THE OPENING KICKOFF

- For the first time ever, Stanford and Vanderbilt meet on the gridiron Saturday night. The Cardinal and Commodores kick off at 5 p.m. PT on ESPNU.
- · Saturday concludes a seven-game road trip for Stanford, the longest such streak in school history. The Cardinal played its final four games of the 2020 season away from home, while beginning the 2021 season with three straight games away from home.
- Stanford is the only Power Five program to begin the season with two straight games away from home, let alone three.
- For the first time since 2017, and just the second time in school history, the Cardinal begins the season with three straight games away from home. In 2017, Stanford opened with a game vs. Rice in Sydney, Australia, before traveling to USC and San Diego State.
- The Cardinal is the only program to play 12 Power Five opponents in the regular season this year, becoming the first program since USC in 2011 to do so.
- Stanford plays six teams who were in the AP Preseason Top 25, tied with UCLA and Colorado for most in the country.

- Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football David Shaw is in his 11th season at the helm of the Cardinal. Shaw owns a 91-37 (.711) career record, making him the winningest coach in program history. Shaw's 91 wins are tied for 13th-most in conference history.
- Following its 42-28 win at No. 14 USC on Saturday, Stanford is 28-20 against Top 25 foes under David Shaw and has defeated at least one Top-20 opponent on the road in eight of Shaw's 11 seasons.
- Since Shaw took over, Stanford is 32-8 against programs from California, including 26-7 against Pac-12 foes from the state (Cal, UCLA, USC).
- Since 2007, Stanford is 10-6 vs. USC with a 5-3 record at the Coliseum. Under Shaw, the Cardinal is 7-5 vs. the Trojans. Prior to 2007, Stanford was 24-57-3 all-time vs.
- In the 15 seasons prior to Shaw taking over, Stanford won 82 games ... eight less than the Cardinal won in Shaw's first 10 seasons.
- The Cardinal improved to 33-0 on Saturday night when scoring 40-or-more points under Shaw. Stanford is also 80-18 when allowing fewer than 30 points under Shaw.

MEDIA POLICIES

Stanford University is constantly monitoring public health guidelines and adjusting its policies to reflect the latest guidance from the CDC, State of California and Santa Clara County. At this time, the Stanford Athletic Communications office is planning to welcome media back to Stanford Stadium with no capacity restrictions. Stanford Athletics understands the importance of assisting the media in providing coverage of the institution, its athletics programs, administrators, coaches and student-athletes. Our goal is to disseminate information as widely, uniformly and fairly as possible using normally accepted media standards. To this end, the best attempt will be made to fill reasonable requests by recognized media outlets, however, the Stanford Stadium pressbox and work spaces have limited seating and not all requests may be met for all games. Members of the media are encouraged to work with the Stanford Athletic Communications staff to assist in that endeavor. It is not permissible for media members to contact any athletics department administrator, associate, coach or student-athlete directly without working through the communications department.

CONTENT & WORKPLACE POLICIES

- 1. Video clips of in-game competition, live or otherwise, online or via social media networks are not permitted. Still photos may be shared online and across social platforms during the game.
- 2. Any non-editorial or commercial use of any picture, audio, film, tape, or digital image or drawing of the event is prohibited without prior, specific, written authorization from the host institution.
- 3. Internet usage in all media areas, including media work areas, stadium pressbox, digital work room and the field, is for work-related purposes only. Media members who do not follow the proper internet procedures may have their credentials and internet access revoked for the remainder of the event.
- 4. Media should respect the work environment of their colleagues by maintaining a quiet and professional atmosphere in all working media areas. The press box will close two hours after the conclusion of the game.

FIELD ACCESS & SIDELINE POLICY

Field access is limited to photographers, videographers and sideline reporters whose job function requires them to work from field level. Print media, and anyone working out of the press box, will only be permitted on the field for the final five minutes of games during the 2021 season. There is no pregame access and no interviews should be conducted on the field.

- 1. Photo credentials will be issued only to accredited media outlets prior to the game and photo identification must be provided.
- 2. Photographers and videographers must check in at media will call located at Gate 8 of the stadium. Those photographers and videographers who will work on the sidelines will be issued a photo vest. This photo vest must be worn at all times to gain access to the sidelines. Vests must be returned after the game at the on-field dropoff location situated next to the south endzone tunnel.
- 3. Only working photographers and videographers with professional-grade cameras will be allowed on the field. Those without proper equipment or not shooting the game will be escorted from the sidelines regardless of credential.
- 4. Working photographers and videographers are permitted to shoot in the designated area (between the two marked dotted lines outside the 20-yard lines and behind the end zone).
- 5. Photographers are encouraged to use the photo work areas, located on Level 3 of Stanford Stadium and the media room on Level 2 of the fieldhouse. Wireless internet is available. While security in this area is provided, Stanford University is not responsible for the loss of any items.
- 6. According to NCAA policies, the presence of any type of photographer and videographer in the bench area for all sports is strictly prohibited with the exception of one (1) institutional videographer in the football bench area. According to the NCAA Football Rules and Interpretations Manual (Rule 1, Section 2, Article 4b): "the team area shall be limited to squad members in uniform and a maximum of 40 other individuals directly involved in the game. The 40 individuals not in uniform shall wear special identification." (Rule 1, Section 2, Article 4e): "No media personnel, including journalists, radio and television personnel, or their equipment, shall be in the team area or coaching box, and no media personnel shall communicate in any way with persons in the team area or coaching box." Stanford Athletics prohibits photographers and videographers from stopping and shooting from behind the bench area or into the bench area.

THE MATCHUP

- Stanford and Vanderbilt meet for the first time on Saturday night. The Cardinal is 4-2-1 all-time against SEC opponents.
- The last time Stanford played a current member of the SEC came in the 1992 Pigskin Classic, a 10-7 loss to No. 7 Texas A&M.
- The last meeting against an SEC member at the time of the matchup was a 25-22 win over No. 11 Georgia in the 1978 Bluebonnet Bowl.

CRUISING AT THE COLISEUM

- Stanford's 14-point win at No. 14 USC marked its fifth-largest margin of victory ever at USC.
- The Cardinal led 35-13 after three quarters and stretched that to a 42-13 lead with 9:16 left before USC scored two late touchdowns.
- Stanford now owns eight, double-digit road victories all-time at USC.

HEAD COACH DAVID SHAW

- Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football David Shaw '94 owns a career record of 91-37 (.711) overall and a mark of 63-25 (.716) against Pac-12 foes.
- Shaw's 91 wins are the most in school history, as he surpassed the legendary Pop Warner (71 wins) during the 2017 season.
- Shaw owns a 28-20 (.583) record against AP Top 25 programs. Of Shaw's 28 wins against ranked foes, 16 of them have come against Top-15 opponents and 10 of those have been against teams ranked in the Top 10.
- Shaw is one of eight active coaches in the country who is the winningest head coach at his current school. He is joined by North Carolina's Mack Brown, Northwestern's Pat Fitzgerald, Iowa's Kirk Ferentz, Navy's Ken Niumatalolo, Oklahoma State's Mike Gundy, TCU's Gary Patterson and UConn's Randy Edsall.
- Shaw is the only four-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year in conference history (dating back to 1975).
- Shaw's 91 wins are currently the 13th-most in Pac-12 history and he is just two wins shy of cracking the Top 10. Only Pete Carroll (97) had more wins in their first 10 seasons. Shaw's 63 conference wins are tied for seventh-most in Pac-12 history.

BLACK LEADERSHIP

- Stanford is one of four Power Five schools with a Black head football coach (David Shaw) and athletic director (Bernard Muir), joined by Arizona State, Maryland and Michigan State.
- Stanford is one of two FBS schools to have had three Black head football coaches, joined by Colorado. Shaw (11th season) was preceded by Dennis Green (1989-91) and Tyrone Willingham (1995-01) for a combined 21 seasons in the last 34. Colorado's three Black head coaches have combined for five seasons.
- David Shaw is the longest tenured Black head coach (11th season) at one school in FBS history.
- Shaw's 91 wins are the most by a Power Five Black head coach in NCAA history.
- Willie and David Shaw form the only father-son pairing of Black coaches who held coordinator roles at the same Power 5 school.
- Stanford hired the Pac-12's first and second Black coaches in Green (1989) and Willingham (1995). The third came eight years later (Karl Dorrell, UCLA, 2003).
- Athletic director Bernard Muir is the second-longest tenured black AD in the country behind Ohio State's Gene Smith. Last July, Muir was appointed to the executive committee of the Black AD Alliance, whose mission is to grow, develop and elevate Black athletics administrators at the Division I level while partnering with NCAA senior leadership and the Minority Opportunities Athletic Association.

MCKEE'S MAGNIFICENT DEBUT

- David Shaw named QB Tanner McKee the starter prior to Saturday's victory at USC, and the sophomore didn't disappoint.
- In his first career start, McKee was 16-of-23 for 234 yards and three total touchdowns in a dominating 42-28 win at No. 14 USC.

RANKED ROAD WIN IN DEBUT

Since 2012, McKee is the 13th FBS QB to defeat a ranked opponent on the road in his first career start. He also became the first Pac-12 player to do so since Tavita Pritchard defeated No. 2 USC in 2007.

- Dating back to 2003...
- McKee's 234 passing yards are the fourth-most for a Cardinal quarterback in their initial start since 2003 (Kevin Hogan, 254; TC Ostrander, 247; Davis Mills,
- McKee (3) and Hogan (3) are the only quarterbacks to tally three touchdowns in their first career start.
- McKee (2) joins Hogan (3), Ostrander (2) and Keller Chryst (2) as the only QBs to have multiple TD passes in their first career start.
- McKee joins Pritchard (Oct. 6, 2007 at #2 USC; W, 24-23) and Hogan (Nov. 10, 2012 vs. #13 Oregon State; W, 27-23) as the only Stanford quarterbacks to beat ranked opponents in their first career starts.
- McKee was recruited in the 2018 Class, but served a two-year LDS mission in Brazil before enrolling at Stanford in 2020.

LDS MISSIONS PRIOR TO STANFORD

- · Stanford has six student-athletes who served twoyear missions prior to enrolling.
- Besides McKee, the others to have served on LDS missions are: junior ILB Levani Damuni (New Zealand), fifth-year FB Houston Heimuli (Indianapolis), junior ILB Spencer Jorgensen (Thailand), senior OLB Tangaloa Kaufusi (Taiwan) and fifth-year OLB Gabe Reid (American Samoa).

TREMAYNE A FIRST-DOWN MACHINE

- Senior WR Brycen Tremayne began his career as a walk-on and earned a scholarship prior to the 2019 season. He is listed as WR1 on the depth chart.
- Through two games, Tremayne leads the Cardinal with eight receptions for 111 yards and two touchdowns.
- For his career, Tremayne has 25 catches, 18 of which have gone for touchdowns (5) or first downs (13).

HIGGINS' CAREER DAY

- Junior wide receiver Elijah Higgins finished with new career highs in catches (6) and receiving yards (67) in Saturday night's win at No. 14 USC. Higgins also caught his first career touchdown.
- · His 38-yard reception in the first quarter was a career long, surpassing his previous career long reception of 29 yards.
- · Through two games, Higgins has seven receptions for 77 yards and a score.

KYU, KYU, I'M KYU

- Junior CB Kyu Blu Kelly drew the tough assignment on Saturday night of defending USC's Drake London, but Kelly excelled.
- The Las Vegas native, whose dad played at USC, returned a third-quarter interception 31 yards to the house. It was Stanford's first pick six since Nov.
- Kelly finished with seven tackles and three additional pass breakups, holding USC's leading receiver to just four catches on 10 total targets.
- · Against K-State, Kelly kicked inside to cover the slot and had the highest-graded game of his career, according to Pro Football Focus.
- · According to PFF, he played only four snaps in the slot in 2019 and 2020 combined, but played 29 there in the opener, locking the inside down with zero yards
- · Through two games, Kelly has nine tackles, two interceptions and three pass breakups. His five passes defended are tied for third-most nationally.
- Kelly's interceptions in back-to-back games mark the first time a Cardinal has had interceptions in consecutive games since Paulson Adebo had three in a two-game stretch in 2019.

PEAT THE PLAYMAKER

- Junior running back Nathaniel Peat is a dynamic running back and return man for the Cardinal.
- · On Saturday night at USC, Peat registered his first career 100-yard game, totaling 115 rushing yards on six carries.
- · His explosive 87-yard touchdown run in the first quarter was Stanford's fifth-longest touchdown run in school history and the 10th-longest play from
- Peat also had two kick returns for 58 yards, tallying 173 all-purpose yards on Saturday.
- For his career, Peat is averaging 8.1 yards per carry on 47 attempts and 24.6 yards per kick return on 22 attempts. In 2020, Peat average 7.0 yards per carry on 29 attempts and also averaged 24.9 yards per kick return on 16 attempts.

RED ZONE IMPROVEMENT

- · Another key development for Stanford on the offensive side of the ball in 2020 was the improvement
- In 2020, Stanford converted 21-of-27 red zone trips into touchdowns, compared to just 16-of-34 trips during the 2019 season.
- So far this season, Stanford has converted all five red zone trips into touchdowns, including all four on Saturday night at No. 14 USC.

#TUNNELWORKERSUNION

- A unit that was hit hard by injuries in 2019 led to early on-field experience for the Cardinal offensive line. That experience began to pay dividends during the 2020 season and should blossom into a huge strength for Stanford during the course of the 2021 season.
- Stanford's starting offensive line features four juniors and a sophomore who have combined to make 48 career starts.
- New offensive line coach Terry Heffernan and the offensive line will need to play a major factor in Stanford re-establishing a dominant line of scrimmage in 2021.
- The Cardinal offensive line, by major: LT Walter Rouse (Biomechanical Engineering), LG Barrett Miller (Mechanical Engineering), C Drake Nugent (Science, Technology and Society), RG Branson Bragg (Mathematical and Computational Sciences), RT Myles Hinton (sophomore, planning to study Human Biology).

THIRD DOWN SUCCESS

- One of the keys to its late-season success in 2020 was the success both Stanford's offense and defense had on third-down.
- Compared to its two losses, the offense increased its third-down conversion rate by 26% in its four wins, while the defense improved its stop rate by 25%.
- So far in 2021, Stanford has converted over 40% of its third downs, including converting 5-of-10 on Saturday night at USC. The defense is getting off the field over 60% of the time on third down, allowing opponents to convert just 8-of-21 third-down tries.

A WELCOME SIGHT AT LINEBACKER

- Stanford senior inside linebacker Jacob Mangum-Farrar made his season debut on Saturday night at the Coliseum, returning from injury for the first time since 2019, when he suffered a season-ending setback at USC.
- Fellow senior ILB Ricky Miezan was also injured in that 2019 game at the Coliseum. He has started both games thus far in 2021 after playing in just one game in 2020. Miezan is the Cardinal's leading tackler through two weeks with 15 takedowns.
- The eight linebackers listed on the depth chart combined to play in only 58 games and make just 22 starts in 2019-20. Three of them (Tangaloa Kaufusi, Jacob Mangum-Farrar, Tristan Sinclair) missed the entire 2020 season.
- On Saturday night, the Cardinal started Stephen Herron and Gabe Reid at OLB, with Damuni and Miezan at ILB.

BOOKER BACK FOR MORE

- Senior captain Thomas Booker opted to return for his final year at Stanford as he pursues a double major in economics and communication.
- Booker tallied six tackles on Saturday and now has 108 career tackles, 16 TFL, 8.5 sacks, seven passes defended, two fumble recoveries, one forced fumble and two blocked kicks.
- Booker blocked an extra point in back-to-back games (at Cal, at UW) last season, becoming the first Cardinal to block a placekick in back-to-back games since Gordon Banks in 1979. Before Booker, the last Pac-12 players with two blocked PATs in a season were Utah's Daniel Nelson and Oregon State's Mana Rosa, both in 2013.
- Booker was named a CoSIDA first team Academic All-American in 2020, in addition to garnering All-Pac-12 first team honors at the special teams spot and second team for his play on the defensive line.
- In 2020, Booker played a key role in founding **CardinalBLCK** (*Brilliance, Leadership, Community and Knowledge*), designed to provide a safe space for Black student-athletes to connect, share, and foster a meaningful community that will support them long after their undergraduate experience is over. Fueled by the power of its collective voices, CardinalBLCK strives to empower Black student-athletes to use their influence in positive ways.

THE CAPTAINS

• The 2021 team captains are senior DE Thomas Booker, sixth-year OLB Jordan Fox, fifth-year FB Houston Heimuli and senior WR Michael Wilson.

FIRST TIME STARTERS

- So far in 2021, nine Cardinal have made their first career starts.
- On the offensive side of the ball, RT Myles Hinton, WR John Humphreys, C Drake Nugent and TE Benjamin Yurosek started vs. K-State, while QB Tanner McKee and RB E.J. Smith started at USC.
- On the defensive side of the ball, DE Ryan Johnson and DT Tobin Phillips started vs. K-State while DB Jimmy Wyrick started at nickelback at USC.

THE ROAD DOGS, CONTINUED

- At the end of Stanford's three-game stretch away from home to begin 2021, the Cardinal will have played a school-record, seven straight games away from home
- Last season, Stanford adopted the phrase "Road Dogs" while spending the last 19 nights of the season in hotel rooms away from home.

WHICH COLOR JERSEY DID HE WEAR TODAY?

- Tucker Fisk, a fifth-year from Davis, Calif. will play both tight end and defensive end for the Cardinal in 2021
- Fisk has played his first four years exclusively at tight end, with nine receptions and one touchdown. He is known as one of the best blocking tight ends in college football.
- Through two weeks, Fisk has tallied 58 snaps, including 26 on the offensive side and 25 on the defensive side.
- Since spring ball, Fisk has been working at defensive end, where his dad, Jason, played for the Cardinal in the 90s before an NFL career that spanned more than a decade.
- It's believed Fisk is the first Power Five player since Michigan State's Kellen Davis in 2007 to take on the specific tight end/defensive line combo.
- No Cardinal has played two ways in the same manner Fisk is expected to since FB/LB Owen Marecic did so in 2010
- Marecic was the only player in the FBS to start on both offense (at fullback) and defense (at inside linebacker) that season.
- In the fourth game of the season against Notre Dame, Marecic scored a pair of touchdowns within 13 seconds of one another, first as a fullback on a short dive play, then moments later making an interception from his inside linebacker position, running it back for a score. In doing so he became the first player to score touchdowns on both offense and defense in the same game since Eric Weddle in 2006.
- Following the season, Marecic was named the inaugural winner of the Paul Hornung Award as the most versatile player in college football. He also finished in 10th place for the 2010 Heisman Trophy, receiving three first place votes.
- Last season, two FBS players played two ways in a similar manner - Hawai'i's Jonah Laulu and Appalachian State's Caleb Spurlin. Spurlin had 31 tackles, 2.5 sacks and two touchdown receptions as a goalline fullback.

EARLY ENROLLEES

- For the first time in program history, Stanford welcomed two early enrollees to The Farm for the beginning of the spring quarter in March.
- Quarterback Ari Patu and cornerback Jaden Slocum each joined the team in time for spring ball.
- On June 10, 2021, the Stanford Faculty Senate voted to implement a three-year pilot program that would allow certain student-athletes to enroll at Stanford as early as winter quarter before their freshman year. Early enrollment would be limited to no more than 15 students per year, and each student-athlete must be academically qualified and have already graduated from their respective high school.

WHERE THEY'RE FROM

- Stanford student-athletes on this year's roster hail from 29 states and Canada.
- Twenty-seven student-athletes come from the state of California. After that, from largest to smallest: Texas (12), Georgia (9), Alabama (6), Utah (6), New Jersey (5), Maryland (4), Arizona (3), Colorado (3), Massachussetts (3), New York (3), North Carolina (3), Canada (2), Minnesota (2), Oregon (2), Virginia (2), Washington (2) and one each from Florida, Hawaii, Idaho, Indiana, Kansas, Louisiana, Michigan, Missouri, Nebraska, Nevada, New Hampshire, North Dakota, Pennsylvania and Tennessee.

THE CARDINAL BY MAJOR

- Stanford requires students to declare a major before their junior year. Among the Cardinal roster in 2021, 19 different majors are represented.
- There are four student-athletes pursuing credits towards a master's program and two others who are pursuing double majors.

STANFORD IN THE NFL

- Stanford had five players drafted in 2021 and five more signed as undrafted free agents. Multiple Cardinal have been taken in 12 consecutive drafts.
- Stanford has had 42 players selected in the NFL Draft since 2012, the most in the Pac-12.
- Stanford's eight tight ends drafted since 2010 are the most in the nation. (Dray, Fleener, Ertz, Toilolo, Hooper, Schultz, Smith, Parkinson). The Cardinal has had the most tight ends on NFL Kickoff Weekend active rosters for nine straight years.
- Stanford's 16 quarterbacks drafted in the Modern Era (since 1967) rank second in the nation. [behind USC 19, tied with Ohio State] Stanford's 24 quarterbacks drafted all-time rank second in the nation. [behind USC 25]
- Stanford is one of six schools all-time to produce at least four No. 1 overall NFL Draft picks (Auburn, Georgia, Notre Dame, Oklahoma, USC). The Cardinal is the only school to have four quarterbacks taken with the No. 1 overall pick (Nevers, Plunkett, Elway, Luck).

THE HOME OF CHAMPIONS

- Stanford is one of six programs with at least one national championship in football, baseball and men's basketball and the only school with at least one in football, baseball, men's and women's basketball.
- Stanford completed a sweep of the Capital One Cup during the 2020-21 campaign, matching its dual victory achievement from 2017-18 and remaining the only school to capture both titles in the same season.
- Prior to its second-place finish in 2020-21, Stanford won 25 straight Division I Learfield Sports Directors' Cup, the award presented to the most successful intercollegiate athletic department in the nation.
- Stanford has won at least one NCAA team title in each of the past 45 academic years (dating back to the 1976-77 campaign), representing the longest streak in NCAA history.
- The Cardinal leads the NCAA with 128 team titles. In total, Stanford claimed three national team championships during the last year women's basketball, men's gymnastics, synchronized swimming increasing its overall total to 155.

LELAND STANFORD JUNIOR UNIVERSITY

- Stanford was established in 1885 and opened in 1891.
- Stanford's faculty includes two Presidential Medal of Freedom winners and four Pulitzer Prize winners. Stanford faculty have won the Nobel Prize 34 times since the university's founding and the Stanford community includes 19 Nobel laureates.
- Stanford students have consisted of 127 Rhodes Scholars, 96 Marshall Award winners and 68 Truman Scholars.
- The top five undergraduate majors at Stanford include: computer science, engineering, human biology, management science and engineering, and mechanical engineering.
- Stanford's 8,180-acre campus is large enough to contain 96 Disneylands.
- The Stanford campus features roughly 43,000 trees, 25 fountains and over 800 different species of plants.
- The 700-acre Stanford Research Park, created in 1951, is home to over 150 companies.

100 YEARS OF STANFORD STADIUM

In 2021, Stanford celebrates a century of excellence at one of college football's hallowed grounds. The home of Jim and John, and where Bill Walsh started a West Coast revolution. Where Luck and McCaffrey led a new era of Cardinal legends to chant C-House. Nestled miles from the foothills and in a grove of eucalyptus and oak trees, Stanford Stadium has assumed a place as one of the most beautiful and fan-friendly football facilities in the country. The venue has a cozy seating capacity of 50,424, a considerable difference from the 85,000 that existed in what was previously the largest privately owned college football facility in the United States. The Cardinal is 53-13 (.803) inside Stanford Stadium since the start of the 2010 season.

The 2021 season marks David Shaw's 11th as Stanford's Bradford M. Freeman Director

A 1995 Stanford graduate who is the fifth alum to hold the position of head football coach, Shaw is the 34th head coach in Stanford history, and the winningest coach in

Shaw enters the 2021 season with an 90-36 (.714) career record, including 62-25 (.713) in Pac-12 play. He has led the Cardinal to three Pac-12 titles and a pair of Rose Bowl wins in three trips to The Granddaddy of Them All.

Shaw is the longest tenured Black head football coach in FBS history at one school and the winningest Power Five Black head football coach.

Under Shaw, Stanford's 90 victories since 2011 marks the winningest stretch in program history. Stanford has won at least 11 games four times under Shaw, and has appeared in a bowl game eight times.

Shaw, who oversaw the final nine years of the 2010s, was instrumental in Stanford's most successful decade in school history. The Cardinal totaled 98 wins, 42 NFL Draft picks, 28 wins vs. AP Top 25 teams, 24 AP All-Americans, nine Academic All-Americans, five unanimous All-Americans and had a 93.5 average graduation success rate. Each of those categories either led the Pac-12 or was second, while also in the Top 10 nationally.

Shaw was named recipient of the Dodd Trophy following the 2017 season. It was Stanford's third all-time national coach of the year award, following Chuck Taylor (1951) and Clark Shaughnessy (1940) winning the AFCA Coach of the Year Award. The Dodd Trophy, college football's most coveted coaching award, honors the head football coach whose program embodies the award's three pillars of scholarship, leadership and integrity, while also having success on the playing field throughout

The 2017 Pac-12 Coach of the Year's involvement reaches far beyond the football field. In the classroom, his student-athletes maintain a high level of academic excellence, including six Academic All-Americans in his first 10 seasons.

Stanford's 2020 season was unlike any in program history, as Shaw guided the Cardinal to four straight wins to finish the season, en route to a 4-2 overall record. Playing a six-game, conference-only schedule due to the COVID-19 global pandemic, Stanford was forced to spend its final 19 days away from campus due to county restrictions.

The Cardinal began its winning streak with a one-point, Big Game win at Cal. Stanford went on to defeat Washington, Oregon State and UCLA on the road to end the year, capping off the UCLA win with a 14-point, fourth-quarter comeback and a double-

Shaw was named to the Uplifting Athletes' Rare Disease Champion Team in 2020. In 2018, Shaw was a bone marrow donor for his brother, Eric, who is now cancer free after battling a rare disease for over seven years.

The Cardinal also saw five players drafted and five more sign undrafted free agent contracts during the 2021 NFL Draft. Walker Little (2nd Round, Jacksonville), Paulson Adebo (3rd Round, New Orleans), Davis Mills (3rd Round, Houston), Drew Dalman (4th Round, Atlanta) and Simi Fehoko (5th Round, Dallas) were all selected, the fifth time in eight years at least five Cardinal have been drafted in a single draft.

In 2019, Stanford endured many injuries to starters and key players throughout the season. The Cardinal played 21 true freshmen, including 12 who used a year of eligibility by playing in more than four games, and eight who combined for 43 starts

throughout the season. The Cardinal started three true freshmen on the offensive line for half the year, while four true freshmen started at least one game along the

Off the field, Stanford student-athletes continued to shine. The Cardinal had a leaguebest 33 named to the Pac-12 Honor Roll, which honors any student-athlete who boasts at least a 3.3 cumulative grade-point average, excluding freshmen. In addition, two Cardinal earned recognition for arguably the biggest off-field accolades in college football. Fifth-year OLB Casey Toohill was named one of 12 finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy and a member of the NFF Scholar-Athlete Class, while junior WR Connor Wedington was a member of the AFCA Allstate Good Works Team, given to 11 FBS players who stand out both on the field and in the community.

Additionally, Colby Parkinson (fourth round, Seattle) and Casey Toohill (seventh round, Philadelphia) were selected in the 2020 NFL Draft.

Five Cardinal were selected in the 2019 NFL Draft, highlighted by JJ Arcega-Whiteside's second round selection to the Philadelphia Eagles. Inside linebacker Bobby Okereke was selected in the third round by the Indianapolis Colts, running back Bryce Love in the fourth round by the Washington Football Team, punter Jake Bailey in the fifth round by the New England Patriots and tight end Kaden Smith in the sixth round by the San Francisco 49ers. Seven other Cardinal were given NFL opportunities following the draft, including five who signed as undrafted free agents.

In 2018, Shaw led Stanford to its 10th straight bowl game, extending the longest active streak in the Pac-12. The Cardinal defeated Pitt in the 2018 Sun Bowl for their fifth bowl game victory in eight seasons under Shaw. Quarterback K.J. Costello finished with the second-most passing yards and third-most touchdowns in a season in school history, while wideout JJ Arcega-Whiteside tied a 41-year-old school record with 14 receiving touchdowns.

A season prior, Stanford did most of its damage on the ground as its 5.9 rushing yards/ attempt ranked first in program history, and its 2,833 rushing yards ranked fourth. Running back Bryce Love set the school's single-season (2,118) and single-game (301) rushing records while being named the 2017 Doak Walker Award winner. Love, also the Lombardi Award winner and Heisman Trophy runner-up, set Stanford's career records for yards/rush (7.76) and consecutive 100-yard rushing games (9). The unanimous All-American combined with Cameron Scarlett to form the top rushing tandem in program

Love was the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year and winner of the Touchdown Club of Columbus Jim Brown Award. He ranked first among Power 5 conference running backs in over a dozen categories, including FBS records for 50-yard rushes (13), consecutive games with a 30-yard rush (13) and consecutive games with a 50-yard rush (11).

Four Cardinal student-athletes were selected in the 2018 NFL Draft -- Justin Reid (third), Harrison Phillips (third), Dalton Schultz (fourth) and Peter Kalambayi (sixth)

Shaw led the Cardinal to the 2016 Sun Bowl where the 25-23 win over the Tar Heels marked the fourth bowl victory for Shaw, the most in program history, to cap a 10-3 season in which the Cardinal ranked 12th in the final AP and USA Today polls. The Cardinal also won at least 10 games for the fifth time in six seasons under Shaw. From 1891-2010, the program recorded four 10-win seasons.

Even more, the program posted a graduation success rate of 99 percent for the third consecutive year, a total that led all FBS institutions and ranked 11 points higher than the next Pac-12 school. Stanford joined Clemson, Duke, Northwestern and Wisconsin as the only FBS football teams to earn APR Public Recognition Awards from the NCAA in each of the previous four years.

Stanford in 2016 ranked eighth nationally in defensive touchdowns (4), 12th in winning percentage (.769), 17th in time of possession (32:46), 22nd in team sacks (2.85), 18th in scoring defense (20.4) and 25th in team passing efficiency defense (117.8). All-America running back Christian McCaffrey ranked first in all-purpose yards per game (211.6), fourth in rushing yards (145.7) and 20th in rushing yards per game (211.6). Ukropina ranked fifth in field goals per game (1.83). Dallas Lloyd ranked 13th in total interceptions (5) and 18th in interceptions per game (0.4). Jake Bailey ranked 24th in punting (43.5).

The Cardinal set single-season school records for top rushing tandem (2,386 --McCaffrey and Bryce Love), and, at the time, the individual single-game school record for rushing yards (284 -- McCaffrey at Cal).

Stanford had two top-10 NFL Draft picks for only the fifth time, following the 2016 season. Solomon Thomas was the third overall pick by the San Francisco 49ers, and was the highest drafted defensive player in program history. Thomas also won the Pac-

12's Morris Trophy, given to the league's top lineman. McCaffrey, the CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year, was selected by the Carolina Panthers with the eighth overall pick. He was Stanford's highest running back draft pick since 1982.

Following the 2015 season, Stanford became the only school ever ranked in the top four by U.S. News and World Report (4th) and the Associated Press (3rd) in the same year.

Stanford was 12-2 overall and 8-1 in Pac-12 play in 2015, going on to win the Pac-12 and Rose Bowl crowns and improving Shaw's postseason record to 6-2. The Cardinal toppled five ranked opponents, including top-10 foes in No. 6 USC, No. 4 Notre Dame and No. 6 Iowa. Stanford was one of four teams in 2015 to record five or more wins over AP Top 25 opponents and one of four teams with three or more wins over AP top-10 foes.

McCaffrey was named AP Player of the Year and won the Paul Hornung Award and Johnny "Jet" Rodgers Award. McCaffrey, also a Heisman Trophy finalist, set the NCAA record for all-purpose yards (3,864) and earned Academic All-America honors. McCaffrey earned consensus All-America first team nods and Outland Trophy winner Joshua Garnett received unanimous All-America distinction. Blake Martinez and Austin Hooper were named All-America third-teamers, Fifteen Cardinal were lauded with All-Pac-12 honors and 22 received All-Pac-12 academic distinction.

McCaffrey posted the top four FBS individual all-purpose single-game performances in 2015 and his 461 all-purpose yards vs. USC in the Pac-12 Championship Game was fifth-most in FBS history. He owned three of the top five 100-yard receiving and rushing games by an FBS player and became the only FBS player ever with 200 rushing, 100 receiving and 100 kickoff return vards vs. USC.

For the third time in five seasons, Shaw was named Pac-12 Coach of the Year and McCaffrey earned Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year honors. Shaw was the AFCA Regional Coach of the Year and a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award and Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year.

Shaw is the quickest to earn three Pac-12 Coach of the Year honors.

Five Cardinal heard their names called during the draft: Garnett (first round - San Francisco 49ers), Hooper (third round - Atlanta Falcons), Martinez (fourth round -Green Bay Packers), Kevin Hogan (fifth round - Kansas City Chiefs) and Kyle Murphy (sixth round - Green Bay Packers).

Stanford received an NCAA GSR of 99 percent for the second consecutive year in 2015, a total that led all FBS and FCS institutions

Shaw was instrumental in the maturation of Hogan during his Cardinal career. Hogan $\,$ appeared in more than 50 contests and posted a school-best 36-10 record as a starter. He ranked first in career total offense (10.634), second in completion percentage (.659) and passing efficiency (154.6), and third in passing yards (9,385) and passing touchdowns (75). His 171.0 passing efficiency clip in 2015 was the best single-season mark ever by a Cardinal signal caller. Hogan also set school records for career rushing yards (1,249) and touchdowns (15) by a quarterback.

Stanford's West Coast offense led the nation with 13 consecutive games scoring at least 30 points. Stanford amassed a school-record 3,131 rushing yards on 610 attempts in 2015, the most ever by a Cardinal program. The offensive unit's 529 points ranked second-most in a season and its 33 rushing touchdowns, 223.7 rushing yards/game, 30 passing touchdowns, 37.8 points/game and 6,097 total yards of offense ranked third.

He notched 30 wins in his first 35 games, which was the third-fastest among active coaches, and was one of only three coaches to guide his team to BCS bowls in his first three years as a head coach.

Shaw won 40 games in his first 52 outings at Stanford, tying with Pop Warner for the fastest to 40 wins by any Cardinal head coach.

With a win in the 2014 Foster Farms Bowl. Shaw became the first Stanford head coach with at least eight wins in each of his first four seasons.

Stanford won eight games in 2014 and closed the season on a three-game winning streak. The Cardinal scored at least 30 points in seven of 13 games.

While facing six nationally ranked opponents in 2014, including four on the road, the Cardinal defensive unit helped Stanford rank second nationally in scoring defense (16.4 points/game), third in total defense (282.4 yards/game), seventh in rushing defense (104.5 yards/game) and eighth in passing defense (177.9 yards/game). The Cardinal joined Penn State and Clemson as the only three teams to finish in the top-10 nationally in all four categories. The team was also among the best nationally in getting to the quarterback, ranking sixth with 46 sacks. Stanford also led the nation in punt return average and strong safety Jordan Richards garnered the 2014 National Football Foundation's Scholar-Athlete Award.

In 2013, Shaw led Stanford to a second straight Pac-12 title and the program's 14th trip to the Rose Bowl. Stanford became the only team to earn four consecutive BCS bowl bids during the Bowl Championship Series era.

After leading the team to a landmark 2013 regular season, Shaw received AFCA Regional Coach of the Year honors and was named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award and Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year.

Under Shaw's tutelage in 2013. Stanford was one of 13 FBS football schools and the only Pac-12 football program to earn a Division I Academic Progress Rate Public Recognition Award for posting multi-year APR scores in the top 10 percent of all

Stanford defeated five nationally-ranked opponents at home in 2013 while winning 11 $\,$ games despite playing the fifth-toughest schedule nationally in the Sagarin ratings. Stanford was among just three schools (Alabama and Oregon) with 10 or more wins in each season from 2010-13.

Stanford finished the 2013 campaign ranked fifth in the BCS standings, the fourth straight top 10 BCS ranking for the Cardinal. The team ranked sixth in the final 2012 BCS standings, following back-to-back No. 4 rankings at the end of the 2010 and 2011 seasons.

The 2013 team ranked among the nation's best in kickoff return average (1st), rushing defense (3rd), tackles for loss allowed (4th), sacks (t-7th), scoring defense (10th), kickoff coverage (10th), total defense (14th), sacks allowed (16th), red zone offense (16th), passing efficiency (17th) and red zone defense (19th).

Stanford had six players receive All-Pac-12 first-team honors with 19 all-conference selections in 2013. There were also eight different national awards that listed Stanford players as semifinalists and finalists. There were 25 players chosen to the Pac-12 All-Academic team and four were placed on the Capital One Academic All-District list, including Jordan Richards who was a second team All-America selection.

For the fifth straight year, Stanford had three or more players selected in the NFL Draft when Trent Murphy (second round - Washington), Cameron Fleming (fourth round - New England), David Yankey (fifth round - Minnesota), Ed Reynolds (fifth round -Philadelphia), Tyler Gaffney (sixth round - Carolina) and Ben Gardner (seventh round - Dallas) signed professional contracts after the 2013 season. The six draft picks in 2014 matched a program-best.

Shaw guided the Cardinal to a 12-2 record in 2012 and its first Pac-12 championship in 13 years. The campaign culminated with Stanford's first Rose Bowl victory in over 40 years, a 20-14 win over Wisconsin in 2013.

Shaw was named the 2012 Pac-12 Conference Coach of the Year, becoming the second to earn the honor outright in consecutive seasons since the award's inception in 1975. Stanford became the first school to defeat programs ranked No. 1 (Oregon) and 2 (USC) in the AP poll during the regular season and the Cardinal closed its season with five straight wins over as many ranked opponents.

Stanford's historic defensive output in 2012 broke the single-season sacks record (57) and led the Pac-12 in scoring defense (17.21), total defense (336.21), rushing defense (97.0), sacks (4.07) and tackles for loss (9.00). The Cardinal ranked first nationally in sacks, second in tackles for loss, fifth in rushing defense and 11th in scoring defense.

Stanford became the first program to win both the AFCA Academic Achievement Award and a BCS bowl game in the same season.

Three Stanford players were selected in the 2013 draft -- Zach Ertz (second round -Philadelphia), Levine Toilolo (fourth round - Atlanta) and Stepfan Taylor (fifth round - Arizona). Taylor, a Doak Walker Award semifinalist, set the Stanford record with 4,300 rushing yards and Ertz led Stanford pass catchers and all FBS tight ends in receiving yards (898) and total receptions (69), both school records for a tight end. Ertz was a John Mackey Award finalist and the seventh unanimous All-American in program

Stanford was one of five schools to have four or more players selected to the 2012 AP All-America teams, with Ertz earning the honor along with David Yankey (second team), Trent Murphy (third team) and Ed Reynolds (third team). Yankey was a consensus All-American

In Shaw's first season as head coach, the 2011 edition of the Cardinal posted an 11-2 record and made its second consecutive BCS appearance, falling to Oklahoma State in the Fiesta Bowl. Shaw became just the ninth major college head coach in history to post 11 or more wins in his first season, and the first since Chris Peterson (13-0) of Boise State and Bret Bielema (12-1) of Wisconsin in 2006.

Shaw was named the 2011 Pac-12 Coach of the Year, becoming just the third in Stanford history to earn the award, following Bill Walsh (1977) and Tyrone Willingham (1995, 1999). He was named AFCA Regional Coach of the Year and a Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year finalist

The Cardinal was ranked in the top 10 of both major polls for all 16 weeks of the season, peaking at No. 3 in the AP poll and No. 2 in the USA Today Coaches poll on

Behind 2011 Heisman Trophy finalist Andrew Luck, Stanford averaged 43.2 points/ game and established a school-record with 561 points. Stanford's 11 victories in 2011 came by an average of 27.4 points.

Stanford's 2011 defense was ranked first or second in the Pac-12 in six categories, including rushing defense (1st - 84.4), third-down conversion defense (1st - 31.1), scoring defense (2nd - 21.9), total defense (2nd - 337.6), sacks/game (2nd - 3.00) and opponent first downs (2nd - 17.5).

Luck was named Walter Camp Football Foundation National Player of the Year along with receiving the Maxwell Award as the nation's top player. He finished second in the balloting for the Heisman Trophy and was the Pac-12's Offensive Player of the Year for a second straight season.

Right guard David DeCastro was a unanimous All-America selection: left tackle Jonathan Martin landed spots on the Walter Camp and AFCA All-America squads; tight end Coby Fleener and outside linebacker Chase Thomas were named All-Americans

In all, 21 players earned All-Pac-12 honors in 2011, including six first-teamers. Twelve earned Pac-12 All-Academic honors, including first-team selections Luck and Brent Etiz. Luck was also named the Capital One Academic All-American of the Year by the College Sports Information Directors of America.

Prior to his appointment as head coach, Shaw served as Stanford's offensive coordinator for four seasons, playing an instrumental role in the resurgence of the Cardinal program which established school scoring records in 2009 and 2010 before setting another scoring mark in his first year as head coach.

During Shaw's tenure as offensive coordinator, the Cardinal scored 40 or more points in 11 games from 2007-10.

Stanford's balanced offense amassed a school-record 6.142 vards during the 2010 season, averaging 213.8 on the ground and 258.7 yards through the air.

In addition, Shaw's play calling in the red zone helped Stanford convert on a nationalbest 88.6 percent of its scoring opportunities inside the 20-yard line.

 $\label{prior} \mbox{Prior to Stanford, Shaw served as the wide receivers and passing game coordinator at }$ the University of San Diego during the 2006 season, winning the Division I-AA Mid-Major national title and the Pioneer League championship with the nation's top offense. Shaw's coaching resume also includes nine years of NFL experience with the Philadelphia Eagles (1997), Oakland Raiders (1998-2001) and Baltimore Ravens (2002-05).

Shaw's last coaching job in the NFL with Baltimore included a stint as the quarterbacks and wide receivers coach from 2002-04 before working solely with the wide receivers in 2005. His tenure included an AFC North title in 2003. Derrick Mason set a franchise record with 86 receptions for 1,073 yards under Shaw's tutelage in 2005. Mark Clayton set a franchise rookie record for receptions in 2005 when he caught 44 balls for 471 yards. After three seasons of quality control with the Oakland Raiders from 1998-2000, Shaw moved into the role of quarterbacks coach in 2001 as the Raiders won a second straight AFC West title. Quarterback Rich Gannon made the Pro Bowl for the second straight season and was the game's MVP. Shaw began his NFL coaching career as the quality control coach with the Philadelphia Eagles in 1997. He launched his coaching career at Western Washington, where he coached outside linebackers in 1995 and the tight ends in 1996.

A four-year letterwinner at Stanford from 1991-94 as a receiver, Shaw was a member of Stanford's 1991 Aloha Bowl team coached by Dennis Green that finished the season 8-4 and was the third-highest scoring team in school history at the time. He was also on the Cardinal team that went 10-3 and won the 1993 Blockbuster Bowl under Bill Walsh. Shaw finished his Stanford career with 57 catches for 664 yards and five touchdowns. He also competed in a varsity track meet and a varsity basketball game before graduating in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in sociology.

Shaw's father, Willie, had two coaching stints at Stanford (1974-76, 1989-91) during his 33-year coaching career, which also included time with the Detroit Lions, Kansas City Chiefs, Minnesota Vikings, New Orleans Saints, Oakland Raiders, San Diego Chargers and St. Louis Rams. Stanford announced in 2013 that its defensive coordinator position had been endowed by a gift from an anonymous donor, named in honor of Willie Shaw.

Shaw is Chair of the NCAA Football rules committee and is on the Board of Trustees for the AFCA. He is also on the NCAA Football Competition Committee and represents the Pac-12 on the AFCA Ethics Committee. He was previously on USA Football's Football Advisory Committee and a member of the NCAA Commission to Combat Campus Sexual Violence. In addition to his work with that commission, Shaw has been a leading advocate of the Set The Expectation program, aimed at working to end the culture of sexual assault and domestic violence among college and high school athletes. Stanford players became the first university in the country to sign the Set The Expectation student pledge, stating they would use their platforms to speak out against sexual assault and violence against women.

Born in San Diego, Shaw and his wife, Kori, are the parents of three children -- Keegan, Carter and Gavin.

Cardinal Falls in Opener

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) -- Kansas State sixth-year quarterback Skylar Thompson ran for two touchdowns, bulling into the end zone for the first one after missing most of last season with a shoulder injury, and the Wildcats opened the season with a 24-7 win over Stanford on Saturday.

Deuce Vaughn sprinted 59 yards for a touchdown and finished with 124 yards rushing on 13 carries for the Wildcats, who finished last season with a five-game losing streak.

Stanford was down 24-0 before Tanner McKee's 14-yard touchdown pass to Brycen Tremayne with 3:16 left on its last offensive snap. The Cardinal, who last year won the last four games of their pandemic-shortened 4-2 season, have played 177 games since last being shut out.

Thompson, who later had a 13-yard TD run, opened the scoring when he put his left shoulder down and knocked cornerback Kyu Blu Kelly to the ground on a 6-yard TD run in the first quarter.

On the possession before the first TD, Kelly had an impressive interception in the end zone, leaping and reaching back over Phillip Brooks and then managing to get one foot down inbounds. But Stanford went three-and-out, setting up the two-play TD drive, Thompson finding a wide-open Brooks for a 56-yard pass to the 6.

Trees Topple No. 14 Troy

LOS ANGELES (AP) - Tanner McKee passed for two touchdowns and rushed for another score in his first collegiate start, and Stanford rebounded from a season-opening loss with a 42-28 upset victory over No. 14 Southern California on Saturday night.

Nathaniel Peat had an 87-yard touchdown run while racking up a career-high 115 yards, and Kyu Blu Kelly returned an interception 31 yards for a touchdown in a surprising rout for the Cardinal (1-1, 1-0 Pac-12). Led by McKee, Stanford's offense came back superbly a 24-7 loss to Kansas State last week.

McKee went 16 of 23 for 234 yards while seizing his chance to start. McKee hit Elijah Higgins and Brycen Tremayne for TDs as Stanford rolled to a 29-point lead in the fourth quarter of its ninth victory over USC in the California rivals' last 14 meetings.

Kedon Slovis passed for 223 yards, and Keaontay Ingram and Darwin Barlow rushed for TDs as the Trojans' (1-1, 0-1) nine-game regular season winning streak ended in tonight's win for Stanford.

Stanford's defense limited star Trojans receiver Drake London to four catches for 68 yards and a touchdown with 5:54 to play.

The 100th meeting between the Pac-12's two California private schools resumed a rivalry that was interrupted last season for the first time since 1945 by the coronavirus pandemic.

Peat put the Cardinal ahead early with his long sprint down the Cardinal sideline for the fifth-longest TD run in Stanford history. The speedy big-play tailback and kick returner nearly topped his previous career-high of 93 yards rushing on that play alone.

USC evened it early in the second quarter with a 15-play, 95-yard drive capped by Ingram's 2-yard TD surge, but McKee put the Cardinal back ahead with a 3-yard TD pass to Higgins on fourth down only after Stanford decided to go for it after USC lined up in the neutral zone on a successful field goal.

Stanford went up 21-10 right before halftime on Tremayne's TD reception, set up by a 49-yard catch by Austin Jones.

Kelly picked off Slovis' pass when it deflected off London's hands, and the cornerback eluded Slovis near the goal line to score his first career touchdown. The rout was on when McKee scored on a 1-yard keeper late in the third quarter.

Stanford's road trip to start the season continues when the Cardinal travels to Vanderbilt next Saturday, Sept. 18.
