- In the season opener for both squads, Vanderbilt begins its 131st season of football with a Southeastern Conference game against No. 10/11 Texas A&M. Kickoff is scheduled for 6:30 p.m. CT at Kyle Field with live television coverage on SEC Network Alternate.
- Vanderbilt is 80-46-4 all-time in season openers. The Commodores had won consecutive season openers against Middle Tennessee in 2018 (35-7) and 2017 (28-6) before falling to No. 3 Georgia in 2019.
- The Commodores' Sept. 26 opener is the latest start date for the program since 1959, when it began that campaign Sept. 26 at Georgia.
- The Dores' 10 games in the regular season will be the fewest played since 1969 (10).
- Vandy's regular season finale is scheduled for Dec. 5. That would be the latest the Dores have wrapped up a regular season since 1911, when they finished with a win over Sewanee on Dec. 9.
- The Commodores' Oct. 3 home opener is their latest home opener since 1959, when they welcomed Alabama on the same date.
- Saturday's game marks just the second time in the last 12 years the Commodores have opened the season on the road, joining the 2017 tilt at Middle Tennessee (W, 28-6). On Saturday, Vanderbilt will begin a campaign against an SEC foe for the third time in five years (vs. South Carolina in 2016; vs. Georgia in 2019).
- The season opener will be just the third matchup between Vandy and Texas A&M, with all three meetings occurring since the Aggies joined the SEC in 2012. The Commodores are 0-2 against Texas A&M and fell in College Station in the initial 2013 meeting.
- Derek Mason is one of just two Vanderbilt head coaches to lead the Commodores to multiple postseason bowl appearances (2016 Independence Bowl; 2018 Texas Bowl).
- Mason's staff will have a different look in 2020 with six new assistant coaches: Tony Ball (wide receivers), Todd Fitch (offensive coordinator), Aaron Henry (cornerbacks), Ted Roof (defensive coordinator), Pete Rossomando (offensive line) and Kenechi Udeze (linebackers).
- Twelve student-athletes on the 2020 roster have already earned their undergraduate degrees and are currently pursuing master's degrees: Tyrell Alexander, Drew Birchmeier, Elijah Hamilton, Kenny Hebert, Mac Hereford, Scott Meyer, Connor Mignone, Oren Millstein, Andre Mintze, Stephen Spanellis, Cameron Tidd and Jamauri Wakefield.
- Vanderbilt's offense will have a new signal caller as the lone Commodore to throw a pass in 2019 and return in 2020 is junior wide receiver Cam Johnson (1-2; 16 yards).
- Gone this season from the Vanderbilt offense is Ke'Shawn Vaughn, who rushed for 1,028 yards in 2019 and finished his career as the fifth-leading rusher in Commodore history (2,272 yards). Vaughn was a third-round pick (76th overall) by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the 2020 NFL Draft.
- Johnson (30 receptions, 316 yards) is the lone returning Commodore with more than 15 receptions during the 2019 season.
- Vanderbilt's defense brings back plenty of experience, led by senior lineman Dayo Odeyingbo, who returns after pacing the squad with 12.0 tackles for loss last fall. Senior linebackers Andre Mintze (4.5 sacks) and Dimitri Moore (99 tackles) return and led the Commodores in sacks and tackles, respectively, in 2019.
- Odeyingbo (second team), Mintze (third team) and Moore (third team) were all named Preseason All-SEC as chosen by the league's head coaches.
- Vanderbilt chose seven team captains for the 2020 campaign: Odeyingbo, Mintze, Johnson, junior defensive back Camden Coleman, cornerback Elijah Hamilton, center Grant Miller and punter Harrison Smith.

MASON IN SEASON OPENERS

- Vanderbilt is looking for its third 1-0 start under seventh-year head coach Derek Mason.
- The Commodores are facing a Southeastern Conference opponent in the season opener for the second consecutive season, a first for Vanderbilt since South Carolina in 2012 and Ole Miss in 2013.
- Mason is 1-0 in road openers, a 28-6 win at Middle Tennessee in 2017.

A TURNAROUND IN SEPTEMBER

 In its first three years under Mason, Vanderbilt posted a 4-9 September record. In the last three Septembers under Mason, the Commodores have gone 7-7.

VANDERBILT VS. TEXAS A&M

- The Commodores and Aggies will meet for the third time in program history on Saturday.
- Texas A&M won the first meeting 56-24 on Oct. 26, 2013, in College Station and the second by a 25-0 final on Nov. 21, 2015, in Nashville.

LOOKING TO ADD ANOTHER RANKED WIN

- The Commodores are looking for their first ranked win since downing No. 18 Kansas State 14-7 on Sept. 16, 2017, in Nashville.
- Vanderbilt is looking for their first road ranked win since downing No. 6 South Carolina 17-6 on Oct. 20, 2007.

MESSAGES ON DISPLAY

• For the 2020 season, Vanderbilt student-athletes were given the option of choosing a message to display on their sweat plate on the back of the helmet. Fifteen messages will be on display throughout the course of the season, including: Black Lives Matter, Equality, I Am Second, Say Their Names, Turner's Heroes and No Justice No Peace.

#FEEDOURHEROES

•When the coronavirus pandemic arrived in Nashville, Mason and his wife Leighanne came up with a way to give back to the community. As part of the Masons' #FeedOurHeroes initiative, they purchased meals from 10 local restaurants to feed 700 individuals across 16 medical sites.

Offense

PLENTY OF NEW FACES

 The Commodore offense will feature plenty of new faces as it returns nine of its 24 touchdowns (37.50%) from a year ago and six of its 21 offensive touchdowns (28.57%).

BALL CONTROL FOR THE COMMODORES

The Vanderbilt offense committed just 13 total turnovers (three fumbles, 10 interceptions) in 2019, tied for third in the SEC in fewest turnovers lost.

GUIDING THE OFFENSE IN 2020

- The Vanderbilt offense will be under new oversight in 2020 with offensive coordinator Todd Fitch taking over the reins. Fitch, a 35-year college football veteran, came to West End after a successful stint with head coach Skip Holtz at Louisiana Tech, where he helped the Bulldogs to four consecutive postseason victories.
- Vandy welcomed two more new offensive assistant coaches in 2020 with Tony Ball (wide receivers) and Pete Rossomando (offensive line).
- Fitch (1986) and Vanderbilt baseball head coach Tim Corbin (1984) are graduates of Ohio Wesleyan.
- Ball and Fitch were on the same Louisiana Tech staff from 2017-18. Ball had previous SEC coaching stops at LSU (2015) and Georgia (2006-14).
- Rossomando brings nine years of head coaching experience to Vanderbilt, four at Central Connecticut (2014-17) and five at New Haven (2009-13). He was the Liberty Mutual NCAA Division II National Coach of the Year following the 2012 season.

A NEW COMMODORE QUARTERBACK

- Vanderbilt will feature a new quarterback in 2020 as the only Commodore on the current roster who threw a pass for Vandy in 2019 is wide receiver Cam Johnson, who completed 1-of-2 passes for 16 yards last fall.
- The competition has been between juniors Danny Clark and Jeremy Moussa and true freshmen Ken Seals and Mike Wright.
- Clark, a lefty, signed with Kentucky following an outstanding high school career for Archbishop Hoban near Akron, Ohio. He spent the 2019 season at Copiah-Lincoln Community College in Mississippi and passed for 2,166 yards and 18 touchdowns.
- Moussa transferred to Vanderbilt after leading San Bernardino Valley College to a 9-2 record and 2019 conference title as the league's co-offensive player of the year. He signed with Hawai'i out of Eleanor Roosevelt (California) High School.
- Seals, a January enrollee at Vanderbilt, finished his Weatherford (Texas) High School career by throwing for a school-record 5,714 yards and 53 touchdowns.
- Wright was the Woodward (Georgia) Academy most valuable player as a senior in 2019 and led the team to a 13-1 record while compiling 3,369 yards of total offense and 50 total touchdowns.

A ROOKIE WOULD BE RARE

- Vanderbilt has not started a true freshman quarterback since Kyle Shurmur made five in 2015. True freshman Wade Freebeck also made four starts in 2014.
- In the SEC, there have been just two true freshmen quarterbacks to start season openers since freshman eligibility was restored in 1972:

BIRCHMEIER SHIFTING SIDES

- Fifth-year senior Drew Birchmeier will be found along the "other side" of the line of scrimmage this fall, shifting from defensive tackle to the offensive line.
- Birchmeier, a tight end and offensive lineman in high school, finished 2019 with 21 tackles
- Birchmeier enters the 2020 season owning Vandy's longest streak of consecutive games started with 22.

NEW BALL CARRIERS IN 2020

The Commodores return 350 rushing yards from last year (23.40%). The key departure was third-round NFL Draft selection Ke'Shawn Vaughn, who rushed for 1,028 yards last fall, and finished fifth in Vanderbilt history in career rushing yardage.

A YEAR MORE EXPERIENCE FOR RECEIVERS

- Vanderbilt's wide receiving corps returns junior Cam Johnson and seniors James Bostic III and Chris Pierce Jr., who combined for 55 receptions and 673 yards with four touchdowns last fall.
- The key departure from the group was Kalija Lipscomb, who caught a team-high 47
 passes for a squad-best 511 yards last fall. Lipscomb finished his Vanderbilt career
 fifth in receiving yardage with 2,356.
- Johnson caught two or more passes in each of the final four games of 2019 while Bostic III finished with a year-high four grabs against UNLV and Pierce Jr. tallied three receptions for 133 yards against Purdue last September.

DEFENSE UNDER NEW LEADERSHIP IN 2020

- The Vanderbilt defense will also be under a new coordinator for 2020 with Ted Roof coming to West End. Roof, a championship-winning defensive coordinator and former Power Five head coach, marks his 33rd year in college football.
- Roof has mentored nearly 90 student-athletes into the professional football ranks with more 20 of his former pupils currently on NFL rosters.
- Vandy welcomes two more new defensive assistant coaches in 2020 with Aaron Henry (cornerbacks) and Kenechi Udeze (linebackers).
- Roof and Henry worked together at NC State in 2018, helping the Wolfpack to a 9-3 record and Gator Bowl appearance.

SEVEN STARTERS RETURNING

The Commodore defense brings back six seniors with starting experience in defensive end Dayo Odeyingbo, defensive tackle Cameron Tidd, outside linebacker Andre Mintze, inside linebacker Dimitri Moore and cornerback Allan George. In addition, Vandy returns junior cornerback BJ Anderson and junior safety Deshaun Jerkins.

LEADING TACKLERS ARE BACK

- Vanderbilt returns its top tackler in Dimitri Moore (99) in 2020 as well as the team leader in tackles for loss in Dayo Odeyingbo (12.0) and sacks in Andre Mintze (4.5).
 Moore's 99 tackles were tied for the 69th most nationally last fall.

NEW KICKER FOR 2020

- Junior Pierson Cooke has taken over the kicking duties after appearing in nine games as a kickoff specialist in 2019.
- Cooke kicked off 29 times for 1,816 yards and 20 touchbacks last fall.
- The lone Commodore to have attempted a field goal and return for 2020 is junior Javan Rice, who went 1-for-1 with a 28-yarder in 2019.

PUNTER DUTIES HANDLED BY SMITH

- Junior Harrison Smith is back to punt after averaging 43.0 yards per boot last fall.
- Smith led the SEC in total punting yardage (3,313) last fall and stood sixth nationally.

SOME RETURNER OPTIONS BACK IN THE FOLD

- Junior Ja'Veon Marlow returned four kickoffs for 81 yards (20.3 return) last fall while junior Cam Johnson ran back one punt for 13 yards.
- Last season's top return option in Justice Shelton-Mosley handled 33 of Vanderbilt's 40 (82.50%) kickoff or punt returns. He averaged 9.06 yards per punt return in 2019 and 18.06 yards a kick return last fall.

DUO HELPS FORM BLACK STUDENT-ATHLETE GROUP

- Senior defensive lineman Cam Robinson and junior linebacker Elijah McAllister teamed up with track's Taiya Shelby and soccer's Olivia Simmons to take action, focusing on improving the Black student-athlete experience at Vanderbilt, among other issues.
- One of their first acts was to help organize a voter registration drive on Tuesday, Sept. 22, from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. at Vanderbilt Stadium. The event was one of several campus efforts planned to encourage voter engagement.
- Also among the students' goals are to create a safe and comfortable space for Black student-athletes, provide a formal support system to offer the necessary actions and conversations to improve the social experience of Black student-athletes at Vanderbilt, work to address racial issues in sports and offer guidance toward professional development and personal growth.
- A three-day event in January at the University of Texas, the Black Student-Athlete Summit, motivated Shelby and McAllister to be change agents in West End. It was there they met student-athletes from around the country, participated in workshops and discussions, and heard from guest speakers like journalist Jemele Hill.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

- Off the field, the Vanderbilt football team topped the SEC with a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 95 for the 2018-19 academic year. The Dores scored among the highest five teams in the GSR data and ranked second among programs affiliated with a Power 5 conference.
- Forty Commodores landed on the 2019 SEC Fall Academic Honor roll, and Vanderbilt scored a 984 in the NCAA's latest Academic Progress Rate scores.

SET THE EXPECTATION GAME RETURNS OCT. 31

- Vanderbilt's home tilt against Ole Miss will be the team's second annual "Set The Expectation" game. The Commodores became the first SEC program to host a "Set The Expectation" game in the 2019 home opener versus Georgia.
- The event originated in June of 2019, when Brenda Tracy, a registered nurse from Oregon, shared with the football team her devastating personal story and vital message of preventing sexual violence. Tracy also serves on the NCAA's Commission to Combat Campus Sexual Violence. Tracy, who calls her campaign "Set The Expectation," was recognized.

GEORGE-MINTZE VLOG GOES VIRAL

- On Sept. 4, senior cornerback Allan George proposed to his girlfriend Katlyn Richardson, who is a member of the Vanderbilt cheerleading squad. Senior linebacker Andre Mintze filmed the moment, which took place inside Vanderbilt Stadium, and posted it on his YouTube Channel - Dre Mintze TV.
- The video has received more than 20,000 views and was picked up by SportsCenter and Bleacher Report.

UDEZE'S CHAMPIONSHIP MENTALITY

• First-year linebacker coach Kenechi Udeze brings a pair of NCAA titles to West End. As a senior in 2003, Udeze earned first-team All-America status and led the country with 16.5 sacks while helping USC to a national championship. Last fall as a defensive analyst, Udeze helped LSU's 15-0 campaign, which was capped by an impressive 42-25 victory over Clemson in the College Football Playoff title game.

SEC COUNCIL MEMBERS

 Head coach Derek Mason, along with Vanderbilt baseball head coach Tim Corbin and athletic director Candice Lee, currently serve on the SEC Council on Racial Equity and Social Justice, a league-wide body consisting of a diverse group of student-athletes, administrators, coaches and SEC staff.

VANDERBILT UNIVERSITY • VANDERBILT ATHLETICS

- Vanderbilt is ranked 14th among national universities by U.S. News & World Report. It ranks ninth in best value schools and 12th in best undergraduate teachings by the magazine.
- According to the 2021 Princeton Review, Vanderbilt ranks second for best quality of life, happiest students and most beautiful campuses in the nation.
- The university was founded in 1873 with a \$1 million gift from "Commodore" Cornelius Vanderbilt. Kirkland Hall, which continues as the main administration building on campus, is the only original structure that remains today.
- Vanderbilt teams have captured five NCAA championships, all since 2007. The
 Commodore baseball team won the most recent national trophy, claiming the 2019
 College World Series in June. It was the second NCAA title for head coach Tim Corbin
 and the Vanderbilt baseball team. Other NCAA titles have been earned by women's
 bowling (2007, 2018) and women's tennis (2015).
- In 2019-20, Vanderbilt had the smallest undergraduate enrollment (6,886) and total enrollment (13,131) in the Southeastern Conference.
- Vanderbilt is a charter member of the Southeastern Conference.
- Vanderbilt Athletics is the only Power 5 Conference member, and one of two FBS programs, with an African American in the key roles of athletics director (Candice Storey Lee), football head coach (Derek Mason) and men's basketball head coach (Jerry Stackhouse).
- Less than 10% of 37,310 high school applications were accepted for admission to Vanderbilt in 2019-20.
- The student-faculty ratio at Vanderbilt is 7:1, and the school has 61% of its classes with fewer than 20 students.
- The largest college on campus is Arts & Science with 4,046 undergraduates. The Divinity School is the smallest college with 176 students.
- Student housing hold 94% of undergraduate students in 39 residential halls and apartments.
- There are more than 136,000 living alumni of the university.
- The 340-acre Vanderbilt campus, situated in an urban setting just two miles from business and governmental core of Nashville, is designated as an arboretum, and features approximately 300 species of trees and shrubs.
- Sixty-five percent of Vanderbilt undergraduates receive some sort of financial aid.
- Notable Vanderbilt alumni include PGA Tour FedEx Cup winner Brandt Snedeker, LPGA golfer and 2019 Solheim Cup USA team member Marina Alex, NBA champions Will Perdue, Festus Ezeli and Damian Jones, numerous Major League Baseball standouts such as David Price, Sonny Gray, Dansby Swanson and Walker Buehler, and more than 10 players active in the NFL such as cornerbacks Casey Hayward and Joejuan Williams, linebackers Zach Cunningham and Oren Burks, lineman Stephen Weatherly and receiver Trent Sherfield.
- Off the field, other prominent alumni include NBC Sunday Morning Show host and MSNBC's Morning Joe co-host Willie Geist, country music star Dierks Bentley, best-selling author James Patterson and ESPN baseball expert Buster Olney.



Vanderbilt Drops Opener

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Vanderbilt could not slow down Georgia's ground game in the Commodores' season opener, as the third-ranked Bulldogs opened the season with a 30-6 win.

Vanderbilt debuted a new starting quarterback in Riley Neal along with new offensive coordinator Gerry Gdowski. The Commodores also had Ke'Shawn Vaughn, the SEC's top returning rusher who ran for 1,244 yards last season, and the league's top returning receiver in Kalija Lipscomb.

But the Commodores were without three starters, including two on the offensive line with both left tackle Devin Cochran and left guard Saige Young out with injuries. That left Neal with little time to throw against a Georgia defense that returned seven starters on a unit that was 15th nationally giving up just 19.2 points a game last season.

Neal finished 15 of 25 for 85 yards before being replaced by Deuce Wallace for the final possession. Vaughn was held to 74 yards on 15 carries.

Vanderbilt managed a pair of field goals by Ryley Guay of 26 and 46 yards.

D'Andre Swift ran 16 times for 149 yards, and Brian Herrien added 65 and a touchdown run as the Bulldogs rolled up 326 yards rushing. Georgia finished with a 481-225 edge in total offense, and the Bulldogs also had two sacks and recovered a fumble.

Vanderbilt quarterback Riley Neal set up the game's opening score in the first quarter with a 49-yard pass to Kalija Lipscomb, putting the ball on the Purdue 4. Ke'Shawn Vaughn scored on a 1-yard touchdown.

The Commodores were outscored, 28-14, in the second half. The Boilermakers scored quickly after taking the second-half kickoff to take a 21-10 edge.

Sindelar's 20-yard touchdown pass to Brycen Hopkins, from Nashville, pushed the lead to 28-10. The play was set up after a 15-yard penalty for helmet targeting by Vanderbilt cornerback Randall Haynie, who was disqualified.

Commodores Stumble Against LSU

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Vanderbilt's Ke'Shawn Vaughn ran for 130 yards and two touchdowns but Vanderbilt could not slow No. 4/5 LSU, falling 66-38, in its second Southeastern Conference game at Vanderbilt Stadium.

Vanderbilt (0-3, 0-2) scored on its opening drive for the first time this season, but couldn't stop the high-powered offense of LSU (4-0, 1-0).

Vaughn moved into a tie for eighth place in Commodore history with 15 rushing touchdowns. He is tied with Khari Blasingame (2016-18) and Jeff Jennings (2004-08). Vaughn also eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the first time this season and sixth at Vanderbilt.

The Commodores scored their most points this season while adding at least one touchdown in every quarter. Kalija Lipscomb hauled in his 20th career touchdown reception, moving into a tie for third with Earl Bennett (2005-07) and Chuck Scott (1981-84) in Commodore history.

 $Lips comb\ also\ surpassed\ 2,000\ yards\ receiving\ for\ his\ Vanderbilt\ career\ after\ hauling\ in\ five\ catches\ for\ 68\ yards.$

Vanderbilt's defense forced two turnovers, both which resulted in points. The Commodores recovered a fumble at the end of the second quarter in the end zone for a touchdown and returned an interception for six points in the second half.

Vanderbilt kicker Ryley Guay stayed perfect on the season after converting a 41-yard field goal in the first half for his fourth field goal this season.

The Tigers came in second in the SEC defending the run, giving up just 80.3 yards a game. They gave up a 41-yarder to Vaughn on Vandy's first offensive play, and he broke loose for a 52-yard touchdown run in the third quarter — the longest run this season for the SEC's top returning rusher. Vaughn finished with 20 carries for 130 yards.

The Commodores came in as the only FBS team without a sack this season. Jaylen Mahoney sacked Joe Burrow early in the second quarter. Kenny Hebert also got a sack, and Elijah McAlister recovered an Edwards-Helaire fumble for a touchdown in the final minute of the first half

Dores Handle Northern Illinois

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Ke'Shawn Vaughn rushed for 138 yards and one touchdown, Riley Neal threw for 189 yards and a touchdown and Vanderbilt defeated Northern Illinois, 24-18.

The victory was the first of the season for the Commodores (1-3), who dropped their first three games to Power Five teams, two of which came against top-five ranked opponents in No. 3 Georgia and No. 4 LSU.

Vanderbilt's Keyon Brooks and Vaughn scored rushing touchdowns on the first two Vanderbilt drives of the game.

On Vanderbilt's opening drive, Brooks broke loose for a 61-yard touchdown run, the freshman's first of the season. He had only one more carry of the game. Entering the game, Brooks had just eight carries for a total of seven yards in two games this season.

The Huskies pulled to within four in the third quarter after posting points on their first two drives of the second half. John Richardson kicked a 39-yard field goal to get Northern Illinois on the scoreboard, and then Mitchell Brinkman had a 38-yard touchdown reception. But Vanderbilt answered right back 1:49 later when Neal found Kalija Lipscomb with a 38-yard touchdown pass.

Vanderbilt improved its record to 8-2 against Mid-American Conference opponents, including 4-0 against Northern Illinois.

Early in the fourth, the Huskies cut the deficit to six following a one-yard touchdown run by Marcus Jones and a two-point conversion reception by Brinkman, but the Commodore defense denied the Huskies on their final drive, and the Vanderbilt offense was able to run out the remaining three minutes to seal the victory.

The Commodores allowed the Huskies to convert just four of 13 third down opportunities in the game.

Commodores Suffer Setback to UNLV

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Ke'Shawn Vaughn had another big day at Vanderbilt Stadium, but a pair of costly Vanderbilt turnovers in the second half thwarted the Commodores' comeback attempt.

Visiting UNLV outscored Vandy 34-3 after falling behind 7-0 to win 34-10. The Rebels (2-4) scored 10 points off Vanderbilt miscues to put the game away late.

Vaughn, meanwhile, rushed for 140 yards in 15 carries (9.3 yards/rush) and also caught a 53-yard pass. Those numbers weren't enough to carry the Commodores.

Vanderbilt (1-5, 0-3 SEC) returns to action at 3 p.m. next Saturday when it hosts Missouri (4-1, 1-0 SEC).

The Commodores began the fourth quarter down 27-10 after Daniel Gutierrez made a 29-yard field goal on the period's first play. Vandy got a big return on the ensuing kickoff and a penalty moved the ball to the UNLV 43.

But the momentum was short-lived. Quarterback Riley Neal was sacked on a third-down play and fumbled – Nate Neal picked it up for the Rebels and took it back to the Commodores' 40.

Six plays later, Chad Magyar ran in a 14-yard touchdown putting the Rebels ahead by 24 with 10:44 to play.

Vandy couldn't find a comeback left in the tank.

The first 30 minutes didn't go very well for the home team either.

After Vandy's opening drive went 76 yards in a little less than three minutes, Vaughn scored on the eighth play with a 4-yard touchdown run making it 7-0.

The Rebels outscored Vanderbilt 24-3 the rest of the way.

Charles Williams scored on a 5-yard run, Gutierrez made a 44-yard field goal, Randal Grimes caught a 63 touchdown pass and tight end Noah Bean hauled in a 5-yard throw, respectively. Vandy kicker Ryley Guay made a 48-yard field goal in between all that leaving the Doors down 24-10 at the break.

Vanderbilt allowed 249 yards on defense and UNLV gained 7.5 yards per play in the first half while converting five of their six third-down opportunities.

Offensively, the Commodores were 1-for-8 on third down. Vaughn averaged 8.4 yards per carry in the first two quarters.

After 13 minutes of scoreless ball in the third quarter, Vanderbilt was putting together a solid drive into UNLV territory. But Neal was picked off by UNLV's Javin White and the senior linebacker took it all the way down to the Vanderbilt 11.

The Rebels ran the clock down and took their 14-point lead into the final quarter. It never got any closer than that.

Nashville, Tenn. - Riley Neal came off the bench and threw a 21-yard touchdown to Cam Johnson with 8:57 left, and Vanderbilt upset No. 22/NR Missouri 21-14 with a stifling defensive performance.

Ke'Shawn Vaughn ran for a touchdown and also took a screen 61 yards for another score as Vanderbilt (2-5, 1-3 Southeastern Conference) snapped a three-game skid to Missouri after losing five of the previous seven in this series.

Missouri (5-2, 2-1) came in leading the SEC East waiting for the Tigers' appeal of NCAA sanctions to be heard. The Tigers also played their first game since moving into the Top 25 with a five-game winning streak — all at home.

Vanderbilt held Missouri to a season-low in points with the Tigers 17th nationally averaging 38.8 points a game. The Commodores sacked Kelly Bryant three times, and Allan George intercepted a Bryant pass in the end zone with 6:44 left in the third quarter.

Missouri had a chance to tie except Vanderbilt sacked Bryant for the third time, and Tucker McCann pulled a 48-yarder wide left for his second missed field goal. Neal and Vanderbilt ran out the final 6 minutes for the win.

Neal started the first six games of the season only for Mo Hasan to get the start against Missouri. The walk-on junior college transfer who had thrown only six passes last season as a backup became the third quarterback this season to jump-start the Commodore offense.

Neal drove the Commodores 65 yards and capped the drive with the toss that Johnson took to the end zone for the lead.

The Commodores ended up using all three quarterbacks in this game after Hasan was sent to the locker room for evaluation. Neal came out briefly, forcing Deuce Wallace into the game. Hasan was the surprise starter announced at the end of the pregame warmups. Hasan was 7 of 11 for 120 yards and a TD, and he ran nine times for 34 yards before being knocked out of the game.

Offense Sputters in Loss

COLUMBIA, S.C. - South Carolina scored 24 unanswered en route to a 24-7 win over Vanderbilt at Williams-Brice Stadium.

The Gamecocks (4-5, 3-4 SEC) fell in an early, 7-0 hole before rattling off two second-quarter touchdowns and adding a fourth-quarter field goal and fourth-quarter touchdown. The win snapped a two-game losing streak for South Carolina.

The Commodores (2-6, 1-4 SEC) finished with 189 yards of total offense.

Vanderbilt's opening drive of the night was aided by three South Carolina penalties – and the Dores took advantage. Riley Neal's 26-yard touchdown pass to Cam Johnson capped an 11-play drive that covered 77 yards and ate up more than six minutes of clock while giving Vandy a 7-0 lead midway through the opening quarter.

Neal left the game with an injury after that series.

The Commodores kept that 7-0 lead into the second quarter thanks, in part, to a forced fumble and recovery by Elijah McCallister with South Carolina threatening at the 9. But the Gamecocks finally dented the scoreboard at the 7:50 mark of the period thanks to Ryan Hilinski's 20-yard strike to Xavier Legette – that tied the game at 7-7.

South Carolina took its first lead of the game just before halftime thanks a 1-yard run on a toss sweep left to Kevin Harris. The Gamecocks took a 14-7 lead into the break.

Vanderbilt backup quarterback Deuce Wallace was intercepted by R.J. Roderick on Vanderbilt's final offensive play of the third quarter. That ultimately led to a 22-yard field goal from Parker White making it 17-7 with 12:18 to play.

Hilinski capped his night with a 25-yard TD strike to Bryan Edwards. That score provided the final margin.

Gators Too Much for Commodores

GAINESVILLE, Fla. - No. 10/10 Florida broke open a close game in the third quarter and handed Vanderbilt a 56-0 loss at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium.

Florida (8-2, 5-2 SEC) led 14-0 at The Swamp before scoring 42 points in the second half. The Gators won their sixth straight in the series with Vanderbilt.

The teams played through a scoreless first quarter thanks to three big Vanderbilt defensive plays. Linebacker Dimitri Moore broke up a fourth-down pass in the game's opening series, safety Tae Daley had an interception inside the Vandy 20 and cornerback Cam Watkins made a tackle at the 1 with his back to the end zone on the period's last play.

Florida broke the 0-0 tie on the first play of the second quarter, a 4th-and-goal call that saw Kyle Trask pitch the ball forward to Lamical Perine for six points.

Trask upped the Florida lead to 14-0 thanks to his own 9-yard scoring run. That touchdown was set up by Donovan Stiner's interception of Vandy quarterback Deuce Wallace that was returned to the Commodores' 23.

The Gators looked poised to add to their advantage just before the half, but Trask's throw toward the end zone was broken up by Watkins and intercepted again by Daley at the goal line.

Florida's first offensive snap of the third quarter became a 66-yard touchdown pass from Trask to Trevon Grimes that made it 21-0. A few minutes later Trask found tight end Kyle Pitts from 15 yards out making it 28-0.

Jonathan Greenard picked up a Wallace fumble and ran it back for 80 yards for a touchdown later in the third quarter to make it 35-0. Florida quarterback Emory Jones ran in a 13-yard score making it 42-0 going into the fourth quarter.

Jones added 1-yard and 3-yard touchdown runs in the fourth quarter to close the scoring.

Vanderbilt finished with just 128 yards of total offense and turned the ball over three times.

Kentucky Gets Past Vanderbilt

Nashville, Tenn. - Kentucky quarterback Lynn Bowden ran for 110 yards and threw for 104 more as the Wildcats ran right past Vanderbilt 38-14 at Vanderbilt Stadium.

Kentucky (5-5, 3-5 SEC) ran for 401 yards as a team and averaged seven yards per play. It scored 35 unanswered points in its fourth-straight win over Vandy.

The Commodores (2-8, 1-6 SEC) return home to host East Tennessee State (3-8) at 2:30 p.m. next Saturday.

Kentucky took its first drive of the day and ventured into the red zone, but Vandy's defense held and forced a 32-yard field goal by Chance Moore – a kick that was good and made it 3-0.

Vanderbilt countered with an eight-play drive that ate up 4 1/2 minutes and covered 75 yards. It featured a wide receiver run, double pass and 5-yard run from Vaughn that gave the Commodores a 7-3 lead with 5:21 to go in the period.

The Vandy defense got involved on the ensuing drive when Andre Mintze forced a fumble inside his own 30 and cornerback Allan George picked it up on the 33 and raced 67 yards the other way for six making it 14-3.

Kentucky found the end zone for the first time with an 11-play drive that ended with Kavosiey Smoke's 3-yard touchdown run early in the second quarter. That cut UK's deficit to 14-10.

The Wildcats retook the lead on Chris Rodriguez's 22-yard touchdown run midway through the second quarter. That finished an 82-yard scoring drive that swallowed 4:20 of clock.

Kentucky tacked on one final one touchdown before the half when Bowden scrambled from the Vandy 14, threw to his right and watched his pass get tipped by Vanderbilt defensive back Brendon Harris and land in the arms of Kentucky receiver Josh Ali in the end zone.

That gave the Wildcats a 24-14 lead at the break. They rushed for 279 yards and totaled 18 first downs in the first half.

Bowden made it 31-14 three minutes into the third quarter with a touchdown run from a yard out. Rodriguez added a 27-yard scoring run late in the third quarter making it 38-14.

Vanderbilt finished with just 198 yards of offense and went 2 of 9 on third down.

Seniors Buck East Tennessee State

Nashville, Tenn. - Vanderbilt's seniors went out winners Saturday in somewhat of a bittersweet home finale in a season that hadn't gone as planned.

Most all of the Commodores who were playing in their final game at Vanderbilt Stadium found a way to contribute during a 38-0 win over East Tennessee State.

Tight end Jared Pinkney, a redshirt senior, had five catches for 76 yards. He brought in two touchdowns – one to open the scoring on a 31-yard throw from senior quarterback Riley Neal and the other on a 7-yard pass late in the third quarter.

Pinkney nearly matched his total number of receptions (5) from the previous seven games coming in (six) to Saturday.

Vanderbilt also got 139 rushing yards and two touchdowns from Ke'Shawn Vaughn while receiver Kalija Lipscomb caught six balls for 75 yards. Neal, a graduate transfer from Ball State, went 16-for-24 passing for 179 yards.

The Commodores slogged their way to a 14-0 halftime lead Saturday on a cold and misty day. On the first play of the second half, Vaughn helped Vandy send a message that the end was nigh.

Vaughn took a handoff to his left, found a hole along the front and burst through an opening to get to the next level. He was off to the races for a 75-yard score and the Dores never looked back.

On the defensive side of the ball, Vanderbilt held ETSU to a mere nine yards of offense in the second half. The Buccaneers (3-9) were 4 of 15 on third down and averaged just 1.1 yards per carry.

Defensive tackle Cameron Tidd, a redshirt junior, blocked a field goal in the first half to help preserve the shutout after East Tennessee State had driven to the Vandy 12.

The Buccaneers wouldn't enter Vanderbilt territory the rest of the game.

The Commodores (3-8) now head to Knoxville to face rival Tennessee (5-5). They'll do so with a little but of momentum after breaking a three-game losing streak.

Vandy has won three in a row in that series and another victory over the Volunteers would send Mason's program full steam ahead into the offseason – and send the seniors out with another unforgettable memory.

Dores End Season With Loss at Tennessee

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. - Vanderbilt saw it's three-game winning streak against Tennessee come to an end as the Commodores lost 28-10 at Neyland Stadium.

Vandy (3-9, 1-7 SEC) had a 3-0 lead early, but then gave up 21 unanswered points – including 14 in the second quarter. Tennessee ended its regular season at 7-5 and 5-3 in the Southeastern Conference.

The Commodores trailed 21-3 going into the final frame, but got a touchdown pass from Riley Neal to Kalija Lipscomb from 22 yards out with 11:34 to play making it a 21-10 game. Tennessee answered with a seven-play, 75-yard drive that took four minutes and put the Volunteers up 28-10 on Eric Gray's 4-yard touchdown run.

Gray finished with 246 yards on 25 carries and scored three times.

Vanderbilt had some early momentum thanks to its defense in the first quarter. Freshman cornerback Jaylen Mahoney picked off Tennessee quarterback Jarrett Guarantano on the day's third offensive play at the Tennessee 31.

The Commodores wound up turning that into a 41-yard field goal from Ryley Guay and took a 3-0 lead less than three minutes into the game.

Tennessee responded at the 3:04 mark of the first quarter thanks to Gray's 56-yard touchdown run. That gave the Volunteers a 7-3 lead going into the second quarter.

Guarantano gave Tennessee a 14-3 lead early in the second thanks to a 6-yard touchdown pass to Dom Wood-Anderson. Then Gray broke a 94-yard touchdown run with 8 1/2 minutes to play in the half putting the Volunteers ahead 21-3.

Gray finished his first half with 181 yards on 11 carries as the Volunteers took that 18-point lead into the break.

Neal finished with 139 yards on 14 of 29 passing. Freshman running back Keyon Brooks had 70 yards on 13 carries.
