 guard/forward who tore his ACL against Middle Tennessee State on November 24, 2008, returns from the injury after extensive rehab. Walker, who redshirted the season last year because of the injury and is a sophomore this year, has started in all but one game so far this year and is averaging 6.0 points and 5.4 rebounds per game. Walker has four games this season with at least five assists, and has either tied for the team lead or led the team in assists eight times this year.

Hinkle Transfers

6'6 redshirt sophomore Charles Hinkle has decided to transfer after the fall semester. Hinkle, from Los Alamitos, Calif., averaged 1.4 points and 0.5 rebounds in 10 games in the 2009-10 season, and 1.8 points and 0.8 rebounds in his two-year Vanderbilt career. Hinkle sat out the 2007-08 season as a redshirt.

Festus For The Rest Of Us

6'11 redshirt sophomore big man Festus Ezeli has started five games this season and has filled in nicely for

the Commodores when spelling A.J. Ogilvy.

Against Southern Miss on January 2, Ezeli came off of the bench and added eight points, four rebounds, and three blocks for Vanderbilt, and against MTSU on January 4, he scored a season-high 10 points to go along with three blocks. Against Mississippi State and the Bulldogs' Jarvis Varnado, he scored five points and had a career-high seven rebounds.

Commodores Add John Jenkins To The Fold

Vanderbilt had one signee in 2008-09, John Jenkins from nearby Station Camp High School in Gallatin, Tenn. Jenkins, a 6'4 shooting guard, led all high scorers last season at 42.3 points per game and scored more than 30 points in every one of his games last year as a high school senior. He converted 62% of his shots from the floor and 47% from three and also made 88% of his free throws in his senior year. So far in 2009-10, Jenkins has scored in double figures 15 times and is averaging 10.4 points per game.

Jenkins Impresses

Jenkins has scored in double figures in 11 out of his last 13 games. Earlier this year against Southern Miss on January 2, Jenkins tied a Memorial Gym record for three-point field goal percentage, making 6-of-6 from beyond the arc in route to a 20-point effort against the Golden Eagles. Jenkins tied Barry Booker, Kevin Anglin and Dawid Przybyszewski for the gym record. All four of the players that hold the record went 6-of-6 from beyond the arc.

Jenkins Grabs Back-to-Back Freshman Of The Week Honors

Jenkins won two consecutive SEC Freshman of the Week awards for the first two weeks of January of 2010. He was honored for his performances against Middle Tennessee State and Florida January 4-11, when he averaged 13.0 points and 4.0 rebounds in two Commodore wins over the Blue Raiders and Gators. He was also named the SEC Freshman of the Week for his performances against Manhattan and Southern Miss December 27-January 4, when he averaged 17.5 points, 3.5 rebounds, and 3.0 assists in the wins over the Jaspers and Golden Eagles.

3-Point Streak Enters 22nd Season; VU One Of Three Teams To Hit A Trey In Every Game Since 1986-87 Season

Vanderbilt has made a 3-pointer in 751 consecutive games after the 2008-09 campaign. The Commodores rank second only to UNLV (760, 2/7) for the longest streak in Division I basketball. Vanderbilt, UNLV and Princeton (640, 2/7) are the only three schools in college basketball to have made at least one 3-pointer in every game played since the 3-point line was implemented for the 1986-87 season.

Vanderbilt Signs Three In Early Period

Head Coach Kevin Stallings announced that guard Kyle Fuller, center Josh Henderson, and forward Rod Odom have signed a National Letter of Intent to attend Vanderbilt and play basketball for the Commodores beginning in the fall of 2010.

Fuller, a 6'1 point guard from Moreno Valley, Calif., averaged nearly 20 points and nine assists per game in 2009 as a junior to lead his Rancho Verde High School team to a 24-6 record and trip to the sectional quarterfinals. This summer, he averaged almost 25 points and 10 assists per contest for his Inland Empire 17 and Under AAU Squad. Fuller will be the Commodores' third player from California on the roster, joining Festus Ezeli and Darshawn McClellan.

Fuller chose the Commodores over California, UCLA, and Marquette.

Henderson, a 6'11 center, comes to Vanderbilt from Roanoke, Va., where he plays at Cave Spring High School. He averaged 17.0 points, 11.0 rebounds, and 4.0 blocks per game as a junior with the Knights. Henderson, who has maintained a 3.5 GPA in high school, chose the Commodores over Davidson, Virginia, and Wake Forest.

6'8 forward Rod Odom, from Bellport, N.Y., closes out the early signing class for the Commodores. Odom, ranked the 77th best prospect in the nation by ESPN.com, is a long, athletic forward who averaged 16.5 points, 11 rebounds, five assists and three blocks at Middlesex School in Concord, Mass., as a junior. Odom chose Vanderbilt over Arizona, Boston College, Georgia Tech, Louisville, and West Virginia.

Taylor and FG%

Earlier this season against Tennessee State on December 19, he was 10-for-11 (90.9%) from the floor in a 20-point effort on December 19, which set a new individual single-game FG% record at Memorial Gym. The previous record was 90.0 (minimum 10 attempts) by Vanderbilt's Brett Burrow on Feb. 16, 1985 against Tennessee.

Commodores Knock Off St. Mary's

Vanderbilt knocked off St. Mary's, 72-70, on November 20 to open a four-game road swing that included the 2009 EA Sports Maui Invitational. Vanderbilt handed St. Mary's only their third non-conference loss in their last 29 games in McKeon Pavilion, with Jeffery Taylor leading the way for VU with 19 points.

The Commodores returned home from their trip to Maui with a record of 2-1, with wins coming over host Chaminade and Arizona, and Vanderbilt's lone loss coming against Cincinnati in the first round of the tournament. Senior guard Jermaine Beal led four players in double figures in the three games in Maui, averaging 14.7 points per game. Junior center A.J. Ogilvy averaged 13.0 points, sophomore forward Jeffery Taylor added 11.0 points, and true freshman guard John Jenkins chipped in 10.7 points per contest.

Team Shoots Well Vs. Tennessee State

The Commodores converted on 67.9% of its shots from the floor (36-53), which set a new record for single-game field goal percentage in the Stallings era. The previous best came on March 13, 2008, against Auburn at the SEC Tournament in the Georgia Dome, when the Commodores connected on 67.3% (33-49) of their shots from the field.

2009-10 PRESEASON NOTES

Returning for the Commodores...

The Commodores return 14 letterwinners from a year ago, including all five starters for a team that finished with a 19-12 overall record and an 8-8 record in SEC play in 2008-09. Vanderbilt missed the postseason for the first time for the first time since the 2002-03 season and only the second time in the Kevin Stallings era, which began prior to the 1999-00 season. However, the Commodores were the eighth-least experienced team in the nation in 2008-09 according to KenPom.com, and the team won eight out of its last 11 regular season games, including a win over SEC regular champion LSU in Baton Rouge on March 4.

Senior point guard Jermaine Beal is back after leading the SEC for the second consecutive season in assist-to-turnover ratio, while also increasing his scoring average to 12.5 points per game as a junior, a 4.9 point-per-game increase from his sophomore season. Beal, from DeSoto, Texas, is one of the program's hardest workers and will lead the Commodores as the only senior on the squad.

The other four starters returning for Vanderbilt include junior center A.J. Ogilvy (15.4 points, 7.1 rebounds per game), sophomore forward Jeffery Taylor (12.5 points, 6.2 rebounds), sophomore guard Brad Tinsley (11.0 points, 2.5 rebounds), and a combination of Steve Tchiengang (3.6 points, 3.1 rebounds) and Darshawn McClellan (2.1 points, 3.0 rebounds) at the power forward position.

Other returning letterwinners include redshirt sophomore wing Charles Hinkle, redshirt sophomore center Festus Ezeli, sophomore forward Lance Goulbourne, redshirt sophomore forward Andre Walker, junior forward Joe Duffy, and walkons Chris Meriwether and Aaron Noll.

6'6 guard Jordan Smart returns after redshirting a year ago, and the only newcomer to the fold, freshman guard John Jenkins, also joins the team.

Walk-on junior guard Elliott Cole will miss the entire season due to a shoulder injury.

Player Accolades

Then-sophomore center **A.J. Ogilvy** was named to the All-SEC second team by the league's coaches at the end of the 2008-09 campaign and was an honorable mention selection by the league's media after averaging 15.4 points and 7.1 rebounds per game, both team highs. Freshman **Jeffery Taylor** was named to the All-Freshman team for his exploits by the league's coaches, and **Elliott Cole**, **Joe Duffy**, and **Andre Walker** were named to the Winter SEC Academic Honor Roll for their work in the classroom. It marked the 12th time in the Stallings era that Vanderbilt has had a player on the All-SEC team, and the fifth time VU has had someone on the All-Freshman team. Stallings has coached 29 members of the SEC Academic Honor Roll since his arrival on the Vanderbilt campus in 1999-00.

Leaders From 2008-09 Season

A.J. Ogilvy led the team in scoring at 15.4 points per game and rebounding with 7.1 rebounds per contest. Point guard Jermaine Beal, who once again led the SEC in assist-to-turnover ratio last year, added 12.5 points, freshman Jeffery Taylor chipped in 12.2 points a game, and Brad Tinsley tallied 11.0 points a game. Taylor was second on the team in rebounding with 6.2 rebounds per game.

Ogilvy Named To Preseason All-SEC 1st Team

League coaches have named A.J. Ogilvy to their preseason All-SEC first team. He was a second-team All-SEC preseason selection by SEC media.

Ogilvy Reaches 1,000-Point Plateau

With his performance against LSU on March 4th of 2009, Ogilvy became the first sophomore in the history of

Vanderbilt basketball to eclipse the 1,000 point barrier. He has 1,041 points in his career. Vanderbilt legend Clyde Lee scored 1,100 points in his first two seasons in a Commodore uniform as a sophomore and junior. Freshmen were not eligible in those years (1963-65). Billy McCaffrey, who played as a junior and senior (1992-94) also scored 1,000 points in two seasons (1,359 points).

Two Freshman Double Digit Scorers For First Time Since...

1977. Vanderbilt's Jeffery Taylor and Brad Tinsley both averaged double digits at 12.2 and 10.7 points per game in 2008-09, respectively, the first time since 1977 that VU has had a true freshman scoring tandem. Charles Davis (15.3) and Greg Fuller (10.8) accomplished the feat in 1977.

Block Party In 2008-09

The Commodores blocked 137 shots in 2008-09 as a team, which set a new single-season record. The previous mark was 131 during the 1994-1995 season.

Beal And Tinsley Are VU Sharpshooters

Beal and freshman guard Brad Tinsley did not qualify for 3-point field goal percentage in the SEC rankings in 2008-09 because they did not make 2.5 threes per game (NCAA minimum for 3-pt FG%). However, if the minimum was dropped to 1.5 per game, Beal and Tinsley would have placed in the top ten in the league rankings. Beal would have tied for fifth at 40.3% (58-144), and Tinsley would have been third at 41.1% (69-168). Evaldus Baniulis of South Carolina would lead the league at 52.1% (38-73).

Drake Moves On

George Drake, who graduated with a degree in Sociology in May of 2009, will pursue a master's degree at UAB in the 2009-10 campaign. Drake was granted a waiver from the NCAA to play immediately for the Blazers and will compete this season.

Underclassmen Produce In 2008-09

Vanderbilt's redshirt freshmen and freshmen accounted for 1,085 points last year, a percentage of 49.7%, and underclassmen (freshmen and sophomores) tallied 1,619 points, or 74.1% of the points scored in 2008-09.

Tinsley Ties Freshman Record

Freshman Brad Tinsley made 69 three-pointers in his initial collegiate campaign, a total that tied Shan Foster for the most three's made by a Commodore freshman in a single season. Foster made 69 threes in his freshman season, which came in 2004-05.

Beal Leads SEC In Assist-to-Turnover Ratio For Second Consecutive Season

Jermaine Beal, who started in every game last season as a junior, led the league in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.02, percentage points in front of Tennessee's Bobby Maze and Garrett Temple of LSU. As a sophomore in 2007-08, Beal led the SEC and was sixth in the nation in the category at an astonishing 3.06 to 1.

SEC PRESEASON POLLS

Vanderbilt was picked to finish third in the SEC East by a select group of 30 media members in a poll released by the league prior to the SEC Basketball Media Days in Birmingham.

The Commodores received 90 points in the poll to finish behind Kentucky (148), and Tennessee (117). South Carolina was chosen fourth (77), Florida fifth (68) and Georgia was chosen sixth (25).

Mississippi State was chosen to win the SEC West with 144 votes, 24 votes better than Ole Miss (120). Kentucky received 20 out of the 25 votes to win the SEC Championship. Mississippi State received three votes and Tennessee received two. Vanderbilt's A.J. Ogilvy was chosen to the media and the coaches' first team.

The Bulldogs, pressured into constant turnovers most of the first 25 minutes, settled down and rallied to beat No. 18 Vanderbilt 72-58.

Georgia (10-11, 2-6) appeared bound for its fourth straight Southeastern Conference loss when it trailed early in the second half. But the Bulldogs recovered to shoot 53.2 percent for the game and end a three-game losing streak.

Georgia won for the first time since beating then-No. 8 Tennessee on Jan. 23. Trey Thompkins also had 17 points as the Bulldogs gave Vanderbilt (17-5, 6-2) its second loss in its last 13 games.

Jermaine Beal led Vanderbilt with 21 points. Tinsley added 18, but the Commodores found too little scoring support for the two guards.

Vanderbilt center A.J. Ogilvy had six points, ending a streak of scoring in double figures in 12 straight games. He led the Commodores with nine rebounds.

Beal and Tinsley made 9 of 13 shots from the field in the first half, but their teammates were 1 for 18. Vanderbilt made only 20 of 61 shots overall and matched its season low for points.

Georgia turned the ball over 13 times in the first half and trailed 36-28 early in the second half before rallying behind Travis Leslie, who scored 13 of his 17 points after the break.

The more composed Georgia offense abused Vanderbilt's man defense to make 14 of 21 shots in the second half while committing only eight turnovers.

Georgia's defense prevented Vanderbilt from its first 4-1 start in SEC road games since the 1966-67 season.

• Taylor made his 53rd consecutive start and has started every game of his career ... Tinsley made the 50th start of his career and 33rd in a row, starting every game since Jan. 31, 2009 at Auburn ... After having his streak of 70-straight starts snapped against Western Kentucky on Dec. 11, Beal made the 87th of his career ... The start by Walker was the 22nd of his career and 21st in 22 games this season ... Before this season, his only start was against MTSU on Nov. 24, 2009 when he suffered a season-ending knee injury ... Ogilvy started for the 10th game in a row after not starting the previous four games ... Ogilvy made his 17th start of the season and 78th of his career. The Sydney, Australia native has started in 78 of his 86 career games.

Postgame Notes

• Vanderbilt dropped to 17-5 overall and 6-2 in SEC play...Georgia improved to 10-11, 2-6 in the SEC. VU fell to 3-2 in league play on the road, and 4-3 in road games for the 2009-10 season.

• Saturday's meeting was the 129th meeting...The Commodores hold an 81-48 advantage in the overall series. However, the Bulldogs now lead the series in games played in Athens, 33-28. Head coach Kevin Stallings is 11-10 against Georgia in his coaching career and 3-8 against the Bulldogs in Athens.

• With Brad Tinsley's three-pointer with 17:05 remaining in the first half, Vanderbilt extended its consecutive games streak with at least one three-pointer made to 751 ... VU is one of only three schools (UNLV and Princeton) that have made at least one three-pointer in every game played since the three-point line was established for the 1986-87 season ... Only UNLV (758) has a longer streak than Vanderbilt.

• Vanderbilt led at the half for only the third time in SEC play this season...the Commodores are 2-1 in those games. VU is now 11-2 when leading at the half this season.

• Vanderbilt tied a season-low with 58 points against Georgia - VU also scored 58 points in a loss (67-58) to Cincinnati at the EA Sports Maui Invitational on November 23rd.

• The 32.8% shooting percentage was Vanderbilt's second lowest of the season - the Commodores shot only 27.5% against Cincinnati at the Maui Invitational...it was only the third game this season that VU has shot less than 40%. The Commodores have a 1-2 record in those games (only win was over Alabama).

• Georgia shot 53.2% from the floor, the second-best percentage by a Commodore opponent this year. Illinois shot 59.3% in a win over Vanderbilt on December 8.

• Vanderbilt was outrebounded by Georgia, 43-28. VU is now 5-5 in games when they get outrebounded by an opponent.

• The Commodores forced Georgia into 21 turnovers, the second-most by an opponent all season and the most since the season opener against Lipscomb, when the Bison committed 23 turnovers.

• Vanderbilt was 6-23 from three against the Bulldogs - a 26.1%. It was the third lowest of the season - VU shot 23.1% against DePaul (3-13) on December 5 and 21.7% against Manhattan on Dec. 30 (5-23).

• Vanderbilt had an eight-game streak in which four players reach double figures in scoring snapped against Georgia.

• Vanderbilt is now 3-4 when scoring 70 or fewer points.

• Jermaine Beal scored 21 points and now has 1,089 in his career, which ranks 31st in school history ... Against Auburn on Jan. 23 Beal became the 40th player in school history to reach 1,000 points in his career Beal reached double figures in scoring for the 19th time this season and 54th time in his career ... Beal has now reached double figures in 10 straight games...It was Beal's third 20+ scoring effort of the season and the seventh of his career.

• Over his last eight games (SEC play), Beal is averaging 17.4 points per game; Beal has made at least one three-pointer in 15 straight games.

• Beal attempted 16 shots against the Bulldogs, which set a new career high and is the most by a Vanderbilt player this year.

• Beal finished the game with one assist and ranks seventh in school history with 382 career assists ... Drew Maddux (1994-98) is sixth in school history with 394 assists.

• A.J. Ogilvy had his 12 game double-digit scoring streak snapped when he scored on six points.

• Brad Tinsley finished the game with 18 points to reach double figures in scoring for the seventh time this season and 27th time in his career ... It is the fourth time in five games he has reached double figures...the 18-point effort set a new season-best for Tinsley.

• John Jenkins was 0-for-9 from the field and scored only one point...the nine field goal attempts set a new career high. It was only the second time all season he has failed make a field goal...he was 0-for-5 from the floor against Western Kentucky on December 11.

• Beal and Tinsley were a combined 14-26 from the floor (53.8%). The rest of the team was 5-for-35 (14.3%).

• Tinsley played a season-high 36 minutes against Georgia.

MEMORIAL MAGIC - THE HOME TO VANDERBILT HOOPS SINCE 1952

HISTORIC MEMORIAL GYMNASIUM ENTERS 58TH SEASON

Storied Memorial Gymnasium is in its 58th season as the host venue of Vanderbilt basketball. The SEC's most historic hoops setting has played host to more than 850 men's contests as well as the 1984 and 1991 SEC Tournaments and 40 men's and women's NCAA Tournament contests (since the early 1980s).

As the oldest gymnasium in the SEC, Memorial Gymnasium is renown for its end zone benches, raised floor and unique atmosphere. It was dedicated in 1952 as a memorial to all Vanderbilt men and women who served in World War II. It was built by the late master architect Edwin Keeble, who was commissioned to build a combination gymnasium/concert hall.

"Memorial Magic" has claimed many victims over the years, most notably the nation's No. 1 ranked teams. Vanderbilt has won its last four home games against the top team in the country, most recently, a 72-69 victory over in-state rival Tennessee on February 26, 2008. The Commodores also have a six-game home win streak over nationally ranked opponents.

Last second shots also tend to fall in the Commodores' favor at Memorial Gymnasium. Most recently, Shan Foster scored 42 points, including a three with 1.7 seconds remaining, in an 86-85 Vanderbilt win on March 8, 2008 against Mississippi State.

* The Commodores have posted a 692-186 (.788) all-time record at Memorial Gymnasium.

* VU concluded the 2007-08 season 19-0 at Memorial Gym. It marks the most games won at Memorial Gym in one season, and the sixth time a Vanderbilt team has gone undefeated at home.

* Vanderbilt has won 115 of its last 122 home games against non-conference opponents. Since the 1990 season, Vanderbilt owns a 162-15 non-conference record at home (.915 win percentage).

* The Commodores are 95-8 against non-conference opponents at home during the Kevin Stallings era.

* The Commodores have posted six undefeated seasons at home.

The No. 24 Commodores went on a 24-0 run in the second half to break open a four-point game and defeat tournament-host Chaminade 68-41 in a consolation-round game at the Maui Invitational.

Stallings said it was about time. His team slogged through practice here and then looked listless in a 67-58 loss to Cincinnati in its opener Monday.

The Commodores found out on Monday morning that they were ranked in the AP Top 25 for the first time since March 17, 2008 -- and then promptly went out and lost to the Bearcats.

Things looked grim again for the first 25 minutes against the Division II Silverswords.

The Commodores (3-1) led just 38-34 with 15 minutes left in the second half before going on their run to put the game out of reach. Chaminade went scoreless for 10:30, a string broken when Shane Hanson made a 3-pointer with 4:30 left to make it 62-37.

He made 7 of 8 shots from the floor and 8 of 13 from the foul line as Vanderbilt (14-3, 3-0) won its eighth straight.

Jeffery Taylor added 16 points on 6-of-9 shooting.

Devan Downey had a season-high 35 points for South Carolina (11-6, 2-1), the third time this season he's surpassed 30.

John Jenkins' 3-pointer with 38.5 seconds to go pushed the Commodores' lead to 41-33. But Downey drove through three defenders for a layup with 1 second left.

Downey finished with 18 of his team's 35 points in the first half.

South Carolina could not come closer than eight points the rest of the way.

Vanderbilt's depth also wore down the Gamecocks.

Stallings shuttled players in and out, all who produced — each of the nine Commodores who played left with at least four points.

Vanderbilt shot better than 60 percent, many of those field goals coming from close to the basket. The Commodores also controlled the boards, outrebounding South Carolina 39-24.

DeMarcus Cousins posted his 12th double-double -- the most every by a Kentucky freshman -- with 21 points and 10 rebounds to lead a balanced attack as the Wildcats (20-1, 5-1 Southeastern Conference) served notice to the Commodores (16-4, 5-1) that they remain the team to beat in the SEC.

Cousins almost single-handedly gave Kentucky an early double-digit lead -- he converted four three-point plays in the game's first eight minutes -- and did his best to stay composed despite Vanderbilt's best efforts to rattle him.

When the Commodores tried to throw two or more bodies at Cousins, he would spin toward the baseline for an easy basket or kick it outside to an open teammate for a jumper -- the latest facet in his quickly developing game.

And there were good looks aplenty for the Wildcats, who made 12 of 23 3-point attempts and dominated the boards, outrebounding Vanderbilt 41-22, leading to 20 second-chance points.

Darnell Dodson had 16 points in just his second start of the season. Eric Bledsoe had 13 points and seven rebounds while Patrick Patterson chipped in 12 points.

Jermaine Beal led the Commodores with 19 points, but Vanderbilt couldn't pull off its second road upset of the week in a physical, whistle-plagued game that featured 58 fouls and very little flow. Vanderbilt (17-4, 6-1 Southeastern Conference) bounced back after losing their first league game last weekend at then-No. 1 Kentucky.
